## INTERNATIONALIZATION OF STUDIES AT THE UDG

A key principle of development and the vision of development of the UDG is the internationalization of studies, or of the life and work at the UDG. This confirms the introduction of English as the official language, as well as the obligation for a student to provide evidence of knowledge of at least two foreign languages without which a student cannot get a diploma of the UDG. Classes in all postgraduate courses are taught in English ... In international tourism studies organized in cooperation with the Vatel Business School in France (double degree program) classes are only taught in English. It is similar to international graduate course EMOS (European Master of Official Statistics) - international statistics studies, which are accredited by the European statistics - Eurostat. A few more programs which are to be organized exclusively in English are in preparation, as well as preparation that most Bachelor studies programs are taught in English. We are in the initial phase of teaching some classes in German, Turkish and Russian. Normally, the UDG Center for Foreign Languages offers classes in about ten different foreign languages. We provide learning Chinese in cooperation with the Confucius Institute located at the University of Montenegro, as well as through the exchange of professors from Chinese universities. The UDG signed memorandums - about 90 of them, with universities from the region, Europe and the USA... For several years, students from the United States have come to learn the Montenegrin language at the UDG, as well as groups of American students who have attended student practical training in Montenegro. The largest number, almost all teachers and associates have been abroad, especially in the United States ... About twenty professors and associates have completed their studies abroad, work abroad and return to Montenegro at the UDG... Similarly, professors from all continents hold lectures at the UDG. Internationalization really means essential, fundamental openness of the University, the University's philosophy, the way of thinking and worldviews of all of us at the University, and not a mechanical one - agreements, and from moment to moment actions and stays! Particularly this is the reason that the UDG has absolutely the largest number of students covered by international practical training and exchange

of students comparing to all universities in Montenegro and probably in the region! Practical training in the USA is particularly popular!... In recent years, cooperation with Chinese universities is more intense, and this book is, after all, dedicated to it! A larger number of experts and famous businessmen from abroad come to the UDG. We have a good cooperation with international companies, both those that operate in Montenegro, and companies from Europe, and now especially from China. An increasing number of UDG students goes to Asian countries for practical training ... Internationalization also takes place through another important channel: international projects. The UDG is not only a participant of a large number of consortiums, but has already gained the confidence to develop large European projects. The UDG is already in consortiums of projects Horizon

2020 ... Internationalization also includes our participation in international conferences as well as the fact that the UDG organized 8 international conferences, not only at the UDG, but in partnership with the Association of Economists and Managers of Montenegro, that is the organization of the prestigious international meeting: Miločer Development Forum!... UDG students also participate in a number of international meetings, conferences, competitions, and on the famous Camino de Santiago pilgrimage (International Conference organized by the United Nations) in Spain. UDG's "Entrepreneurial Nest" (work on UDG students and professors' start-ups) establishes cooperation with the University of Tel Aviv, one of the most famous universities for the development of start-ups ... I emphasize a good cooperation with the Baltic countries, especially in the field of information technology and several of our associates study for PhD at renowned universities in Europe and the USA!

Our mission just rests on the internationalization of studies, because, during studies much at the UDG is invested in developing the ability of a student to be a responsible citizens of a global world! ... We are creating a new myth: Planet Earth - Our Mother!... We know that we are a small university from a small country like Montenegro ... But we have already realized that huge and small ones have the advantage in globalization, while those "in the middle" face major problems. The huge ones have the advantage because of their total power that comes from such size, while the small have advantage because they have to quickly adapt to changes!

We really live in a world of wonders, for which Alice said: "How strange this world is. Here we must run as fast as we can, just to stay in place".

The UDG is trying to be faster than the fastest one and not to stay in the same place - but to quickly climb developmentally!

A book that is in front of you, that is the case study of cooperation with China, should enable you to test the reality of our mission and the reality of our results!

Never forget: the UDG - this is history, that is a seed of the future!

## II

### **1. CHRONOLOGY OF THE ORIGIN AND DEVELOPMENT OF COOPERATION WITH CHINESE UNIVERSITIES AND COMPANIES**

The beginning of cooperation with Chinese universities was preceded by the initiative of the UDG to establish cooperation with the Embassy of the People's Republic of China

Attempts to establish cooperation with the Embassy of PR China in Montenegro in period 2012 - 2014 reduced only to correspondence of the purely protocolar nature.

One of the attempts was based on a discussion about the "China Studies" program and generally, cooperation with China. During this period the Confucius Institute in Montenegro was opened and any communication with the UDG in that period was not achieved, although we were expressing an interest and showing initiative for opening the Confucius Institute at the UDG. The Institute was opened at the University of Montenegro.

The substantial cooperation with Chinese universities and institutions began by participation of Prof. Dr. Veselin Vukotić, the Rector of the UDG, according to the invitation to rectors of Montenegrin universities at Second China - Central and Eastern European Countries Education Policy Dialogue, Hosted by Ministry of Education, P.R. China and organized by CEAIE, which was held in Beijing and Tianjin in September 21 - 24, 2014, where the Rector Vukotić established the first connections with Chinese universities.

Through these connections, the interest for cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities grew and vice versa. After this Conference the correspondence with several universities in China and preparations for strategic cooperation with them began.

In this sense, the UDG formed a special department within the International Cooperation Department and a Cooperation coordinator with China was appointed.



Our strategy was recognized by the newly appointed Ambassador of China to Montenegro Mr. Cui Zhi Wei during his first visit to the UDG at end of 2015.

Since that event, closer cooperation with the Chinese Embassy has begun and most Chinese universities and business delegations, in addition to other university and government delegations, visited the UDG. Especially close and sincere cooperation has been developed with Ambassador's associate Ms. Yu Xi.

The UDG recognized every delegation as a possible channel for future cooperation and intensified written communication. As a result, in October 2016, the first visit to the Xihua University, Chengdu, was organized as a return visit to a delegation from Xihua University to the UDG in May 2016. During this visit a memorandum of understanding was signed between the Xihua University and the UDG, and from March to July 2017 three associates from the UDG stayed at Xihua. At the same time, a Chinese language teacher from the Xihua visited the UDG and held classes to UDG students.

The same year, eight students from the Xihua participated in the fifteen-day UDG Summer school and the Camp for talents held in Cetinje every year. Also, the same year, the UDG provided paid internship for three students of the Xihua in companies and institutions in Montenegro.

Successful beginning of cooperation with the Xihua University was the trigger of successful cooperation that follows.

In the meantime, all Montenegrin universities were invited to participate in the "Initiative 16 + 1" and in May 2017 all three universities were guests of Beijing Union University in Beijing. From this cooperation, the UDG has made a very big step towards the realization of its own strategy of internationalization through cooperation with Chinese universities and institutions.

We used the meetings a Delegation of the UDG had at its own request in the China Council for Promotion of International Trade, Beijing Municipality Government – Foreign Affairs Department, and World Association of Chinese Restaurants, for preparation of 2017 Miločer Development Forum.

In September 2017, the Miločer Development Forum was organized, dedicated to the topic: "Globalization and the Belt & Road Initiative". Professors and businessmen and around 60 participants from China participated in the Forum, when, for the first time in Montenegro, an official conference was organized and translated into Chinese. The Chinese Ambassador H.E. Zhi Cui Wei also spoke at Conference. Several Chinese professors who were participants of the Miločer Development Forum held lectures at the UDG.

Miločer Development Forum is used to establish new connections and deepening of past relationships

In October 2017, a three-member delegation of the UDG participated at „*The Belt and Road*“ *University Presidents' Forum on Innovation and Entrepreneurship Education*, Xi'an and, among other things, attended the proclamation of one of the win-

ners of the 3<sup>rd</sup> China College Students “Internet Plus” Innovation and Entrepreneurship Competition, the associate at the UDG Mr. Luka Laković.

Also this Conference was used to establish new connections and signing new memorandums of understanding.

In accordance with the agreement with the Xihua University and Tourism College of Beijing Union University, the first group of students (15 students) from the UDG went to five-month students’ exchange in Chengdu and Beijing. In addition, also three associates from the UDG went to Chengdu, the Xihua University, for the purpose of writing a PhD thesis.

On the Chinese side, 13 students came to the UDG Summer school and the Camp for talents in Cetinje while four students had a paid internship in Montenegrin companies and institutions. Likewise, a Chinese language teacher held lectures at the UDG during the summer semester 2018.

The Chinese Government invited Prof. Dr. Veselin Vukotić to participate in the prestigious international scientific conference Symposium on China Studies held in July 2018 in Beijing. This Conference was attended by 30 participants from across the world and 10 participants from China, and the participants and discussants were foreign doctoral students in China (about 120).

Professor Vukotić established new connections, especially with the Zhejiang Gongshang University and Company Alibaba.

After returning from China, professor Veselin Vukotić organized a meeting of the creative core of the organization of the study program “China Studies”, the proposal which was at the conceptual level yet in 2012.

Realization of “China Studies” program required much closer and long-term cooperation with Chinese universities and companies.

At 2018 Miločer Development Forum, also addressed by the newly appointed Chinese Ambassador Liu Jin, the idea of plan of the UDG to organize “China Studies” was announced as well as the fact that the basic elements of this program had been already developed. Just to point out, the Ambassador Liu Jin, visited the UDG at the very beginning of his term where he was familiarized with plans of cooperation of the UDG with China, in which he involved his associates Ms. Hua Yafang i Mr. Yan Jiaqi.

The realization of the idea of “China Studies”, as well as the realization of exchange of students and professors and internships for students in Chinese companies, according to the assessment of the UDG, demanded immediate explanation of the UDG idea of cooperation with Chinese universities and companies and especially explanation of the idea “China Studies”. This primarily because the concept of China Studies at the UDG is based on participation of both Chinese language teachers (to be provided by the Confucius Institute Headquarter) and 15-20 university professors from China in various disciplines of the program, as well as providing conditions

for all students of “China Studies” to spend a semester in China.

This is the reason for the UDG to bring a decision that a Delegation of the UDG makes a working visit to China.

This decision was made immediately after 2018 Miločer Development Forum in late September 2018. After two months of preparation of our visit, without anyone’s help (national, diplomatic or financial), only with the assistance of the Chinese Embassy to ensure the Delegation a meeting with the management of the Confucius Institute Headquarter in Beijing, a complete meeting agenda was developed independently, via e-mail and telephone communication. Regardless of the fact that the Montenegrin Embassy in Beijing expressed willingness to help us, we did not take advantage of it.

Confidence of Chinese universities and institutions built by the UDG, its Rector and the Cooperation coordinator in the preceding period was crucial for all the universities and institutions which the UDG directly addressed, to accept meetings proposed. They all accepted both the topics for meetings, that were send to them with the required documents in advance, and meeting time proposed by the UDG Delegation.

Let each reader conclude what kind of organizational project it is on the basis of the first document in this book “UDG visit to China, December 2018 Meetings schedule”.

Can you really imagine that this Agenda was submitted on 3 December and confirmed by all participants (with slight modifications) on 10 December 2018?

Delegation of the UDG went to China on 17 December and stayed there until 30 December. We had 43 meetings and reports from each meeting, developed pursuant to our methodology, are contained in this book.

After that, we have maintained regular communication with partners from China and implement the agreed activities in 2019, which will likely be the subject of another book.

A review of the chronology of cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities and institutions aimed to dispel any illusions you might have had about any assistance of the state and to point out that the initiative, business spirit and professional responsibility represent the basis for any cooperation.

This chronology should be seen in light of the fact that the UDG is in the market, that neither it nor our students have any subsidy from the state, and in the context of the fact that the UDG invests in ability of a student as a global citizen of the world.

## 2. WHY THIS BOOK?

This is the book which refers to cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities, Chinese companies and Chinese government institutions since the beginning of cooperation in 2014 to 2018. The book contains documents and photos that chronicle events which took place during this period of cooperation.

- **Why a book like this one?**

First of all, the book should be an incentive for further cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities, companies and institutions. And not only for them ... Certainly, future cooperation depends on the degree of success of current cooperation, especially of the execution of commitments taken by both sides so far. Just it does not allow to forget and interpret something differently. At the same time, the book is a contribution to the transparency, i.e. accessibility of information about the cooperation of a large number of employees, individuals and institutions.

- **What do we expect from students, associates and professors at the UDG?**

We expect an active approach to cooperation of every individual! New initiatives, suggestions, improvements and above all, personal participation. Opportunities for cooperation are, as now seems, almost limitless. Cooperation certainly implies also financial investment by both sides, since the cooperation is based on the principles of equal exchange of students and professors - a host bears expenses of partner country participants' staying, while airline tickets are paid by the participants themselves.

- **What else do we expect?**

I expect that every student, and associate at the UDG realizes that he/she has an almost incredible opportunity to be professionally and culturally lifted and to use that opportunity.

- **What do we demand?**

We demand a responsible and professional attitude of each individual towards the obligations imposed within the framework of cooperation (departure, staying, arrival ...). Anyone who participates in cooperation individually signs the agreement governing the rights and obligations of students, associates and professors, on the one hand, and the UDG, on the other hand. This agreement represents a part of the learning agreement i.e. engagement or service agreement/employment contract at the UDG.

- **What else do we demand?**

Each participant in cooperation should realize that this is primarily institutional cooperation (the UDG and the Chinese partner not "private cooperation"). It follows that each participant has to perform his/her obligations and to behave with respect

to the principles of the Almanac of Studies at the UDG, as well as family education and contribute to increase the reputation and image of the UDG!

- **What to keep in mind particularly?**

Opportunities offered through this, as well as through cooperation with other universities (USA, Europe, South America ...) are not the obligation taken, through a learning or service agreement, as an obligation of the UDG. It follows that the selection of candidates for participation in cooperation is made by the UDG on the basis of transparently established and disclosed criteria, but also according to scientific and personnel policy and generally a vision of development of the UDG! ... Do not forget that international cooperation of the UDG is before all the development path of the UDG and our study model  $S=z \cdot i^2$ !

- **How has everything developed?**

Everything has developed from the vision of development of the UDG, which relies on a platform for internationalization ... The UDG has incorporated the principles of openness and internationalization in the foundations of its development since the idea of the establishment and the earliest start, beginning with our mission to train a UDG student to be **a responsible citizens of a global world**, introduction of English as the official language and gradual introduction of courses taught in English and that a UDG student has to know at least two foreign languages. Today, professors from all continents hold lectures at the UDG, the exchange of students and professors is developing, the world-famous writers, diplomats, managers, businessmen are involved in the educational process, students undergo practical training in the world leading companies ... In a word, **global networking** of the UDG is the essence of the development vision of the UDG ... Naturally, such an approach to development is based on our faith, our passion our confidence that the UDG will enable a student to be a part of the global business and social elite.

- **How has this all been done?**

Solely on own initiative, business spirit and use of opportunities! Better to say, through understanding of time, historical and current, as well as through peeking into the future. This cooperation has been created **without any government, diplomatic or financial assistance**! Everything is **the UDG initiative** – arising primarily from my international experience, understanding of globalization and, in the initial phase, cooperation with the Embassy of China. The last visit (18 to 30 December 2018), which included 43 meetings in three cities: Beijing, Chengdu and Shanghai, was organized **exclusively** through the Office of International Cooperation of the UDG, if we exclude the assistance of the Embassy of China in organizing the meeting with the Confucius Institute. I feel that many who read this do not believe this ... This is just an indication that that reader **does not understand how the today's global networked world functions** ... Naturally, in order to participate in this global networking previously we previously have to have some reference ... I admit that the position of the Minister in the Ante Marković's Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia helped me a lot in making connections (e-mail, phone...).

- **What preceded this cooperation?**

It was preceded by the evolutionary development of international cooperation with universities from the USA, Europe and South America (Guatemala). Especially important was the cooperation provided through my membership, and membership of several of my colleagues in the Mont Pelerin Society in Washington. Approximately 90 memorandums of understanding (MOU) with the Universities of the region, Europe and the USA were signed! **The largest number of UDG students have practical training in the United States, but also increasingly in the EU.** The development and diversity of internationalization of the UDG results in the fact that the UDG also has the largest number of students in the international exchange or practical training, even though the total number of UDG students is 7-8 times less than the number of students at another university.

- **What are the next steps in international cooperation?**

It is hard to say... However, the global start-up revolution requires that the entire studies of each faculty are directed in that direction. This means, not only engineering and natural sciences, but also the social sciences and humanities. Better to say, the start-up philosophy means integration, holistic approach based on teams composed of members from different disciplines... Here I talk about the philosophy of the idea and philosophy of start-ups, not about “business as usual”. Start-ups that change business in the entire industry or field are based on research, innovations and entrepreneurship. They are based on creative and critical thinking ... They are based on team work which implies tolerance and democratic approach to decision making, as well as the individual responsibility of each team...

- **What is our key limitation?**

People are still afraid of “leaving the family nest,” or tranquility at work!

Fear of uncertainty which any change bears ...

However, all this so far cooperation as well as cooperation in the past five years, we understand as clearing of new roads and the expansion of the existing ones!

But we must be realistic and realize that we are not big ... But we are also not small ... It means that we realize that **everything is possible especially what seems impossible today.**

This book confirms the validity of this assertion, isn't it?

Imagine that in 2015 somebody presented everything contained in this book as a vision of cooperation with China by 2019?

Would you believe it?

We believed and that is why we have such cooperation with the largest country in the world!



### 3. METHODOLOGICAL MESSAGES AND ADVICE ON THE BASIS OF CURRENT COOPERATION

#### A.

- Experience of cooperation with China should be also understood as a special *Case study* on the basis of which a methodology for organizing and monitoring of international cooperation at the UDG should be developed. It is necessary to consider and adopt the key principles and strategies of this cooperation which will be valid for all areas and all forms of cooperation.
- International cooperation is aimed at **networking the UDG** on various regional, continental and global levels. Networking means further intertwining of vision and practice of the UDG with “partner nodes” from abroad. It is not just the mechanical getting together and doing business, but about establishing long-term and compatible connection between the “nodes in the network”... That means avoiding the approach: “The job is done. Goodbye!” Each cooperation should result in long-term bond, which primarily reflects through the logic of communication. This means a very simple communication by e-mail at the level of the most ordinary notices or information... In a word, this relationship should not be allowed to cool or be forgotten.
- Every professor, every associate, every student of the UDG should, within **the global UDG network**, have **its own network** and be responsible for its maintenance and functioning. **To be able to have your own network in a long term, it is necessary that you make a professional impression, a good and strong impression, that you are sincere in cooperation and keep your word and keep your promises ... Certainly, completely and on time!**
- International networking is much more than a local one and especially is much more than social networks! International networking needs knowledge of international standards and principles, and not local and relaxed approach to agreements and obligations .... It is metaphorical as in sports. Participation in European competitions does not require a concept “local market” training - changing mind often, now I have time, now I don’t, now it does not matter to me - I will do it tomorrow ... but needs training of a cruel professional...
- International networking so far has raised, and will only further raise the level and quality of our studies, our participation in the international competition, it will contribute to employment and business of our students, contribute individually to professors and associates and students to upgrade to a higher degree of personal development, contribute to the image of the UDG, and therefore to each professor, associate and student, individually.... **Each of us should realize that without an international, global networking neither any**



**company, any single institution in a small country such as Montenegro, and nor the UDG, can survive long-term development.**

- I advise any of you who is reading this and feel to know this and that this is needless to say, **to discuss your philosophy of life well.** In particular, to discuss it well from the point of the achieved (not imaginary assumptions) results in the field of **personal** international networking. I am sure that those who are “deeply networked” will understand me and use some of this for themselves! **The master recognizes the master and always learns from the master.**
- Adhering to key principles and standards of international cooperation and global networking of the UDG we can establish such a comprehensive and efficient international cooperation with China that no university in Eastern Europe has.

## B.

- Every meeting at any place and at any occasion is a chance, an opportunity to establish cooperation and then networking! Each business card you exchange is an open window for cooperation ... Certainly, if you know how to use it. And you know how to use it only if you have a vision of own development and co-workers with whom you work or collaborate ... After each exchange of business cards send an e-mail message with an appropriate message and gratitude in the next 2-3 days. Also, if you made any commitment - **do it urgently or let people know that you cannot do it.** Using meetings at different conferences - I got business cards from famous people from China who openly accept cooperation. Some of them were later “UDG ambassadors” in China enabling us important connections!
- **Arrival of more Chinese delegations** (business and university ones) in Montenegro and the UDG was also an important channel for establishing connections ... I develop logic among young associates not to waste time with people who want to come to the UDG just out of curiosity or to fill the agenda of visit to Montenegro – but I also develop logic that every meeting can be an opportunity for cooperation... From our local custom to charm and impress foreigners with the beauties of Montenegro and “glory” of the UDG, we move **quickly to seek opportunities for cooperation and visit soon turns into a program-project meeting.** If you have no idea of how could you cooperate with the announced delegation - then the best thing to do is not to host the delegation ... If you allow them to lead a meeting in your house, have their own initiatives, and you are inferior, you leave a bad impression ... When you turn a meeting - visit to a program one, **your impression and respect for you grows...** It is the UDG approach! That is how we train our students .... That is

knowledge of skills which matters in business ... But attention to this is rarely paid at certain universities ... At the UDG, we certainly pay attention to these and many other vitally important "little things"!

- **Scientific conferences** that were held in China and at which professors, associates and even students participated have also been used as an opportunity to establish new connections.
- „**Pilot project**“ of cooperation with the University Xihua from Chengdu was very successful and good preparation for cooperation with other universities.
- In 2016, UDG Delegation was in a working visit to Beijing, and through the Chinese Embassy in Montenegro. Within that visit, participation of Chinese professors and partners in Miločer Development Forum was agreed.
- An important link of cooperation was **the invitation of the Government of the People's Republic of China** to the UDG Rector, Prof. Dr. Veselin Vukotić to participate in **the prestigious scientific conference "China Studies" in Beijing in 2018.**
- Based on these and some other connections and the decision of the UDG to work on the project of **opening the China Studies**, the visit of the UDG Delegation to Chinese universities, companies and institutions was organized in order to further deepen already existing cooperation of the UDG with China.

### C.

- Preparation of the visit was initiated in September 2018 and ended on 20 November 2018. The visit program and preparation for its implementation was made by Prof. Dr. Veselin Vukotić, the Rector and Prof. Dr. Zoran Đikanović, the coordinator of cooperation with China. Part of the technical work was done by the International Relations Department headed by the manager Bojana Mališić.
- The work on the China Studies curriculum, which began in 2017, was completed in the first half of October 2018. The China Studies curriculum, as well as an explanation of the basic idea and implementation of studies were part of the materials for discussion with Chinese universities.
- At the beginning, we defined all possible forms and activities of cooperation with universities and companies from China - about 20 different forms of cooperation and partnerships.
- On that basis and based on the China Studies curriculum we made **a meeting agenda for every university, company, and institution.** That is, we defined

the expectations of each meeting! This was necessary since a lot of work had to be done in a short time... **In order to be effective - a meeting must be prepared in advance...**

- Therefore, initially, a meeting was prepared at the UDG. Draft meeting agenda and the proposed China Studies curriculum, including basic information about the UDG and members of the delegation, **a proposed date, time and details of the meeting were forwarded to email addresses of people with whom we requested meetings.** It was not easy to fit meetings in terms of time and place, since Beijing and Chengdu and particularly Shanghai are huge cities, and distances are large...
- You may see from the Visit agenda in this book that density of meetings. Only one university asked to move the meeting up half an hour, and all others accepted what we suggested.
- We had a Visit schedule with **terms confirmed by Chinese partners on 10 December 2018.**
- Program's goals were **100%** achieved, without any cancellation and with **two new meetings.**

#### D.

- **You should arrive on time** to each meeting, regardless of large distances between meeting locations. At all meetings, the hosts were already in the conference room ten minutes before, while the representatives of the faculty or company were waiting for us at the entrance in front of the building.
- **Dress code** should be strictly business professional attire - tie required! The Chinese hold to that, because that way they show respect to their guests.
- Discussion with the Chinese must be **well prepared.** It must be very specific! They are not easy-going negotiators, but respect the arguments. They particularly appreciate your persuasiveness of what you propose and evaluate **the passion** with which you communicate an idea.
- Chinese hosts are very welcoming and respect a guest. For example, each university has welcome publicly displayed at the entrance or in the room where the meeting is taking place. Also names of our delegation and participants to it were written on the table ... Chinese love photos. Likewise, you will always get a gift from your host ... **Therefore, do not go to China without gifts** ... Our gift was a folder containing the scarf of the UDG, my two books for the library of that faculty and UDG Almanac of Studies in Chinese. On the back of the folder the names of all our study programs in Chinese were written.

- The Chinese show **great courtesy and kindness** during discussions, and show respect for the guest, which is naturally expected from you as a guest.
- Broadly speaking, with the Chinese in particular, you should negotiate sincerely. This means that you know why you are at a meeting, what is your goal. You communicate this brief and clear! Avoid using metaphors - they are difficult to be translated into Chinese.
- If your idea is clear to you, **be persistent!** Do not give up, since the Chinese often, and this is my experience, very skillfully test great symbiosis with the idea or suggestion! Of course, you should not exaggerate. Our experience is that, when you win the confidence of the Chinese - then he will work with you to seek a solution for implementation of your proposals, which could not be accepted at first.
- Never forget that China is **a one-party system** and that each institution has a party secretary. Regardless of the presence and participation of representatives of the party do not have any **political approach** and do not express your suggestions in a political tone. We accepted the presence of the party in good faith as respect of cornerstones of the Chinese side to establish friendly cooperation with Montenegro. Do not expect any Chinese - our experience, that he will **bore you with any ideology**. Again, this collaboration **has no ideology - except ideology of good cooperation for the sake of greater success and development of the UDG and a desire of the Chinese people to use that cooperation also for the development of their institutions.**

#### E.

- Conclusions of each meeting should be very specific and precise. Subsequent dilemmas hamper further cooperation and yet, you leave a bad impression.
- At the end of the day you need that delegations, or you if only you are at a conference, a particular meeting, look and repeat the suggestions and conclusions of the meeting (while still fresh). **Be sure to send a letter of gratitude to the host.**
- Send the hosts - partners conclusions of the meeting, short, concise and accurate. If the host - the partner does not respond it means that the conclusions are accepted by them ... If the host/partner subsequently (in a month, a year) expresses doubt or indecisiveness, or is unwilling to fulfill any of them, you should refer to conclusions sent and to persevere on it, and not allow them to be changed if you do not want it ... The same is true vice versa ... you cannot "relax" with commitments undertaken and wait the Chinese partner to accepts those changes. Naturally, if he accepts that it is a mutual will. However, avoid this.

- The Chinese are **hard negotiators!** But when you agree - they respect agreement very professionally. Of course, if you follow the agreement reached.
- You must completely eliminate our Balkan over sensitiveness for yourself: you have understanding for your laziness and mistakes and you blame others for them by the rule while, at the same time, you are strict to others and want them to be professional to you.

You may expect and ask others to act as professionals only if you act as a professional towards them. "Everybody knows that" ... Pick a little your business history"... but also everyday decisions ... If you are honest you will notice that this " you do not know" in all situations...

#### F.

- Upon return to the UDG, **a complete Report** should be submitted to the International Relations Department. Previously inform and have a meeting with the Rector, i.e. some of the members of the Rector's Collegium.

Writing **the Report should start on the same day when the meeting is held, and the full Report is completed either at the airport or in the plane!** The moment you land in Golubovci you forgot 30%, and after 7 days 70%... **The Report must exude a sense of freshness ... Freshness is given by some little things, the details, as well as suggestions that quickly vanish, disappear when you rushed into the rails of everyday life.**

- The Rector, or the competent member of the Rector's Collegium, or principal manager or coordinator for the area, agree implementation plan, as well as undertaking of commitments.
- The final control of fulfillment of obligations is carried by the Rector of the University and informs the Rector's Collegium and the UDG Senate on these activities!
- This procedure applies to all activities that occur at the UDG!

#### G.

- Visit and meetings during the cooperation are successful only **if they continue and are enriched by new forms and new initiatives!**

Immediately break the habit of provincial thinking!

Socializing is a measure of your ability to love someone!  
Socializing is a reflection of love from your heart!

## STRUCTURE OF THE BOOK

This book presents the chronology of the establishment and development of cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities and institutions.

The first section of the book contains the Meeting agenda of the UDG delegation with Chinese universities and institutions in December 2018, with the topics proposed for discussion, as well as reports from individual meetings and operational conclusions reached in this matter.

The second section contains speeches and materials of Prof. Dr. Veselin Vukotić, in which he outlined a vision of internationalization of studies at the UDG and operational development strategy of cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities, institutions and companies, which he presented at the following conferences:

- Second China - Central and Eastern European Countries Education Policy Dialogue, Beijing and Tianjin, September 21 - 24, 2014,
- Miločer Development Forum, Cetinje, September 12 – 13, 2017,
- Symposium on China Studies, Beijing, July 23 - 28, 2018,
- Miločer Development Forum, Cetinje, September 20 – 21, 2018,

The second section also contains the material “China – History, Culture, Religion, Science” which was the basis for understanding the topic of the student project cycle “Idea and character” in the winter semester of the academic year 2017/2018.

The third section contains information and review of implementation of the student project “Idea and character”. This is the biggest innovation in the development of studies at the UDG, and in the spring semester of the academic year 2017/2018 the



topic was “China - History, Culture, Religion, Science,” with participation of 1.278 students from all faculties of the UDG divided in 231 groups. In winter semester of the academic year 2018/2019 the topic was “Silk Road” with participation of 1.518 students from all faculties of the UDG divided in 253 groups.

The UDG is a co-organizer of Miločer Development Forum. The fourth section contains reports from Forums held in 2017 and 2018, and the speech of the Ambassador Cui Zhi Wei dedicated to the topic “Globalization and Belt & Road Initiative” at the 2017 Miločer Development Forum.

The fifth section relates to cooperation of the UDG with Chinese universities and contains agreements and Memorandums of Understanding, as well as the documentation of the realized part of the cooperation and undertaken mutual commitments with 10 Chinese universities.

The sixth section contains information relating to realized academic exchange, as well as reports on the exchange of professors, associates and students the UDG realized with Chinese universities and institutions.

The seventh section of the book contains reports about the UDG Summer school and Camp for talents held in 2017 and 2018, where, in addition to talents from Montenegrin high schools and UDG students, also 21 students from China participated.

The eighth section relates to cooperation of the UDG with five Chinese companies and banks and contains agreements and Memorandums of Understanding, as well as the documentation of the realized part of the cooperation and undertaken mutual commitments.

The ninth section contains reports on internships which the UDG provided for Chinese students in Montenegrin companies and institutions, as well as internships the UDG provided for its students in Chinese companies and banks during 2017 and 2018.

The tenth section relates to cooperation of the UDG with several Chinese institutions and organizations and contains documentation about the visits, presentations, participation in conferences.

The eleventh section contains scientific and professional conferences at which the Rector Veselin Vukotić and a delegation of the UDG participated.

In particular, the twelfth section is dedicated to participation of the UDG in the “Initiative 16 + 1”, the activities and conferences within this initiative which were organized by the UDG, and at which, at the invitation, representatives of the UDG participated.

The thirteenth section of the book refers to a conference “Promotion of cooperation of the UDG with Chinese Universities and The Belt and Road Initiative”, which was held on October 9th, 2018 at the UDG.

# 第一部分

## 下戈里察大学的国际化之路

国际化是下戈里察大学发展的关键原则——不论在校园生活还是学习研究范畴。这体现在：学校的官方语言为英语；学生必须至少掌握两门外语才获准毕业；所有的硕士研究生课程均为英语教学；参加法国瓦岱勒国际商学院组织的国际旅游专业双学位学习时需使用英语，等等……这与欧盟统计局认可的欧洲官方统计硕士EMOS的做法相似。目前学校还正在筹备数个英语教学项目，并计划未来大部分本科教学也使用英语完成。在起步阶段，部分课程使用德语、土耳其语和俄语。而在下戈里察大学的外语中心，开设有约10门外语课程，其中就包括汉语教学，教师来自黑山大学孔子学院和本校与中国高校开展的教师互换项目。

下戈里察大学与本地区、欧洲及美国的约90所高校签署有合作备忘录。美国学生已连续数年来到下戈里察大学学习黑山语或来黑山实习。而本校前往美国交流的师生数量也是最多的。约20余名教授和教师拥有海外留学和工作经历。与此同时，下戈里察大学聘用有来自世界各大洲的教授。可以说，国际化是本校开放办学理念的实质和精华所在，代表着学校的思维方式和世界观，这不是机械的约定，而是渗透进学校活动的每分每秒。实际上，下戈里察大学拥有全黑山、甚至可能是整个地区最多学生海外实习和交流机会的大学，尤为受欢迎的是赴美国实习的机会。

过去几年间，下戈里察大学与中国高校的合作日渐紧密，这也是本书关注的重点。越来越多的专家和企业界人士从海外来到下大。我们与在黑山经营的多家国际企业建立有良好合作，其中不仅有欧洲企业，现在更增加了中国企业。越来越多的下戈里察大学学生前往亚洲国家实习。至此，学校的国际化又新增了一条重要渠道：国际合作项

目。下戈里察大学已经不光是一些大项目的参与者，同时正在获得各方信任，逐渐成为欧洲大项目的引领者。下大已参与进欧盟科研框架计划“地平线2020”内的多个项目。国际化还意味着下戈里察大学对国际会议的积极参与，同时，下大已经组织了8场国际会议，这不光在校园内，还包括与黑山经济学人协会共同举办的重要国际会议：米洛切尔发展论坛。

此外，下戈里察大学的学生也正参与着一些大型国际会议、比赛，包括由联合国组织、在西班牙举办的圣地亚哥朝圣之旅。下戈里察大学“创业之巢”（师生创新创业平台）是与世界最知名的创新创业大学特拉维夫大学合作进行的。值得一提的还有与波罗的海国家在信息领域的良好合作，与此同时，我们的数位教师正在欧洲和美国知名大学完成自己的博士研究生学习。

我们的使命达成有赖于一条国际化道路，因为这条道路能够让学生们增强和发挥才干，成为全球化世界中负责任的公民。我们正创造一则新的神话：地球——我们的母亲！——每个人都为地球母亲肩负着不可推卸的责任。我们深知下大只是来自弹丸小国黑山的一所规模不大的大学，但我们已经意识到，在全球化背景下，不论庞大者或弱小者，都各具优势，真正有麻烦的是那些“中庸者”。庞大者的优势在于其规模效应所释放出的集体力量，弱小者的优势在于其能够轻巧地调整转型！

我们正生活在一个充满奇迹的世界中，正如爱丽丝在梦游仙境时所说：“多么神奇的世界，你必须越跑越快才能停留在同一个位置上。”

下戈里察大学也正努力越跑越快，不只是为了保持在同一位置上——更是为了迅速攀上高峰！

在您面前打开的这本书，也是一部对华合作的个案研究，它会助您一探我们这项使命的真实性，和我们所取得成果的真实性！

永远别忘了：下戈里察大学——它是一段历史，也是未来的种子！

## 第二部分

### 1. 与中国高校和企业合作大事记

下戈里察大学与中国高校的合作源于本校最初提出的与中国驻黑山大使馆建立合作的倡议。

在2012年至2014年间，与中国驻黑山大使馆的合作只停留在信件往来的形式。

其间，下戈里察大学尝试与中方就开设“中国学”专业进行探讨，并就对华合作开展初步接触，但未取得实际进展。随后，孔子学院在黑山大学设立，虽然下戈里察大学表达了在本校开设孔子学院的意愿，但遗憾未能成行。

2014年9月21日至24日，下戈里察大学校长韦塞林·武科蒂奇受邀出席由中国教育部举办的第二届中国-中东欧教育政策对话会，这是本校与中国高校和机构务实合作的开端。大会在北京和天津举行，武科蒂奇校长利用此次机会与中国高校建立了联系。

借助此次建立的联系和沟通渠道，下戈里察大学与中国高校双方的合作兴趣日渐浓厚。会后，下大与中国数所高校建立了邮件往来并为战略合作做准备。

以此为工作方向，下戈里察大学在国际合作部下成立专门的对华合作处，并任命专门的对华合作协调员。

2015年底，新任中国驻黑山大使崔志伟阁下在首次访问下大时即对学校的发展战略表示认可。

自此，我们开启了与中国驻黑山大使馆更紧密的合作，多数访黑的中国高校、商务团组都将下戈里察大学列为访问考察的一站。从这



时起，中国驻黑山大使馆于希女士具体负责与下戈里察大学的合作与沟通事宜。

下戈里察大学将所接待的每一个中方团组都视为未来合作的重要渠道，并在访问后与其保持密切的书信往来。这一努力也终于取得了成果：2016年5月和10月，中国成都的西华大学和我校代表团分别实现互访。在此期间，两校签署了合作协议，并最终在2017年3月至7月间实现了3名下大学生赴西华大学交流；同时西华大学汉语教师也来到下大为学生们授课。

同年，8名西华大学的学生来黑参加了历时15天的人才夏令营，该夏令营每年在采蒂涅举办；同时，下大还为3名西华大学学生提供了在黑山企业和机构带薪实习机会。

与西华大学的成功合作，打开了下大与中国高校后续合作的“开关”。

在此期间，黑山所有大学均收到了参与“16+1合作”机制内活动的邀请，2017年5月，所有3所大学的代表访问北京联合大学。得益于此次访问，下戈里察在自己的国际化战略发展中，朝着与中国高校和机构合作的方向迈出了一大步。

访华期间，下戈里察大学代表团与中国国际贸易促进委员会、北京市人民政府外事办公室、世界中餐业联合会的代表举行了会谈，并将会谈成果落实在了2017年的米洛切尔发展论坛的筹备工作中。

2017年9月举办的米洛切尔发展论坛的主题被确定为：“全球化与‘一带一路’倡议”，共有约60名中国学界和商界代表参加，本届论坛将中文定为工作语言之一，这在黑山历史上尚属首次。时任中国驻黑山大使崔志伟阁下在大会上致辞。几位出席论坛的中国高校代表还在下戈里察大学举办了演讲。

通过米洛切尔发展论坛，我们不仅深化了业已建立的联系，还建立了新的合作渠道。

2017年10月，下戈里察大学派出3人代表团出席在中国西安举行的“‘一带一路’大学创新创业教育校长论坛”，大会上，下戈里察大学教师卢卡·拉科维奇被宣布为第三届中国“互联网+”大学生创新创业大赛的获胜者之一。

这次会议，也是我们建立新联系、签署新合作协议的一次契机。

随后，得益于与西华大学和北京联合大学旅游学院签署的协议，下大的首批15名学生分别前往成都和北京进行为期5个月的交流。同时，下大的3名教师在西华大学撰写了博士研究生论文。

此外，来自中方的13名学生参加了在采蒂涅举行的人才夏令营，4名中方学生在黑山的企业和机构完成带薪实习。来自中方的1名汉语教师进行了2018学年第二学期的授课。

2018年7月，下戈里察大学校长韦塞林·武科蒂奇教授受邀出席在北京举行的“汉学与当代中国”研讨会，共有来自世界各国的30名专家与10名中方专家受邀出席。与其同时在京进行研讨的还有“青年汉学家研修计划”来自世界各地的120名青年才俊。

利用此次机会，武科蒂奇校长与浙江工商大学和阿里巴巴集团建立了新的联系。

回到黑山后，武科蒂奇校长即组织学校核心人员重新探讨2012年就已提出的“中国学”专业设立的问题。

要落实“中国学”专业课程的设立，需要与中国高校和企业建立更紧密更长期的合作。

在包括新任中国驻黑山大使刘晋阁下出席并参与主题讨论的2018年米洛切尔发展论坛上，下戈里察大学公布了开设“中国学”专业的设想，并介绍了已经完成的部分准备工作。刘晋大使在讲话中介绍了自己对下戈里察大学的访问，并表示已经了解了下大对华合作的计划。使馆华亚芳参赞和严嘉琦先生也出席了相关活动。

根据下戈里察大学的评估，实现“中国学”专业的设立，与实施师生交流互换、学生赴对方国家实习一样，需要下大向中国高校和企业进行面对面的解释和介绍，需要我们在专业开设前，尽早与中国国家汉办就派出汉语教师事宜、与中国多所高校就派出15至20名教授事宜和我校该专业学生学习期间赴华交流一学期事宜进行沟通。

这就是下戈里察大学决定派出代表团赴中国进行工作访问的原因。

正式决定是在2018年9月底米洛切尔发展论坛结束后立即做出的。在两个月的筹备期间，除中国驻黑山大使馆帮助我们联络确定了与中国国家汉办的会谈外，我们在没有任何来自黑国家、外交部门或其他方面资金帮助的情况下，通过电子邮件和电话沟通，独立确定了全部访问行程。虽然黑山驻华使馆也向我们表达了协助意愿，但我们婉谢了他们的好意。

实际上，下戈里察大学本身、下大校长和对华合作协调员在此前所做的工作，让我们早已获得了中国高校和有关部门的信任，这种信任在我们此次向对方发出会谈邀请、获得对方同意的过程中发挥了很大作用。各方均接受了我們提出的议程建议、有关文件和我们所建议的会议时间。

关于此次系列会谈的组织协调工作，每位读者都可以从本书的《下戈里察大学代表团2018年12月访华时间表》中获得感兴趣的内容。

你们能否想象，这份日程我们是在2018年12月3日才向对方提出，虽然最终日程略有变动，但在12月10日就获得了各方的确认？

下戈里察大学代表团12月17日启程赴华，12月30日离华。其间，我们共举行43场会谈，根据我们的工作规程，每场会谈后均形成报告，收录于本书中。

在与中方各合作伙伴进行沟通后，2019年我们将逐步落实所商定的工作，这部分内容也许会在下一本书中讲述。

撰写下戈里察大学对华合作大事记这一章节的初衷是想驳斥那些对我们的臆想，驳斥那些说我们获得了某种国家层面帮助的论断。我们还想告诉大家，自主倡议、企业家精神和专业精神是所有合作的基础。

这份大事记所展示的内容在于，下戈里察大学自主参与市场行为，在没有任何来自国家补贴和学生资助的情况下，努力为提升学生能力进行投入，帮助学生们成为负责任的全球公民。

## 2. 本书出版目的

本书记录了下戈里察大学在2014年至2018年与中国高校、企业和有关机构合作的历程，书中包含了此间多个合作项目的文件和活动图片。

- 为什么是这样一本书？

首先，本书将继续激励下戈里察大学与中国高校、企业、机构及更多伙伴的合作。未来合作的成功必将取决于当下合作的成果，特别是目前各合作方对各自承担责任的完成情况。合作任重道远，不容许我们有些许懈怠。同时，本书还将帮助各合作方的同仁更清晰有效地获取我们合作的信息。

- 我们对下戈里察大学的师生有何期待？

我们期待参与——每个独立的个体都参与到合作当中，通过亲身参与，提出新的倡议、改进建议。从目前看来，未来合作还有着无限可能。我们期待理解——合作同时意味着双方的资金投入，合作建立在交流师生平等的原则之上——接待方承担交换师生在当地的所有费用，而国际旅费需要交换师生自行承担。

- 我们还期待什么？

我期待下戈里察大学的每位师生能意识到，如果把握住这样的机会，将给个人的专业和学术水平带来难以置信的提升。

- 我们要求什么？

我们要求每个个体在合作中，都具有与自身承担责任相符的责任感和专业精神（包括抵达合作方所在地、停留期间的合作内容、返程等等）。合作项目的每一位参与者，不论下戈里察大学的师生或合作方人员，都应签署规范合作权责的协议。该协议在下戈里察大学内部也是就读协议、聘用协议的一部分。

- 我们还要求什么？

合作的每位参与者首先都应明白，这是一项机构间合作（下戈里察大学与中方合作伙伴），而非“私人合作”。因此，每个人都应认

真履行职责，遵守下戈里察大学的年报准则，体现良好的家庭教养，为树立下戈里察大学的形象和声誉做贡献！

- 我们的视野中应该特别包含什么？

对华合作，以及与美国、欧洲、南美的其他高校合作所提供的未来可能性，并非通过下戈里察大学的就学协议、聘用协议来体现。下戈里察大学通过透明且明确的评估标准选拔合作项目候选人，评估标准体现于学校的学术研究、人才政策和发展规划当中。不要忘记，下戈里察大学的国际合作道路正是学校的发展之路，我们的教学模式是  $S=z \cdot i^2$ （学生能力=知识  $\times$  生活阅历<sup>2</sup>）！

- 这一切是如何发生的？

这一切都源于下戈里察大学基于国际化平台的发展愿景！下戈里察大学在建校之初就以开放和国际化作为学校的安身立命之本。学校以培养全球化世界的负责任公民为己任，将英语作为学校官方语言，逐步将英语设为教学语言，要求学生们至少掌握两门外语，如今学校的教授来自各个大洲，学校努力扩展师生交流空间，邀请世界著名文学家、外交官、经理人、企业家走进课堂，为学生们提供在世界知名企业实习的机会……简言之，下戈里察大学的发展愿景是织起一张全球网络。当然，这一发展过程有赖于我们的信仰、激情和自信，我们相信下戈里察大学将赋予学生们跻身全球商务和社会精英阶层的能力。

- 这一切是如何做成的？

主动性、创业精神、把握机会！换句话说，就是对时间，也就是历史与现在的深刻理解，和对未来的精准判断。这一合作的开展没有受到国家外交和资金方面的任何扶持！一切倡议均由下戈里察大学提出——这得益于我的国际交流经验、对全球化的理解，以及在最初阶段与中国驻黑山大使馆的合作。最近一次对中国的访问是在2018年12月18日至30日，我们走访了北京、成都和上海3座城市，举行了43场会谈。此访由下戈里察大学国际合作部专门负责组织，中国驻黑山大使馆协助安排了与中国国家汉办的会谈。估计不少读者都会觉得难以置信……如果哪位读者真的这样认为，那说明他对当今的网络社会如何运转仍不甚了解。当然，即便是通过全球网络，在最初也需要有特定

的资质。我承认，我曾经在前南斯拉夫时期安戴·马尔科维奇政府中担任过部长的经历，帮我们打开了建立联络的大门（邮件、电话……），对我大有帮助。

- 在此之前是什么样？

在此之前，我们与美国、欧洲和南美（危地马拉）高校的国际合作已经有了革命性进展。特别是我作为华盛顿朝圣山学社的成员，通过其他同仁达成了多项重要合作。在这些合作框架内，我们与地区、欧洲和美国的高校签署了约90份合作协议。下戈里察大学学生中最多的是前往美国实习，还有越来越多的学生前往欧盟国家。下戈里察大学在国际化道路上的领先优势和多样化选择，让本校成为黑山拥有绝对最多学生海外交流和实习机会的大学，虽然我们的学生总体数量只是某些大学的七、八分之一。

- 国际合作的后续步骤有哪些？

这很难说……不过，这场全球创新创业的革命要求所有学科、所有专业都朝这个方向努力。这意味着，不只是技术和自然科学专业，还包括人文和社会科学专业。换言之，创新创业理念要求的是一支基于不同学科的整合一体化的团队。我们这里所说的是创新理念和哲学，而非“惯常的商业”。创新创业在整个行业和领域里改变着传统意义上的商业，它是基于研究、创新和创业的概念，要求创意和批评性的思维方式，需要以包容和民主协商的方式做出决策和团队协作，需要团队中的每个个体履行责任。

- 我们最关键的局限是什么？

人们仍旧惧怕“离开温暖的家庭巢穴”，惧怕职场上的苦痛！

惧怕每一点变化带来的不确定性……

不过，我们把所有截至目前的合作、以及过去5年的合作，都视为开发新道路、拓宽已有道路的过程。

与此同时我们也必须意识到我们的规模并不大……但也并不小……这意味着我们意识到没有什么是不可能的——包括那些我们今天认为是不可能的事情。

难道这本书还不足以证明这条判断的正确吗？

想象一下，如果有人2015年给你介绍这本书里的内容，告诉你，这是我们2019年对华合作的前景？

你会相信吗？

我们会相信。所以我们现在拥有着与世界最强大国家的合作！

### 3. 基于目前合作的建议

#### A.

与中国的合作应被看作是下戈里察大学国际合作中一个基于组织方法论的特殊研究案例。合作中达成的关键原则和策略在所有其他领域和不同类型的合作中都是有效的。

国际合作的目的是要在不同的地区、大洲和全球层面布设下戈里察大学的网络。布网也意味着将下戈里察大学的愿景和实践更深入地渗透进国外的“伙伴枢纽”当中。这不是一种机械性的组合或事务性的工作，而是在“网络的各个枢纽”之间设立长期且和谐共生的联系。这意味着将避免“工作完成，再见！”的局面出现。每一项合作都应滋养出一段长期关系，其所反映出的是一种沟通逻辑。这可以是非常简单的沟通方式，比如邮件这种最寻常的信息互通渠道。也就是说，不要让这段关系冷却下去、被遗忘掉。

下戈里察大学的每位师生都应在学校的全球网络当中拥有自己的网络，并负责维护该网络的运转。为了能让你长期拥有自己的网络，你应当给人以专业、良善的印象，坦诚合作，说到做到，信守诺言……当然，还要全情投入并且及时！

全球网络的布局较之地区网络意味着更多，比社交网络的意义更加重大！这一布网过程要求人们深谙国际标准和准则，而不仅限于地区范围内相对宽松的约定俗成和责任义务。打个比方，就如同体育比赛。参加欧洲级别的比赛不需要“地方市场式”的理念——一会儿可以，一会儿不行；一会儿有时间，一会儿没时间；现在这个不重要——明天再做……而要求的是纯粹的专业人才。

布设国际网络，已经、并且仍将继续提升我们学术研究的水平和质量，我们参与国际竞争，将有助于学生未来的就业和经营，将有助于帮助师生提升个人层次，将有助于下戈里察大学树立形象，从而让每位师生受益。我们中的每个人都应该意识到，如果没有全球国际网络的布设，就没有任何一家企业、任何一个机构会来到小小的黑山，更不要说走进下戈里察大学，长期发展更无从提起。



正在阅读本书的读者中可能有人认为这些道理早已懂得，提出足以震撼他们人生哲学的建议实属多余，特别是那些从个人国际网络中已经取得成果所带来的震撼。但我可以肯定的是，那些理解我所说的“深入布网”的人，会从中获益！只有大师能够辨别出谁是大师，并永远虚心请教。

在下戈里察大学布设全球网络的过程中，通过对国际合作关键原则及标准的尊重，我们得以与中国建立起丰富且高质量的国际合作，这在东欧高校中绝无仅有。

## B.

不论在任何地方，任何场合的会面，都是机会，都是建立合作继而建立网络的机会！每一张你所交换的名片都是一扇敞开的合作之窗……当然，前提是你知道如何使用它。而只有你知道自己的发展方向和该如何与合作伙伴开展合作，才算你知道如何使用它。在每次交换名片后的2-3天，写一封邮件，向对方表示问候和感谢。同时，如果你承担了任何责任和工作——尽早完成或告诉对方你做不到。充分利用各种会议的场合创造与人见面结识的机会——我就曾这样获得了中国知名人士的名片并就此展开合作。他们中的一些人后来甚至成了中国的“下戈里察大学推广大使”，帮我们建立了重要联系！

前来访黑和访问下戈里察大学的多个中国代表团（商务的或学术的）也是建立合作关系的重要渠道。我常向年轻同事灌输这样的理念：如果有人愿意来访问下戈里察大学，花时间考察我校，不论是出于好奇还是只为了丰富在黑山的行程，我们都不能错过——或许这就是一次可资建立合作的机会。从黑山人欢迎外国友人的传统做法——让其领略黑山的壮美自然风光和下戈里察大学的荣耀——我们很快就转入正题，寻求合作机会，就此，一次寻常的访问就变成了一次项目规划会议。如果你对如何与即将到来的团组开展合作毫无想法——那么最好就不要接待他们。如果你允许有人在你的地盘上主导会议，而你只处于从属地位，你就已经给对方留下了不好的印象。当你把会议——也就是访问，“转变”成一次规划会议，你给对方的印象就会加分，你也会赢得对方更多尊重。这是下戈里察大学的一条捷径！我们也是这样教导学生的。这些知识和技巧在职场上非常重要。但如今很少有大学会关注这些。在下戈里察大学，我们对很多重要的生活“琐事”投入更多关注。

在中国举行的有高校师生出席的学术会议也被我们视作建立新联系的机会加以利用。

与中国成都西华大学合作的“试点项目”非常成功，也为日后与其他大学的合作进行了铺垫。

在中国驻黑山大使馆的组织下，下戈里察大学代表团于2017年访问了北京。在此次访问中各方商定，中国高校师生将出席米洛切尔发展论坛。

应中国政府邀请，2018年下戈里察大学校长韦塞林·武科蒂奇教授在北京出席“汉学与当代中国”研讨会，这是一次重要的建立合作的机会。

基于上述以及其他一些联系渠道和平台，下戈里察大学计划启动开设“中国学”专业的项目，并派出代表团访问多所中国高校、企业和机构，进一步深化业已建立的对华合作。

### C.

此访于2018年9月底开始筹划，并于2018年12月20日圆满完成。访问筹备、行程安排直至成功实现访问等工作均由校长韦塞林·武科蒂奇教授和本校对华合作协调员佐兰·吉卡诺维奇教授负责落实。部分技术性工作由博亚娜·玛利希奇率领的国际合作办公室进行。

“中国学”专业教学计划的撰写工作于2017年启动，2018年10月上旬完成。该专业教学计划、专业设置初步设想及实现方式都成为访华期间与中方会谈内容的组成部分。

在最开始我们就确定了与中国高校和企业合作的所有可能的模式，多达20余种。

基于这些预想的模式和“中国学”专业的教学计划，我们为与每所高校、每家企业和机构的会谈都设置了专门的议程。也就是说，我们对每场会谈都预先设置了谈判目标！要想在很短时间内完成这么多工作，这一点十分必要。为了保证效率，必须预先为会谈做好充足准备。

最初的会谈准备是在下戈里察大学内部完成的。我们只是通过邮件将议程建议、“中国学”专业教学计划草案、下戈里察大学基本情况和代表团成员的基本情况发送给了我们希望见到的中方人士，同时提出会谈时间建议和其他细节建议。协调各场会谈时间和地点并不容易，因为北京、成都、上海都是大城市，会谈地点之间路程较远。

在本书的访问时间表中您可以看到密集的会谈安排。其中只有一所大学要求我们把会谈时间提前半小时，其余各方均接受了我们的建议。

我们于2018年12月10日与所有合作伙伴确定了会谈时间和访问安排。

预期的访问计划100%被敲定，没有任何一场会见被取消，还新增了两场会谈。

#### D.

不论会场路途多远，每场会谈都必须按时抵达。在每场会谈前，接待方都会提前10分钟左右进入会场，还会派专人在办公楼入口处迎接我们。

着装必须严格按照正式要求——必须打领带！中国人很重视这一点，以此表达对客人的尊重。

与中国人的会谈必须事先充分准备。必须非常具体！他们不是容易对付的谈判对手，但遵守约定。他们尤其注重你所提出建议的可信程度，以及你对工作的热情程度。

中国人作为东道主非常好客并尊重客人。比如在每所大学，一进入校门或会议厅，你都会得到热情欢迎。同时，在会议上都会摆放会见双方的名签。中国人喜欢照相。另外，你总是都会得到他们赠送的礼物。所以去中国别不带礼物。我们准备的“礼包”包括下戈里察大学的纪念围巾、赠送给大学图书馆的我的两本著作、下戈里察大学年报的中文版。在“礼包”的背面还有下戈里察大学所有专业的中文版名录。

在会谈中中国人会展示出极大的礼貌、热情和对客人的尊重，这是每位客人都期待的。

总地说来，与中国人会谈要特别注意态度诚恳。也就是说，你要清楚自己来会谈的目的。尽量简短而清晰地将信息传递给对方！避免比喻式的表述——那很难被翻译成中文。

如果你的想法和建议很清晰，那么还要锲而不舍！不要放弃，经验告诉我，中国人非常善于测试你对合作建议的认真和坚持程度！当然，也没必要强迫他们。我的经验是，当你一旦获得了中方的信任，那么他们会和你一起想办法实现你的建议——即便最开始他们可能并不接受。

永远别忘了中国是个一党制国家，在每个机构中都设有党组织。不论是否有政党代表出席会谈，都不要出现任何政治言论，也不要提出合作建议时带有政治色彩。如果有政党代表出席会谈，我认为这恰恰说明他们对黑山朋友们的尊重和对未来合作的美好意愿。经验还告诉我，别以为中国人会忽视你任何关于意识形态表述。再次重申，在我们的合作中没有任何意识形态的东西——抛开意识形态，好的合作将带来更大的成功，帮助下戈里察大学实现更大发展，中国朋友们也希望通过高质量的合作助益他们所在机构的发展。

#### E.

会谈最终的结论和决定必须非常具体而明确。后续再补充决定的话会增加合作的难度，并留下糟糕的印象。

在会谈当天的早些时候，应当趁着会谈刚刚结束，再次向对方回顾和重申你所提出的建议，并强调双方达成的结论和决定。一定要向会谈接待方致信表示感谢。

会谈的结论和决定，要简短而具体地发给会谈东道主，也就是你的合作伙伴。如果他们不做任何反应，则可以理解为他们接受了这些结论和决定。但如果随后（可能一个月也可能一年）他们对这些内容表示疑问和迟疑，或者不愿履行相关责任和义务，你一定要重申会谈中双方达成的一致，坚持履行会谈决定，不要允许他们发生任何变化，如果那不是你想要的结果——反之亦然——在履行责任义务时你不可以有任何懈怠，不要要求中方合作伙伴因为你而做出改变，除非这是双方共同的意愿——不过，还是要避免这种局面。

中国人是不好对付的谈判对手！然而一旦达成一致，他们会非常专业地遵守约定。当然，前提是你也信守诺言。

你们必须完全放弃咱们所谓巴尔干特色的矫情和无病呻吟，也就是“宽于律己，严以待人”：不要因为自己的懒惰和错误所造成的后果，去严厉指责别人，要求别人专业地做事。

只有你自己对别人展示出专业态度时，才能期望别人专业地对待你。你可能会说“这谁都知道”……但回头看看你的工作履历，看看每天的工作，如果你足够认真地去梳理，就会意识到可能你并不是时时都能注意这一点。

#### F.

回到学校后，我们需要把完整的访问报告提交给国际合作办公室，通知校长全会召开校长会议。

访问报告必须从会谈结束当天就开始着手撰写，在机场或飞机上就全部撰写完成！不然当你落地格鲁波夫齐机场时就已经遗忘了30%，随后的一周连剩余的70%都抛在脑后了。报告必须保留一手信息。报告新鲜出炉时必须包括所有细节和后续工作建议，不然很快就会被遗忘在日常的工作当中。

校长本人、或校长全会负责人、校务总经理及相关领域协调员，应负责报告中后续建议的落实。

校长负责落实工作的监督，并将结果通报给校长委员会和校委会。

这一过程应穿插到下戈里察大学的各项工作当中。

#### G.

只有当后续衔接上更多更新更丰富的合作内容和建议时，访问和会谈才是成功的。

## 第三部分

### 本书结构

第三部分是“中国理念与特色”活动的情况回顾。这是下戈里察大学最大的一次教学创新。在2017-2018学年度第二学期举办的这次活动共有来自所有院系的1278名学生参加，他们被分成231个小组进行展演。2018-2019学年度第一学期学校还举办了“丝绸之路”学生交流活动，共有253个组别的1518名学生参加。

此外，下戈里察大学还是米洛切尔发展论坛的协办方。本书的第四部分收录了2017年和2018年两届该论坛的报告，以及时任中国驻黑山大使崔志伟阁下在2017年论坛上的开幕辞，题为《全球化与“一带一路”倡议》。

第五部分主要涵盖下戈里察大学与中国高校的合作情况，包括签署的协议和备忘录、合作项目实施相关文件以及与10所中国高校合作的具体情况。

第六部分记录了下戈里察大学与中国高校和机构进行学术交流、师生互换交流的报告等内容。

第七部分收录了下戈里察大学2017年和2018年两届夏季人才夏令营的报告，除黑山优秀中学生和大学生外，参加该夏令营的还包括21名来自中国的学生。

第八部分呈现的是下戈里察大学与5家中国企业和银行的合作，包括所签署的协议、备忘录、及双方落实合作内容的情况。

第九部分记录了2017年至2018年间，下戈里察大学为中国学生们提供在黑山企业和机构实习机会的情况，以及下戈里察大学学生在中国企业和银行实习的情况。

第十部分介绍了下戈里察大学与其他几家中国机构和组织合作的有关内容，包括往来交流文件、情况介绍和出席会议情况。

第十一部分介绍了下戈里察大学校长韦塞林·武科蒂奇先生和学校代表团出席学术专业会议的情况。

第十二部分，作为本书的特别章节，记录了下戈里察大学参加“16+1合作”框架内活动和会议的情况。

第十三部分是2018年10月9日在下戈里察大学举办的“‘一带一路’倡议背景下，下戈里察大学与中国高校合作推介会”的内容。

#### **Notes:**

- The visit lasted for 12 days.
- During the visit, the UDG delegation had 43 meetings with Chinese universities and institutions.
- The overall visit agenda was prepared by the UDG, except for a meeting at the Confucius Institute Headquarter - HANBAN, which was prepared by the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Montenegro. This means that we did not have a host of visits.
- All universities and institutions accepted the UDG proposal for meeting time, except the Confucius Institute Headquarter, which requested the meeting to start half an hour earlier than proposed.
- All meetings started and ended in accordance with the Agenda, thus showing particular respect of our Chinese partners for the delegation of the UDG.
- No meeting was delayed either by our side or by the side of Chinese partners.
- The largest number of Chinese institutions provided a car for the UDG delegation transport.
- All meetings and interviews were conducted in a professional and friendly atmosphere.
- The opportunities offered by collaboration with Chinese universities and institutions are a major challenge for the UDG - professors and students. It is therefore necessary that each professor and each student be aware of the UDG's cooperation with Chinese universities and companies.
- The UDG delegation has assumed major obligations towards Chinese partners, which requires our professional responsibility.
- The UDG delegation's opinion after this (fifth) visit to China is that cooperation with Chinese universities provides the UDG with a strategic opportunity to evolutively become one of the most prestigious universities in Eastern Europe.

# Study Program: “China Studies”

## 1. “China studies” learning goals

China studies will focus on research of modern China in a global and historic context. The program will be based on a research of culture, history, philosophy, and economics of the country which has the biggest economic power of the world. The global influence of China will rise in years which follow, especially through implementation of The Belt and Road Initiative. As a micro country, Montenegro has already started international cooperation with China. The number of young people from Montenegro who want to visit China is rising. The number of Chinese tourist in Montenegro is increasing too. Chinese investors are opening their companies in Montenegro, as well as Montenegrin people are starting their businesses in China. This trend will increase and accelerate more and more in coming years. Does Montenegro have enough educated and experienced individuals who can do business with China and Chinese companies at the moment? Are there enough Montenegrins who speak Chinese language? Can we discuss education for global society if we do not know anything about Chinese civilization?

## 2. “China studies” learning objectives

1. Students will obtain Advanced level of Chinese language
2. Students will demonstrate a deep understanding of China’s political and economic system in contemporary and historical context
3. Students will demonstrate understanding of China in regional context and comparative perspective
4. Students will be capable to grasp the range of issues influencing China’s domestic development and its cooperation and with other countries
5. Students will conduct informed analysis of changes in Chinese domestic and international policy toward China
6. Spreading students’ business network between Montenegro and China
7. Students will possess high understanding of Chinese culture and business, economic history of China and financial system of China
8. Students will possess high understanding of Chinese religion and philosophy
9. Students will be able to understand scientific and technological development of China and the policy of innovation
10. Students will be able to understand anthropology of China
11. Students will be able to understand and take active part of the New Silk Road and “The Belt and Road Initiative”

### 3. Organization of “China studies”

“China studies” will be organized as a separate study program within the Faculty for culture and tourism at UDG. Chinese studies can only be organized in cooperation with a group of Universities from China. At least five professors from China would give lectures at different levels of study and within different fields of studies on China. Language courses will be provided through 2 different channels: or within the cooperation with Universities from China or through Confucius Institute. All students of “China studies” will be participants of exchange program which will include the stay at one of Universities from China for at least one semester. Students will do internship in Chinese institutions and companies in Montenegro for a period of at least one month. Special attention will be given to knowledge of informatics, research methodology and understanding of financial markets of China, as well as system of innovation in Chinese companies.

### 4. General characteristics of “China studies” and challenges for their implementation

Studies will set good theoretical, philosophical and cultural foundations for doing business in practice, as well as for personal and professional development of every student. In addition to that, students will be provided with knowledge from philosophy and practice of business which they can use within any company in the world - not just with China. Attained knowledge will make students capable to continue their studies at master and doctoral levels, as well as it will enable them to work in state institutions and diplomacy. Advanced knowledge of Chinese language gives various job opportunities to students, especially in the field of tourism and culture. In summary, “China studies” will be the way not just to open to dominant American and Atlantic economy, but to all growing and more powerful Pacific economy.

### 5. Accreditation of “China studies”

Accreditation of studies will be done according to the Law on higher education in Montenegro. It would be functional for both sides if it would be possible to accredit the studies in China.

In accordance with Montenegrin law, “China studies” would be Bologna accredited studies with **180 ECTS credits** (European Credit Transfer System) with undergraduate studies which would last **3 years**.

## Discussion:

Ms. Pang and Mr. Vukotic discussed on very successful cooperation of our two universities in the framework of „16+1 initiative“ and in student exchange programme.

Rektor Vukotic stressed out that developing the communication and cooperation of our students and young people is critical for future friendship of our two countries. UDG has developed cooperation with numerous universities, companies, banks, and institution from China, and UDG would like to continue with students exchange program with BUU.

Although very successful and good bases, that is the „history“ part of our cooperation and we have to focus on the „future“. UDG has prepared „China Studies“ three year study program as a corner-stone for future activities. In relation to „China Studies“ program UDG ask for:

- BUU provides one professor of Chinese Culture and one professor of Chinese Tourism per year. Professor should stay at UDG 2 / 3 weeks, hold 20 lectures and 10 hours consultation with students. UDG covers costs of accommodation, food and local transportation within Montenegro, and BUU covers air ticket and professor's salary / wage during the period he / she teaches at UDG
- Student exchange – 5 students from UDG “China Studies” program, V semester, for one semester at Tourism College of BUU. It will start during Winter semester 2022/2023
- Internships – could Tourism College of BUU provide Internship for UDG students, Vatel program, in their business partner companies in China
- One professor from Tourism College of BUU to lecture / present at UDG methodology of teaching in virtual classroom that Tourism College of BUU utilize
- UDG website – cooperation in obtaining and providing data, information, articles, documents, education in tourism,

Ms. Pang positively responded to UDG initiatives.

It was concluded that:

- BUU already provides „Chinese Semester“ and it will not be a problem to accommodate 5 - 7 UDG students from „China Studies“ program. On reciprocity, UDG will accommodate BUU students
  - In that regard, BUU believes that Beijing Municipal Commission of Education can help financially in providing additional funds to BUU that all the expenses of UDG students are covered (including food, as it was a problem in students exchange 2018)
- BUU accept to provide one professor of Chinese Culture and one professor of Chinese Tourism.
  - In that line, the idea has been raised that first semester professor comes to Montenegro and for another semester to hold lectures online.
- Based on mutual consent, UDG will at the meeting in Han Bann raise the question of establishing separate Confucius Institute on tourism and education, together with BUU (BUU has one such joint project in Wales)
- BUU is willing to accept UDG students at their Business College for students exchange
- UDG and BUU should initiate joint researches in the field of tourism, both in front of Chinese and EU institutions, or their funding authorities.

## Discussion:

Mr. Zhao Guocheng praised on good cooperation Confucius Institute has with Montenegro, with Chinese Embassy in Montenegro, and he stressed that Mr. Vukotic with his initiatives and successful programmes contributed most to good cooperation between Montenegro and China.

Rector Vukotic thanked for the warm welcome and kind hospitality, and presented what UDG has developed through cooperation with numerous universities, companies, banks, and institution from China. Rector Vukotic expressed that cooperation with China is the strategic program for UDG and its development.



He expressed UDG's view on corner-stones for future activities, which are:

1. Establishing Confucius Institute at UDG (jointly with BUU)
2. Establishing „China Studies“ - three year study program. In relation to „China Studies“ UDG ask for
  - One professor of Chinese Language per semester, on minimum period of 7 years
  - Expenses of the professors engagement shall be borne by Confucius Institute

Rector Vukotic also explained that Confucius Institute at UDG and the three year study program „China Studies“ will be separate activities, although Confucius Institute at UDG would serve as a bases for study program „China Studies“.

Mr. Zhao Guocheng positively responded to UDG initiatives, explaining that it would be much more feasible and conveniente to establish the independent Confucius Institute Classroom at UDG (instead of Confucius Institute at UDG), which will serve not only as the bases for Chinese language teachers for „China Studies“program, but as a bases for teachers on more different topics and bases for other cultural activities.

Also, Mr. Zhao Guocheng explained that formal initiation should come from UDG's side in written with supporting documentation. Confucius Institute Headquarters will evaluate it and also will audit whether BUU has the capacity to successfully bear proposed cooperation.

However, that finding will not influence the establishment of Confucius Institute Classroom at UDG with possibly other partner university.



### Conclusions:

- Confucius Institute Headquarters positively responded to both UDG ideas
- UDG will prepare its application and will formally apply to establish Confucius Institute Classroom at UDG in very short period of time
- Confucius Institute Headquarters provided UDG with the set of rules and document forms needed for application

## Discussion:

Rektor Vukotic thanked for the warm welcome and kind hospitality, and presented what UDG has developed through cooperation with numerous universities, companies, banks, and institution from China.

Academic exchange was very intensive in last two years. In that period 40 of UDG students and asspiates have been on academic exchange in China, studying from one month to one year. Also, 9 of UDG students were on Internship in companies in China.

At the same time, arround 40 students and professors atended programs that UDG organize (Summer School, Camp for talents, ...) and UDG provided Internship for 7 Chinese tudents in companies in Montenegro. UDG would like to continue with students exchange program, since the development of comminication and cooperation of young people is critial for future friendship of our two countries.

Rector Vukotic expressed that cooperation with China is the strategic program for UDG and its development.

Although very successful and good bases, that is the „history“ part of our cooperation and we have to focus on the „future“. UDG has prepared „China Studies“ three year study program as a corner-stone for future activities. UDG has already got support from the Embassy of PR China in Montenegro, Han Ban, Beijing Municipal Education Commission, and several universities.

In relation to „China Studies“ program UDG ask for:

- BLCU provides one professor of Chinese Culture, who should stay at UDG 2 / 3 weeks, hold 20 lectures and 10 hours consultation with students. UDG covers costs of accommodation, food and local transportation within Montenegro, and BUU covers air ticket and professor’s salary / wage during the period he / she teaches at UDG
- Student exchange – 5 students from UDG “China Studies” program, V semester, for one semester at BLCU. It will start during Winter semester 2022/2023. UDG students pays for the air ticket and the BLCU provides tuition, accommodation, food and local transportation.
- UDG can offer to accept and host BLCU studnets in Montenegro, at the same costs-bearing proposition.

Professor Zhang introduced BLCU main activities – translating Chinese culture world wide. Also, BLCU is more specialized in literature and can not offer professors as UDG requested.

#### Notes:

1. The meeting was very formal in nature, our feeling is that BLCU organized the meeting with no clear interest to cooperate but to satisfy the request of Professor Vukotic
2. BLCU was not well prepared and familiar with materials / documents which UDG has sent in preparation to meeting (UDG Promotion of cooperation with China, program China Studies)
3. BLCU insisted that they are specific and unique university, they cannot cooperate in proposed way.

## Topic: Cooperation between UDG and universities from Beijing



### Discussion:

Mr. Liu Yuhui expressed his appreciation of very successful cooperation that UDG has developed with Chinese universities in the framework of „16+1 inicijative“ and in student exchange programe. He informed UDG delegation that related to the future of education and education development, conferences has been organized first on the PR China’s level and following that the Beijing Government has organized the conference on the same topic. Mr. Liu Yuhui expressed his view, since Beijing has 92 universities, the competition among them is very simulative and that in university has to be open and cooperate with the outside universities in order to progress. That is the reason the representatives of BISU were invited to the meeting.

Rektor Vukotic thanked for the warm welcome and kind hospitality. He reminded on Mr. Liu Yuhui’s visit to UDG in September 2017 and their discussion on future cooperation at that time. Both have concluded that developing the communication and cooperation of students and young people is critial for future friendship of our two countries. UDG has developed cooperation with numerous universities, companies, banks, and institution from China, and it considers further development of cooperation with China as its strategic vision.

UDG has prepared „China Studies“, the three year study program as a corner-stone for future activities.

In relation to „China Studies“ program UDG has a kind request:

- That Beijing Municipal Commission for Education support Universities from Beijing that will cooperate with UDG in “China studies” program
- Minimum period of cooperation 5 - 7 years, in order to have guaranteed sustainability
- Student exchange: 5 - 7 students of UDG’s “China Studies” program (V semester), for one semester at Beijing universities
- Internships – could Beijing universities provide Internship for UDG students in their business partner companies in China

Mr. Liu Yuhui expressed his positive view on UDG activities and support for future development of cooperation. He and the institution he leads will support the activities but cooperation has to be developed between UDG and a specific Beijing based university. He introduced Rector and representatives of Beijing International Studies

University, with recommendation that two universities have many similar programs and should explore possibilities for cooperation.

Rector Ji Jinbiao introduced BISU as the modern and well connected university, which has outstanding achievements in the field of foreign languages, especially SEE languages, and also in the field of Tourism and Culture. BISU cooperates with 170 universities from over 40 countries. BISU also has an Institute for B&R, the first one in China. Mr. Ji Jinbiao also presented that BISU has co-organized international conference on BRI in Panama.

Rector Vukotic expressed UDG's interest:

- to collaborate with BISU in researches and learning the methodology which BISU develop and employ,
- to co-host together with BISU next international conference on BRI,
- to organize with BMCE regional conference for SEE countries on the topic "Education and BRI"

Mr. Liu invited Rector Vukotić to contact him personally if UDG experience any difficulty or problem in cooperation with universities from Beijing. Our impression is that it is a personal, not only professional relation.

### Conclusions:

- Mr. Liu Yuhui and Rector Ji Jinbiao positively responded to UDG proposals.
- UDG delegation will visit BISU immediately, on Saturday, December 22 and continue the discussion on mutual cooperation.
- Rector Vukotic promised to inform Mr. Liu Yuhui on the agreements and conclusions UDG reaches with universities from Beijing.



## Notes:

1. Both BMCE and BISU were well prepared and familiar with materials / documents which UDG has sent in preparation to meeting (UDG Promotion of cooperation with China, program China Studies). They had materials already translated to Chinese.
2. The reactions were very positive and we have the impression that these materials contributed to the Chinese partners understanding the seriousness of our cooperation
3. They were all prepared because we prepared in due time and asked questions to be discussed at each meeting
4. At the meeting, each partner was provided with questions that the UDG wants to discuss and in relation to which UDG wishes to establish cooperation, which influenced the concreteness of the meetings and the operation of the interview
5. It seems that both BMCE and BISU welcomes UDG's initiatives
6. BISU reacted on the information that Rector Vukotic was the Minister for Economic System in the last Yugoslav Federal Government. Their Rector Ji Jinbiao is an economist, and is involved in Government level projects
7. Very friendly and promising feeling after the meeting
8. Easy communication and eagerness to host UDG delegation on weekend shows BISU interest for cooperation (The details and agenda of visit to BISU agreed in communication through Wechat 10 minutes following the meeting in BMCE).

## Discussion:

The meeting with representatives of U-Tour Group was dedicated to two issues:

- Wine Village Project – possibility and interest to finance and partner in that project,
- Internships for UDG students U-Tour in China.

Professor Vukotic presented to the U-tour representatives the idea of Wine Village Project and the wish to look for the partnership in this project. Partner is expected to bring to the project:

- Co-financing in the joint venture (50 % - 50 %), and
- marketing among growing Chinese touristic market.

Representatives of U-Tour presented their achievements in previous years, that U-Tour is among three biggest tour-operators in China, they are the first Stock Exchange listed company from tourism sector. Their market is growing and also the different services it provides to clients.

Representatives of U-Tour asked several questions in order to clarify the position and expectations in Wine Village project:

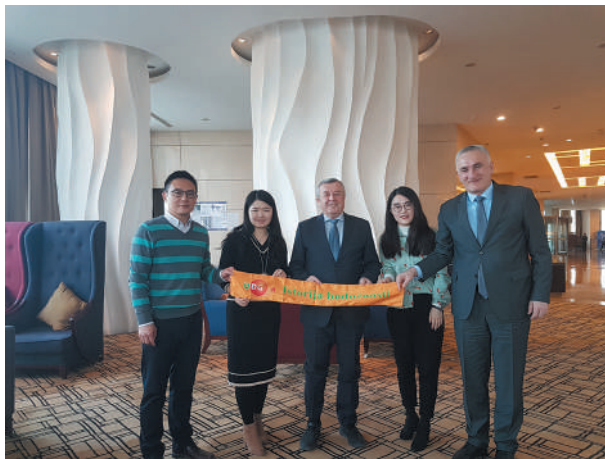
- what is legal position of foreign investments in Montenegro,
- what is treatment of foreigners investing in real estate,
- could the project be focused on building the apartments / villas and later selling them to Chinese buyers,
- similar questions clarifying the legal side of investment and partnership.



Professor Vukotic explained answers to those questions with the principle that the foreigners and their investments in Montenegro have the same treatment as one made by domestic citizen.

Also, it was explained that the purpose of making joint investment is not to build apartments for sale, but to establish the company which will build hotel and villas and utilize those resources for tourism purpose.

The second issue that was discussed was Internship for UDG students in China. U-Tour representatives have promised to respond to that question after discussing it with senior management, namely Ms. Lin Yan, Vice-president.



#### Conclusions:

1. U-Tour will consider the proposition for Wine Village project and report back to company Plantaze

Academic exchange was very intensive in last two years. In that period 40 of UDG students and asspociates have been on academic exchange in China, studying from one month to one year. Also, 9 of UDG students were on Internship in companies in China. At the same time, arround 40 students and professors atended programs that UDG organize (Summer School, Camp for talents, ...) and UDG provided Internship for 7 Chinese tudents in companies in Montenegro. UDG would like to continue with students exchange program, since the development of comminication and cooperation of young people is critial for future friendship of our two countries.

Rector Vukotic expressed that cooperation with China is the strategic program for UDG and its development. Also, Professor Vukotic has introduces 18 topisc for UDG cooperation with Chinese institutions and banks, and which are the base for the discussion for cooperation.

The most important topic od those is „China Studies“ three year study program which UDG wants to accredit. It is the corner-stone for future activities. UDG has already got support from the Embassy of PR China in Montenegro, Han Ban, Beijing Municipal Education Commisssion, and several universities.

In relation to „China Studies“ program UDG ask for:

- CNU provides one professor of Chinese History or History of Civilizations, who should stay at UDG 2 / 3 weeks, hold 20 lectures and 10 hours consultation with students. UDG covers costs of accommodation, food and local transportation within Montenegro, and CNU covers air ticket and professor’s salary / wage during the period he / she teaches at UDG.

Professor of Chinese literature has expressed a lot of prise for proposed program of „China Studies“ at UDG. Also, he gave support to UDG’s effort to cultivate tallents in early ages. He suggested that in addition to „mandarin Chinese“, at the program „China Studies“ old Chinese language should be taught and used as a research tool.

He also expressed an offer:

- to accept UDG students from the „China Studies“ program on Summer Schools / Trainings in Chinese language in Beijing,
- CNU offered to send its PhD students in the field of Culture, Language, and History, to teach and practice at „China Studies“ program at UDG,
- Also, CNU will provide program – info list for 2 subjects and Cv of two professors to help and support UDG’s application for accreditation.

The second topic was how to provide for exchange of students and researchers since the CNU.

- It was stressed out that Master and PhD students of CNU could apply for scollarship at the UDG through B&R Fundings.
- PhD studies can not be organized for less than 4 year, although some shorter term application could organized.

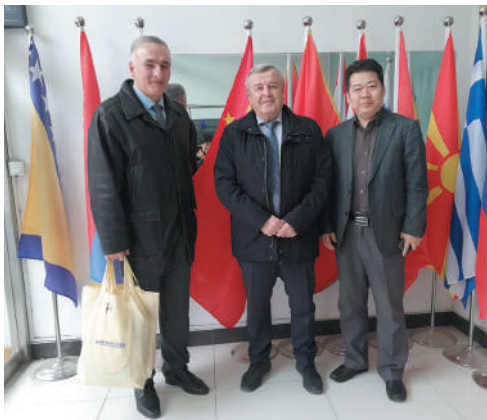
Professor Vukotic has asked for:

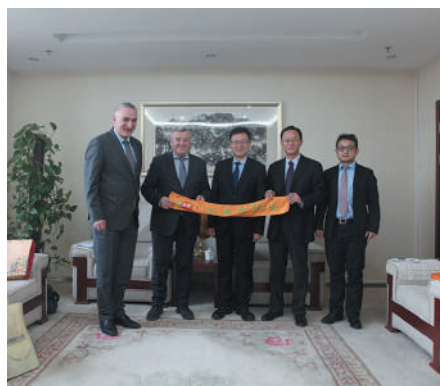
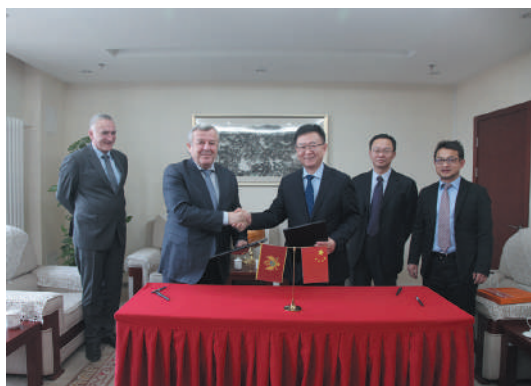
In that period 40 of UDG students and asspiates have been on academic exchange in China, studying from one month to one year. Also, 9 of UDG students were on Internship in companies in China. At the same time, arround 40 students and professors atended programs that UDG organize (Summer School, Camp for talents, ...) and UDG provided Internship for 7 Chinese students in companies in Montenegro.

UDG would like to continue with students exchange program, since the development of communication and cooperation of young people is critial for future friendship of our two countries.

Rector Vukotic expressed that cooperation with China is the strategic program for UDG and its development. Also, Professor Vukotic has introduced 18 topics for UDG cooperation with Chinese institutions and banks, and which are the base for the discussion for cooperation.

One of the most important topics of those is „China Studies“ three year study program which UDG wants to accredit. It is the corner-stone for future activities. UDG has already got support from the Embassy of PR China in Montenegro, Han Ban, Beijing Municipal Education Commission, and several universities.

The second very important topic, and especially interesting for cooperation with CUC is study program „Visual communication“. UDG has prepared the draft of that study program and has brought it for discussion with the CUC.



Vice president Li Xinjun agreed that CUC and UDG have an interest to cooperate and proposed to commence with signing MoU between our two universities. CUC will support „China Studies“ program and professor Zhang Hongsheng, the Dean of Graduate School will review UDG's program „Visual communication“. In that understanding, CUC asked what is the specific need and priority for UDG.

Rector Vukotic stated that the first step should be signing of MoU, the provisions of which have been agreed in the days prior to the meeting.

After that the two parties should proceed step-by-step, as it will be clear what is the specific need for UDG „Visual communication“ program at the time it becomes final and UDG enters the accreditation procedure. By that time UDG would invite the Dean to visit Montenegro and discuss on the needed support at UDG.



Rector Vukotic stated his view that personal acquaintance and trust is the bases for cooperation and on the Recor's level two parties should agree on general level of cooperation, and specialists from both parties should discuss and agree on further steps in cooperation. As CUC have a number of schools / faculties, UDG would like to focus on theory of visual communication.

In addition to that interest and possibilities for cooperation, CUC leaders stated that after their visit to Serbia and due to growing need of companies and business people, they decided to open study program of „Serbian language“.

In line with that, CUC ask UDG to help them in establishing program „Montenegrin language“ by recommending literature, teaching materials and most importantly people / teachers who could be approached and engaged.

## Discussion:

BWG presented itself with a film about the achievements of the company, which are impressive.

They provide 3.8 million families or over 11 million users.

Innovation is a very important aspect of the company's development, especially in the following areas:

- Water loss in the system,
- Water quality
- Management of the entire system
- Purification and treatment of water

Rector Vukotic congratulated on the achieved and vision of development, especially on the organization of the company. Also, Rector reminded that the BWG visit to Montenegro was announced in October 2018, and for that purpose UDG has prepared meetings and companies with which it cooperates, in particular the company Regional Water Supply Company of the Montenegrin Coast and Podgorica Waterworks.

Since the visit was not realized, is BWG interested in cooperating with UDG?

Representatives of BWG expressed their desire and readiness to cooperate.

On the basis of mutual interest expressed for cooperation, Rector Vukotic has outlined three areas that the UDG considers important for cooperation:

1. UDG Center for Water, UDG wants to prepare water and water experts as a resource, and BWG can provide the necessary support in establishing the UDG Water Center. Also, UDG has a laboratory that is partially qualified for testing water quality. In that area, the UDG would require that an expert from the BWG come and stay on the UDG and help as the Center establishes and starts working.
2. Internship students, UDG asks BWG to provide Internship students with UDG. Such cooperation proved to be very useful and UDG has such cooperation with some companies in Chengdu and Beijing.
3. UDG can be business intelligence for BWG in the region of SEE Representatives of the BWG agreed to have the interest to cooperate in the mentioned areas. Given that the company belonging to the Beijing Government, it will initiate such a proposal to the Government and inform us.

Notice:

- BWG have a Water Institute. A colleague running the Institute could be a person for cooperation
- Representatives of BWG who were in the meeting did not know about the planned visit to Montenegro, they were caught by that statement.

## Discussion:

President Ji presented that BISU has established the first Institute - Think Tank dedicated to Belt and Road Initiative in China.

UDG delegation visited Exhibition Hall, and was introduced to history of the BISU and proud fact that Zhou Enlai, Prime Minister, founded this university. Basically there was the study of foreign languages. This university did not extinguish during the Cultural Revolution. It has a continuity of existence, unlike many universities that have ceased to work during the Cultural Revolution.



Alumni of BISU are many university professors, ambassadors, and successful people. During the past 3 years, 16 new programs have been opened - learning the languages of Eastern European countries.

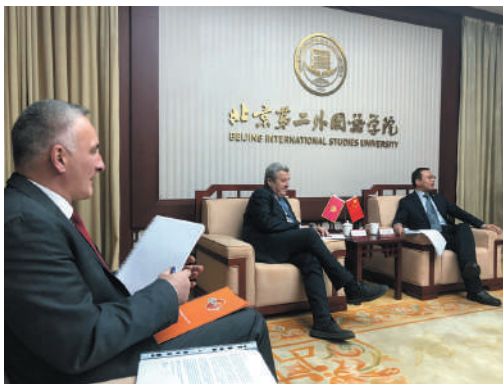
BISU cooperates with 170 universities and institutes from over 40 countries.

They want to create new connections in Eastern Europe and want to collaborate with UDG.

Professor Vukotic thanked for warm hospitality. He presented UDG, explaining that he himself is the Leading Founder and Rector of UDG University, and previously worked as a professor at the State University, Faculty of Economics and has created many successful people in Montenegro.

As a university, UDG is very open, we have about 350 professors from all six continents.

UDG is very active and very engaged in BRI, organizing two large international conferences.



UDG is interested in cooperation within the BRI, and especially with the BISU institute that has a methodology for researching BRI.

We propose a draft MoU, also to organize a conference on the methodology for assessing the impact and effects of BRIs on a country, especially as small as Montenegro.

The proposal is that UDG send a young research associate for several months, BISU to cover costs in China. We also accept their associates under the same conditions.

President Ji praises the capabilities of Professor Vukotic, points out that they are focused on long-term cooperation and effects, not only on exchange of students. Professor Vukotic stresses that we have a long-term view and we want deeper cooperation. He explained his thoughts in the realization of the vision that the UDG have to be on the mainstream trends. In particular, he emphasizes that today's se-

lection of young associates and international communications determines the long-term duration of the university.

President Yi said that BISU want to practically agree:

- They want to accept UDG students
- They want to send a professor for the China Studies program (which program they got in paper at the meeting in Beijing Municipal Education Commission) for the Chinese language, Chinese culture, economics
- They accept UDG younger collaborators at BISU for the research of BRI,
- Also, they agree to jointly conduct research
- They also accept the joint holding of the conference in September 2019 (which UDG organizes as the lead), but mention to include their partners from the region (giving an example of the Panama conference, which they recently organized)

BISU President suggested that we sign MoU and concretize our tasks

Professor Vukotic gave our prepared proposal MoU



At the lunch, a discussion about the achievements was continued, so that they were introduced more closely to UDG philosophy and vision, even their president noted that Professor Vukotic is not only a practical man who realizes his vision, but also a philosopher.

Note:

- BISU welcomed us on Saturday,
- U representatives had in front of them material that we distributed at the meeting in BMEC - translated to Chinese and with already defined and written answers to the questions UDG proposed at that meeting.
- President Ji at the start pointed out: "You came when we needed it."
- The impression is that from BISU we can get every kind of cooperation that we believe should or will suit us - to get all the professors and to send all students in the V semester
- They promised to send a book of the latest research as soon as they translate to English
- A professor from Sichuan - promised that he would send his book
- They said they had an Anthropology professor - a researcher dealing with the "History of Civilizations" (researching Confucius and Plato)
- We were impressed by the respect they express to Zhou ENLAI, not as high-ranking politicians but as the founder of the university, which for us from Montenegro, who do not respect our roots and founders, is a civilizational lesson
- We invited the BISU President to visit the UDG, which in our opinion would strengthen the cooperation of our two universities in the long term,
- We came out from the university with great respect for everything we heard about this university, and especially that they have launched the B & R Research Center
- The visit and presentation of the research center B & R was instructive and it continued the idea that UDG is working on a special methodology of the impact analysis of B & R on the macroeconomic effects on the Montenegrin economy. This information was astonished and captured by our hosts
- We understood the working lunch as a sign of great appreciation for our delegation
- The conversation is conducted with a translation into the Montenegrin / Serbian language, which is remarkable, which we highlighted and praised Ms. Qu Huibin, Associate Professor

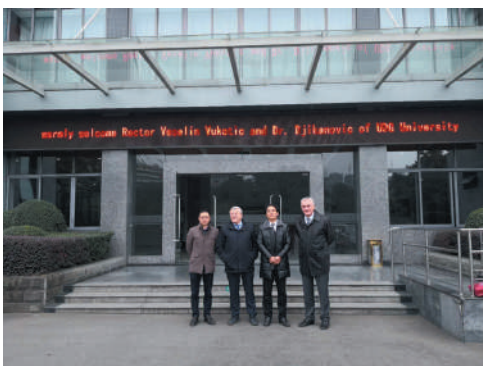

## Discussion:

Vice President of the XIHUA University Mr. Fei expressed his satisfaction that the UDG delegation visited XIHUA University. Also, that the cooperation of two universities is very intensive, and that students and professors involved in cooperation and exchange are very satisfied with the relationship and effects of cooperation. He presented the members of the XIHU delegation who attend the meeting.

The XIHUA Party Secretary Ms. Bian Huimin, warmly welcomed the cooperation of the two universities and stressed the achievements so far: that Chinese language professors from XIHUA visited UDG and held language classes during one semester,

the XIHUA delegation took part in the Milocer Development Forum 2017 which was co-organized by UDG, and that professors from XIHUA held lectures at UDG. Also, UDG students and associates stayed at XIHUA for one semester. UDG provided 7 paid internships in companies in Montenegro for students of XIHUA during the summer of 2017 and 2018, and over 20 students of XIHUA took part in the Summer School and Camp for Talents organized by UDG during July 2017 and 2018. She particularly expressed her satisfaction and gratitude that the President of the Parliament of Montenegro, Mr. Brajović, during his visit to China visited XIHUA University, got acquainted with the development and potentials of XIHUA University, the cooperation of our two universities, and spoke with 9 UDG students at XIHUA.

UDG Rector Mr. Vukotic thanked for warm hospitality. Cooperation with XIHUA for UDG is lucky one because it has started cooperation with China and Chinese institutions and universities with XIHUA and is developing very well. Rector Vukotic also referred to the current cooperation and pointed out to the ceremony organized at UDG - Promoting UDG cooperation with China.

Rector Vukotic handed UDG Acknowledgments to XIHUA University for the current cooperation, and opened the topic of further cooperation between the two universities.

Rector Vukotic primarily presented the three-year study program “Chinese Studies”, which UDG is preparing. It is the first program of such a type in the CEE region, and besides the Chinese language, it will focus the study of Chinese culture, history, philosophy, economics, law. UDG is expecting the program to accommodate students not only from Montenegro.

UDG wants professors from China to take part in the implementation of the program who will be joined by younger associates from Montenegro. Also, Rector has presented that the program envisions students to spend a semester at universities in China, studying Chinese language and culture.

The Rector asked representatives of the XIHUA whether they agree on the general level to cooperate with the realization of the Chinese study program. Mrs. Huimin, on behalf of the XIHUA, affirmatively replied, suggesting that the two universities would form a separate MoU that would define the terms and time period of cooperation. Ms. Huimin pointed out that XIHUA has strategic plans for internationalization, which are the requirements of the Ministry of Education of China and Education Department of Sichuan, which support such a project and that the UDG proposal can be very significant for XIHUA.

Rector Vukotic requested that XIHUA provide professors for the field of Information technologies, Psychology, History, and Economy. He has asked for professor of Anthropology, but XIHUA cannot provide support in that field.

Also, Rector Vukotic has asked for 5 to 7 students from China studies program to study one semester at XIHUA, which proposal was accepted.

It was concluded that:

- This general understanding and agreement represent a very good bases for two universities further cooperation
- XIHUA will provide 2 curricula and 2 CVs of professors to support UDG application for program accreditation
- once the study program commence, the Dean od XIHUA School of Humanities and UDG coordiantor should work out details which should be in written put in MoU with details of each party obligation and liabilities,
- at this moment two universities can not provide joint study program with joint degree diploma or duple diploma, but in future it could be developed,
- XIHUA invite UDG professor to teach XIHUA summer semester – international program (one semester), which they organize in cooperation with the university from Germany, and which is attended by international students from universities with which XIHUA cooperates (USA and Israel). UDG should inform of the names by the end on January 2019,
- Publications and research – two universities should encourage publication of researches in its magazines, XIHUA has 3 magazins of which one, dedicated to natural Science is published on English, and UDG has its magazin also published on English,
- Cooperation between Start-up Incubators should be encouraged and enhanced
- Two universities should search possibilities for B&R funds that support education and cooperation

## Discussion:

The Dean has welcomed UDG delegation and presented the School of Humanities as the biggest school at SWUFE. All the students – freshman study at this school the first year and after that continue their education on other SWUFE schools.

Rector Vukotic presented that UDG cooperate with Chinese universities for 4 years. UDG associate Ms. Marija Orlandic studied for one year at SWUFE in preparing her PhD theses, and she becomes a great promoter of SWUFE.

UDG prepares three year study program „China studies“ which will comprehensively include not only Chinese language but also Chinese history, culture, economy, law, and other subjects. It will be the first program of such a kind in CEE. UDG wants to engage professors from China and its plan is also that students of that program study one semester (V semester) at Chinese universities.

Exploring possibility of cooperation and professors exchange, UDG proposed the principle that host institution provides accommodation, food and local transportation and that international transportation and the salary covers university that sends

the professor. The Dean agrees with the principle, but for its implementation has to ask SWUFE International Cooperation Department for approval since their university rules are different in that regard.

It was concluded that:

- School of Humanities could provide professors for the fields of Philosophy, and also Critical Thinking.
- UDG offered a professor of Media Management, which School of Humanities needs for its Summer school which will be held in July. It is agreed that professor will teach for two weeks.
- School of Humanities could not provide professors for the subjects Chinese Economy and Chinese Financial System, but other SWUFE schools could, and it should be discussed with SWUFE President.
- For students exchange, it is agreed that host institution provides accommodation, food and local transportation, and students themselves have to bear costs of international transportation, visa and insurance.
- SWUFE organizes very popular Summer School, and admission is limited to 2 students per partner university.
- UDG organizes Summer School, and offered 5 places for SWUFE students. Also, SWUFE asked for one professor to accompany them, which UDG gladly accepted. The conclusion is that the number of students at each Summer school should be the same.

Notes:

- SWUFE principle is that students at the exchange do not pay the tuition, but themselves bear the living expenses.
- For professors exchange, SWUFE pays to domestic professors 15 Euro per class, and to foreign professor 150 Euro per class (10 times more). The same amount they expect in the exchange.
- Classes on English they provide for subjects on Economy, Finance, Management, Accounting
- For the student exchange they understood that UDG proposal was considering 50 students, and were surprised when UDG clearly stated 2-3 students. For that number of students it will be no problem for accommodation

- In that case of student exchange they will provide one professor to be the tutor for exchange students
- UDG was provided with the SWUFE postgraduate program Master of Chinese International Education, which will start next year
- Monica, the associate – very good impression, English is very good, easy communication, calm personality

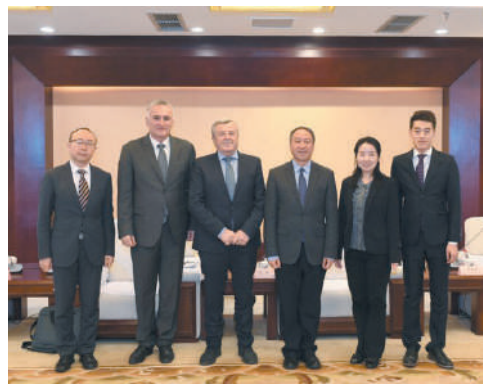

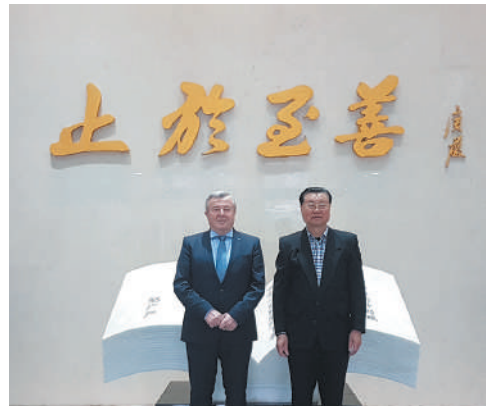

# Concept of Education in New Global Economy \*

(outline for the discussion)

New paradigm in education put focus on an individual, not on collective entities of any kind. Instead of material wealth, physical goods, and property, the importance is given to the quality of living, experiences, enjoyment, pleasure, and highly estimated leisure. When we speak about education system we can say that industrial paradigm of education is being replaced by information paradigm.

If we look back at the role of education system during history we have to start with ancient Greece. Ancient Greek education system gave us Plato, Aristotle, Archimedes, Socrates. Their ideas are 2000-4000 years old, but still fresh and relevant. Ancient Greeks did not have modern equipment and computers, but their ideas survived several thousand years. Why? What happened with education system in the meantime?

Education was the process related to church during many centuries. Schooling system started to develop independently from church at the time when the national state was created. Why? Because, national state needed education system which will serve the dominant ideology and protect interests of "ruling elites". This idea of education was followed by industrial revolution and capitalistic ideas of putting the education in function of increasing production. Globalization process and information economy is putting more emphasis on an individual - personal capacities and character. This changes the role of national state - it loses the means of control, as global market successfully absorbed many activities which were in traditional jurisdiction of national governments (public transport, communal and telecommunication services). Information economy is encouraging long-term transfer from industrial to cultural production. The position of so called economy of experience becomes more important. This change of paradigm is creating the environment for the new approach to education system.

Current education system is based on passive knowledge - memorizing and "warehousing" information. Formal achievements are important, meaning that diploma is important by itself. Current education system makes strong division between theoretical knowledge and practical problems. However, the new era requires education system which will develop skills and competences. Education system should change student's way of thinking, and improve his innovative and creative capacity. This means that the transformation of current education system should be oriented to the development of critical thinking and empirical imagination.

One more issue is important here - young, new generation and its mental profile. How can we speak about education system and its efficiency, if we don't know the psychology of our student? Features of young generation, so called Generation ME (people younger than 35) are important for the discussion on the change of education model. Joan Twenge calls this generation Generation ME, however some other call it generation of netboomers, or net generation. It is the generation of individuals who want freedom in everything they do; they like to personalize everything (to adapt it to them); they have tendency to research (especially through available networks). Generation ME wants entertainment and game within their work, education and social life - this is the generation of cooperation and connections (Facebook, games, homework...). This generation needs speed, not only in video games. Thus it needs new education system.

Having in mind all of this we started to develop new education model at our University UDG. This model puts the emphasis on the knowledge which can be transformed into individual ability and competence, into capacity of an individual to solve problems and be creative. A student in the new education model is not the person who passively absorbs formulas, definitions, factors, models, etc (elements of knowledge).

Postulates of new model of education are as follows:

1. We live in the world of permanent changes, global world of risk and uncertainty, not in static world, where everything is determined and certain, but in the world of uncertainty.
2. Understanding life in global world as the life on the top of the wave. If you try to stop it, you are getting into fight you will lose. But if we see the direction in which the wave is moving and understand invisible streams that moves the wave, then we can learn how to "surf" the wave.

Speaking about the model, our solution to the problem of higher education is

$$S = z \cdot i^2$$

- $S$  - the ability (the capacity) of a student;
- $z$  - knowledge;
- $i$  - life intensity.

Einstein's equation says:  $E = m \cdot c^2$

- $E$  - energy;
- $m$  - mass;
- $c$  - velocity, speed.

What is the energy of a parked car whose weight is 1.500 kg - the car is parked, which means it is not moving? What is the energy of a car, whose weight is 1.500 kg if it moves with speed of 100 km/h? The question we are trying to answer is how the mass could be converted into energy. Speaking about Einstein's equation the factor of conversion is the speed - velocity.

Speaking about new education model represented through, as UDG students say, Professor's equation  $S = z \cdot i^2$  we are trying to find the answer how knowledge of a student could be converted into his/her ability, capacity and competence? The knowledge of an individual is not the ability of an individual by itself. The factor of conversion is life intensity of an university student.

It means that we move from the model  $S = P + V$  (where studies are the sum of lectures and practical lessons or lab exercises) to the model described by Professor's equation  $S = z \cdot i^2$ . We are moving from mechanical sum of lectures and practical lessons to multiplier of knowledge and experience. The old model (sum) is mechanical approach, the new model (multiplier) is holistic, organic approach

The real issue being raised here is: Do we educate students for real life or for some form of quasi-life? Do we prepare them to swim in hotel pool or we prepare them to swim in fast mountain river? Current education system is preparing the students to swim in closed hotel pools with plastic sharks.

UDG is trying to prepare the students to swim in the wild mountain river. Swimming in the pool is completely safe with no risk and uncertainty. Swimming in wild mountain river is, on the other hand, very risky and uncertain.

What should we have as the product of our education programs?

- Graduate student - expert for uncertainty.
- The expert for making decision in the environment without complete information, the expert for quick decision making in permanently changing circumstances of global scene.

At UDG we want to "produce" these experts for uncertainty which is very difficult! Difficult! Difficult! Difficult! Extremely difficult!

The way of life and awaken energy is shaping the person. If someone spent 15-20 years of his life in the lifeless school, on classes which don't evoke passion and emotions - we are getting into bureaucratic society. Current education system is oriented to production of bureaucracy, politicians, state servants, etc. This system has no future. At UDG we are trying to leave this mainstream path! We want to find the niche of life! It is difficult! Difficult! Difficult! Extremely difficult!... However, someone has to try!

The paradigm is lying in the model represented through “Professor equation”  $S = z \cdot i^2$ . We neither know if this model will bring us to the final solution, nor I know what the final solution is! We act as researchers who walk along ice, frozen surface in order to reach hard land on the other side. However, doing so, you are never sure if the ice will broke and you’ll drown in the water. This is vector model, matrix model. How do we make this connection between knowledge and intensity of life in practice.

This is the beginning of the search for answer to the question: How will we educate a student of UDG who will have individual abilities, capacities and competence of an expert for uncertainty, once he/she graduates. It is difficult and sometimes seems impossible.

However I believe that only things that seems impossible can be make real. However we are following famous Einsten’s thought: ***Insanity: doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results***”. That’s why we at UDG try to organize things differently!

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# Globalization and »The Belt and Road« Initiative \*

Colleagues,

Dear guests and friends from China,

Dear Ambassador,

The topic of this year's conference of the Association of Economists and Managers of Montenegro has aroused great interest and amazement! The topic is unusual for such conferences. And therefore the questions: "Why this topic? .... What do we want with this topic? "...

These questions reminded me of, I believe so far the biggest international conference held in early 2000s: "Montenegro - micro-state", which was also organized by the Association of Economists and Managers of Montenegro and the ISSP, which was dedicated to reforms in Montenegro. The ideas of that conference were the basis of birth and development of economic sovereignty of Montenegro, which was the basis for renewing the political sovereignty of Montenegro in 2006!

Today's Forum is also a border stone! It should encourage our thinking toward a New Global Civilization and to prepare us for what is coming globally. And what is coming is logic of one world, that is a large convergence has already begun. Likewise, today's Forum should contribute to breaking the prejudice against civilizations outside the West, where we belong, about which little we know and about which we have higher ideological prejudice than we know about their history, culture, economy.

I was once asked by a group of students, "Professor, how would like to be remembered?"

"I want you to remember me as a lunatic who always bet on the future!"

I cannot predict the future prophetically, because it is impossible! But I make assessments and decisions based on information from the future ... A look at yourself from the future is called a vision ... Similarly to a Ship Captain who receives information from the lighthouse, where to pass with his ship in an hour or two! ... Information from the lighthouse are information from the future - on the configuration of the sea where the ship will sail in the near future ... the Captain who does not respect this information - will strand sooner or later. That's the way life is!

Also this Conference is dedicated to the future and information from the future.

But not the future of the state, alliance, institution - but the future of homo sapiens, i.e. human species! Each of us, every human being on the planet Earth should take responsibility for the fate of the human race, our descendants! The world has never been in such a mess, and at such a turning point, and as Japanese philosopher Kaku says - the largest historic responsibility for the fate of mankind stands before today's generation. This responsibility must be achieved through collaboration, cooperation, mutual understanding, in a world without borders, a world without divisions, a world

of peace. When our planet Earth is viewed from a satellite - you can't see borders, countries or divisions! Could this picture of the Mother Earth from a satellite be a reality on the planet Earth?

Despite all the weaknesses, the idea of the European Union has a noble idea, and it is precisely the elimination of borders, cooperation and the fight for peace. The ASEAN in Southeast Asia is similarly oriented: in this I see the future solution for world management globally. A nation-state created by the Peace of Westphalia in 1648, as an organizational concept which contributed to overcome old divisions to tribes and religious communities, clans and classes, has played a major role in the last 350 years. Today, in a time of convergence, according to Kishore Mahbubani, a professor from Singapore, a nation-state is increasingly losing the benefits it had. While the earlier nation-states were special ships at sea and often clashed, we are all in the same boat today. The fact that someone is trying to organize his cabin - will not save the global ship! Isn't the financial crisis of 2008 telling us that we are all in the same boat? That all 7 billion people were affected by the crisis? What to say about climate changes that do not know anything about state borders? ... I know that this is shocking for someone, especially for politicians, for whom there is only a time horizon from election to election, and who understand the whole world at the level of their rounds.

The reason for today's debate is the People's Republic of China "The Belt and Road Initiative". More will be said about it by our friends from China, especially His Excellency, very popular, engaged and respected Ambassador of China to Montenegro, Mr. Cui Zhiwei. I see this initiative as a new form of responsibility of China and countries included in this Initiative for a global development, as a path towards global growth in the aftermath of the financial crisis. Just to say that this Initiative includes 65 countries of Asia, Europe, and around 4.4 billion people (63%) and about 20,000 billion (30%) of GDP and that the Initiative is to be implemented by 2049. (data from 2013).

This initiative aims at more efficient use of the available space on the planet Earth! Traditional globalization started at sea and oceans, especially the Atlantic and the Pacific. The coastal parts were everywhere more developed than the inside, which was increasingly falling behind. Much space is empty! This Initiative spaciously rebalances the Planet and insists on inclusive (comprehensive) development both within one country and internationally. This Initiative also creates a new model of regional cooperation: it is a coalescence model, that is a model of organic networking, clustering. It is important to understand that the Initiative is based on the inclusiveness and openness. Likewise, it is also a horizontal cooperation, which is more efficient than establishing supra-national bodies and constructivist mechanisms at the national level. The basis of this cooperation is top down bottom up cooperation... The Initiative does not lie in, or not only in the state and national authorities but in individual companies, institutions, cities... This makes this Initiative democratic - it gives a chance to anyone who has an idea and sincere intention!

This Initiative has its roots in the distant past, the journeys of Marco Polo in the period 1271 - 1295. Marco Polo is from our neighboring country - Croatia! ... This was the famous Silk Road!

It can be said for “The Belt and Road Initiative”, that it is a New Silk Road. Only that now, China does not sell silk, but today’s “Made in China” could be recognized through infrastructure, roads, railways, ports, aviation, telecommunications, communication networks, as well as gas and oil pipelines, and more for good universities.

As the old Silk Road played a positive role in economic and trade cooperation, cultural exchange and national stability, this Initiative aims to achieve three common effects, that is to encourage trade cooperation, cultural exchange and national stability.

I don’t want to give detailed information and where “The Belt and Road” is stretching! You have a poster on the wall! I believe that this Initiative, in addition to economic, must include a cultural cooperation. Moreover, I believe that the current model of globalization based on economics as a global integration factor, encountered many limitations despite its huge success. The New Global Civilization, in my opinion, can be reached primarily through cooperation and understanding of culture. Precisely, culture will be the basis of the New Globalization. And this means that Global Civilization might rest only on understanding each other, understanding the system of values and moral principles of one we cooperate with. Understanding another’s culture, we better understand ours! Understanding each other - we better understand ourselves! Similarly, we will avoid the consequences of culture closeness, and that is ultimately a thinking that my culture is superior to others. Cultures are equal! Understanding cultures as equal - means that we accept the differences that exist among them. How to reach that “unity and diversity of cultures”? ... That is, how to avoid Huntington’s “clash of cultures”? This is, in my opinion, the key issue of a New Global Civilization, as well as this “The Belt and Road Initiative”.

How much do we in Montenegro know about Chinese culture? How much our friends from China know about our culture? Can we cooperate in the economic area and not to be familiar to some extent a culture of our economic partner? What is our experience in that, since we already have more Chinese colleagues in Montenegro? Perhaps we will hear more about it today! That is why I believe that we should strengthen cultural ties between Montenegro and the region with China, as the initiator of this idea. But also with other 64 countries, especially Central Asian, where life is boiling nowadays!... We, in Montenegro but also in the region, have to liberate ourselves of underestimating others because we are part of Western civilization, indeed of civilization which made a huge contribution to the development of mankind, a democratic - industrial model of social organization, made incredible scientific advances, civilization which first came to the Moon ... However, we know a little about the Chinese and generally the Pacific civilizations.

Ignorance always produces arrogance, intolerance, misunderstanding!

Indeed, we don’t know enough about the Chinese culture and we should understand this Initiative in the context of information that the Chinese civilization is the oldest civilization on the planet today, and that it has never been interrupted in the last 5,000 years, unlike all other civilizations, which either disappeared or were interrupted. And precisely that long-term vision, strategic approach is one of cultural features from which we in Montenegro could learn a lot. We should not forget that just in the period from the 10th to the 14th century, there was a close cooperation between Chinese and European culture. Many inventions from China came to Europe, for

example, gunpowder ... With the advent of the Ottoman Empire, the communication between the Chinese and European civilizations decreased... This Initiative has reopened those roads of civilizational cooperation. In this sense, as I said, cultural cooperation is important. It is good that China has Confucius institutes in most countries, including Montenegro, which spread knowledge about Chinese culture. Learning Chinese is growing. Our University - UDG had and still has the Chinese language courses, Chinese students attend our summer schools, Chinese students have practical training organized by the UDG, exchange of professors with several Chinese universities. On the other hand, our associates were already in China for several months, our students now in China for their PhD thesis, we expect a few more students to go to China this semester ... I point this out only for reasons to say that we, in terms of this cooperation neither had nor have any help from anyone else! We do it ourselves, on our initiative and, indeed, with the great help of the Ambassador! Therefore, the initiative within "The Belt and Road" is up to us, we shouldn't just wait for the initiative from the state.

I've been in China at their universities several times. They have something to learn from! Just to say that China invests a lot in education and education reform! China has 29 million students! And this is a number that is larger than the population of 23 members of the European Union. Only Italy, France, Germany, Spain and Poland have higher population ... This is a huge intellectual power, a creative force which seeks opportunities and living space. It is no wonder that China in 2050 will be by far the first economic power and have a current world's GDP.

As you can notice, the population is becoming increasingly important! Around 2100 - Nigeria will have more population than Europe which now has a population of about 700 million and an average age of 44! And it's no doubt that population will dictate much in the 21st century (Population Map)

I think that Montenegro should be involved in this Initiative from the very start. It's good that the Prime Minister of Montenegro, Duško Marković is with us today. The recognition to Montenegro is the fact that tomorrow and the day after tomorrow "16 + 1" conference is held. I do not want to draw! But our vision of including Montenegro in "The Belt and Road" Initiative would favor, among other things, the construction of infrastructure, and new railroads. For example, Nikšić - Sarajevo, but also a railway Mojkovac - Pljevlja - Prijepolje ... More major airports in the South and the North ... Extending the highway, new roads ... But there are scientific and technological parks and cooperation in the field of education!... Likewise, the number of Chinese tourists will greatly increase. Naturally, all this will encourage business cooperation, not only with countries that are included in "The Belt and Road" Initiative, but also with the countries of Europe and America. The more we expand the market - the faster Montenegro will develop ... We simply need to get rid of any isolation! We must do what is in the vital interests of Montenegro.

All this is difficult, there are a lot of risks. But a round-the- world trip begins with a single step.

# Culture and Education and „The Belt and Road Initiative” \*

How can we guide today's development based on the information from the future? That is the question for every country... That is the question for every university...

How to get information from the future?

Among other things, by studying the initiative of China: Belt and Road!

Frankly speaking, this initiative changes the world in the long run ... As Columbus changed the world by discovering America ...

Why do I think so?

Belt and Road is driving the process of development of the new civilization. New Society! New Paradigms of Development! New perceptions of the world! A new way of thinking!

The Belt and Road Initiative should not be understood as some instant program, as an administrative strategy, as a set of visible measures. Belt and Road is essentially what is least visible. The strength of the Initiative lies in the invisible processes of the rise of Asian mysticism and Western physicisism, in bridging the gap between rational, analytical thinking and the meditative experience of the mystical truth. Verner Heisenberg argued that the most fruitful progress occurs when two different directions of opinion are met<sup>1</sup>, as is the case with the “Belt and Road Initiative” ... Indeed, what can encourage the fusion of scientific and mystical thought, and what new ways of homo-sapiens development can we expect?

We, people from the West must realize that we have come to a crisis in all areas of life: social, moral, economic and spiritual... Niel Ferguson speak about the age of decadence... We live in the age of cultural imbalance in our thinking and feelings, in our system of values, in our social and political structures... It seems to me that the Chinese symbols Yang and Jin are extremely suitable for understanding this imbalance. The Western culture prefers Yang in relation to Yin; male values

compared to female values... As Fritjof Capra<sup>2</sup> pointed out, we put self-esteem ahead of adherence, analysis in front of synthesis, rational knowledge ahead of intuitive wisdom, science before religion, competition in front of cooperation... On the other side, as I experience China, the Chinese are a practical people with a very diverse social consciousness. Both Confucianism and Taoism have dealt with life in society, in human relations, in moral values and in power... But, this practicality is complemented by the mystical side of Chinese thought - rising above everyday life and attaining a high level of awareness ... The aspiration to wisdom, to the spiritual enlightening of Chinese people has always been attractive and respectable. Indeed, this blend of Western science and Chinese spirituality, spurred by the "Belt and Road" initiative, is one of the megatrends of the future development of the world.

Likewise, the "Belt and Road Initiative" for us Westerners also launches a different understanding of the times. In other words, it invisibly strengthens the importance of long term in our lives and in Western civilization. For us, the fact that Chinese civilization is continually evolving for 5000 years and impressive and educational... The dominance of short-run has long tradition in the Western world, but it was truly established by John Maynard Keynes, who said „In the long run we are all dead“ and introduced governance through short run policies, primarily economic (fiscal, monetary...) policies. How to behave according to the vision of a long-run in the time of rapid changes occurring in the information society can be understood from the „Chinese Bible“: „The Book of Changes“ (The Complete I Ching)<sup>3</sup> help us to follow the vision of long term in the time of fast changes which take place in information society... It is a book of ancient wisdom and a source of Chinese culture. The Chinese sages have realized that "there is a universal principle in the heavens and the earth that says that everything is always in the course of change... The key is that the individual understands the signs of change," because only then can he respond and adjust to the changes in the most appropriate way"... Do we really understand and pay attention to the long-run trends of change in the consumer society of the Western society today? Do we even think about the "philosophy of change"?

I repeat, this is a look at the „Belt and Road“ from a small country and from a small and young University. Our view emphasizes these invisible processes initiated by the "Belt and Road Initiative", which seems invisible for many; it emphasizes this blend of two different philosophies of understanding the world, as we believe that will lead to new events and inventions that will influence the further development of homo sapiens ...

How these invisible processes promoted through „The Belt and Road Initiative“ disperse through the space and time?

Are they dispersed through economy, exports and imports of goods and services, investments? Is it connecting through material, visible programs and measures? Certainly, material flows have an impact. However, our assumption is that culture and education are true transmitters of „The Belt and Road“ idea.

Culture and education are put ahead economy!?... Was it too much of an assumption? But, is “The Belt and Road Initiative” also courageous idea, which already involves 65% of world population from three continents? Does not this idea have a lot of risks: political, economic, safety, legal, moral...? All these risks are existing much more than we can understand them, and by taking responsibility for these risks, the Government of China proved that its sincerity and faith in this idea. The idea that, as it seems to us, is not selfish, as it was the ideas of colonialism of Great Britain from the 19th century or the USA in the 20th century, nor is a militant idea. It is the idea which enable all participants, including China to follow and protect their interests, but at the same time, through cooperation, they support other participant to achieve their goals. „The Belt and Road“ is founded on the idea of interconnecting and interpenetrating.

If this is the founding base of the Belt and Road, how can all of this be achieved? First of all, through understanding of cultures, their permeation and education of young people to be able to understand tradition of both their own and other participating countries in the „Belt and Road“. I think that culture, understood as the mutual understanding of people is the deepest foundation for the cooperation between countries and the development of globalization... As the wise, old saying points out „The relationship between countries lies in the friendship of people and friendship of people lies in the connectivity of their hearts“... In other words, the „Belt and Road Initiative“ is based on five factors of connectivity, as President Yi Jinping pointed out. One of these five factors is “strengthening cultural and people-to-people cooperation, achieving understanding among people”.<sup>4</sup>

My thesis is that we can reach new global civilization through cooperation and understanding of cultures, while the „clash of cultures“ would lead us to the disaster of homo-sapiens. Indeed, culture will be in the foundation of the new global civilization. This only means that global civilization can be leaned only on understanding of the other, on understanding the system of values and moral principles of the one we cooperate with. By understanding the culture of others we better understand our own culture... By better understanding of others, we better understand ourselves... At the same time we will avoid the potential consequences of closed culture which can be understood as the belief that our culture was superior to other cultures. Cultures are equal... Understanding culture as equal means that we accept the differences that exist between them... How can we reach this „unity of diversity of culture“... So, how can we avoid Huntington „clash of civilizations“?<sup>5</sup> In my opinion, it is the key issue of the new global civilization, as

well as the „Belt and Road Initiative“! I fully agree with professor Chen Shenglai from Shanghai Academy of Sciences and Arts who says: „The position of a big country should be maintained in four ways: a military foundation, a political foundation, a cultural foundation and an economic foundation. Without cultural soft power, the other foundations will collapse“... Indeed, GDP (economy) can not tell us much about e.g. the quality of education, the health of children, their joy in the game... It does not include the beauty of individual, nature, people... GDP does not measure our courage, our curiosity, our wisdom, our potential... It measures everything, but what makes our life worthwhile...

The GDP figures of China can tell us everything about China, but not why the Chinese are proud of the fact that they are Chinese ... The same holds true for the others, and small nations... Indeed, the data on the GDP of Montenegro can not make us conclude that the Montenegrins are one of the most hospitable people in the world ... Therefore, China and all countries of the Belt and Road should invest in SOFT POWER, because “soft power reflects the cultural capability and creativity of a country”. I think every country, including China, should think about how to overcome the cultural trade deficit (“importing” cultures from other countries), even more than about economic deficits. How to “sell” your cultural heritage and how to increase “soft power” - this is for China and other countries of „The Belt and Road“ the long-term issue.

How to develop your own culture and how to understand the culture of neighbors, the culture of other people?

In my opinion, education plays a key role in this.

Does today’s education fulfill this role? How many students today learn not only about the culture of other nations, but also about their own? It is not necessary to repeat that education is in crisis, especially university education... I would just stress that today’s education is too specialized oriented, that a whole has been lost: the goal of the university is more and more learning, rather than understanding the facts learned by students. Universities force students to accumulate as much knowledge as possible, assuming that a greater amount of knowledge leads to a higher quality of knowledge ... Perhaps in the industrial society, which is static, closed and material society it is true to some extent ... However, in the information society, this is not true... In the time of rapid changes, uncertainty and openness, which characterize information society, knowledge becomes dependent on the student’s being ( $Z = f(B)$ ) – it depends on the value system of the student, his complex view of the world, openness of mind, curiosity, critical thinking, humanity... Does today’s university need to produce highly-specialized experts or citizens for a new global era? Confucius and Aristotle, more than two thousand years ago, emphasized that education aims at “culture and character” and the development of virtues of a student... The question that is raised today is “What must a young person learn in order to lead a responsible life in this century? How do we ensure that they actually

live what Socrates called the “examined life”, thingingly critical about their own values, and at the same time have the opportunity for an active life?

The role of the university is, above all, that a student learns **from the world, not about** the world around him, to learn **from** life, **from** his own experience, **from** his own feelings, **not** to learn **about** life, about other experiences ...

I think that education is not treated properly in „The Belt and Road“, current cooperation within 16+1 cooperation is just an extension of the current model of education, that is, an attempt to establish cooperation on the same concept of education ... It is dangerous for “Belt and Road Initiative “... All visible goals of the Belt and Road – economic, political and infrastructural must be based on a new concept of education - liberal education, education that understands the holity of life, based on process thinking, critical thinking, on the attributes which are rich in human virtues ... On the characteristics of which were written by Confucius and Lao Ce ... How to do it - I do not have a general solution ... We are looking this solution at our University ...

Our University develops a model of studies:  $S = z \cdot i^2$ , where  $S$  is a student’s ability which is the product of  $z$  - knowledge (fact, definition) and  $i$  - the intensity of a student’s life during studies. The intensity of life can be understood as experience in the broadest sense. In other words,  $z$  is an investment in knowledge, and  $i$  is investment in a student’s Being. As in Einstein’s equation  $E = m \cdot c^2$ , where the speed ( $c$ ) converts the mass ( $m$ ) into energy, in our model the student’s experience (life) during studies, converts his knowledge into the ability to solve problems, to be creative, innovative, and entrepreneurial. Our experience shows that this model is highly demanding and requires, first of all, a new generation of professors, a generation of professors from the future... Marks’ question: “Who educates the educators” is becoming very important. One should never ask the question: “Who are the students?”, but “Who are the professors?” ... The professors are “shaping” the society, so they are much more important than politicians for developing the spirit of the state... And politicians were pupils or students of the professors ... These are long-term lessons in understanding the process in society ...

Having in mind the importance of education, I believe a debate on the concept and philosophy of the education should be opened within 16+1; debate which would involve all the profiles of professionals, experts, poets, writers ... But it should exclude politicians and educational bureaucracy ... Education should be liberated from “bureaucratic fittings” and we must not allow that education becomes the tool of reproduction (retention) of today’s way of thinking.

I belong to people who do not believe in the future of a classical national state ... The truth, over the last 300 years, the nation-state has contributed to the development, but has exhausted its inward strength. In my opinion, despite all the weaknesses, the idea of the EU has a noble goal – to eliminate borders, strenghten cooperation and the struggle for peace. The ASEAN has similar orientation in Southeast Asia. In



this I see the future solution of the governance on a global scale. The national state created by the Westphalian Peace in 1648, as the organizational concept of society, has contributed to overcoming old divisions of tribes and religious communities, clans and classes ... Today, at the time of convergence, as Kishar Mahbubani, a Singapore professor says, the nation state is losing advantages it had. While the former national states were special ships at sea and often crashed, today we are all on the same boat ... The fact that somebody is trying to rearrange his cabin will not save a global ship. Didn't the crisis from 2008 confirm this, because it hit all 7 billion people on the Planet? What to say about climate changes which „disclaim“ state borders?

I know this is shocking for politicians, for whom there is only a time horizon from elections to elections, and who understand the whole at the level of their electoral circles in their national states ... In the Belt and Road initiative, I see that the role of national states must change, so as it can encourage convergence... We should not grieve about this change of place and the role of the national state, and raise political risk of the „Belt and Road Initiative“, this important civilization idea, in order to preserve it. We need to understand that the Chinese initiative „Belt and Road“ is changing the role of the nation state, but it has a very positive impact on the “national society” .... The „Belt and Road Initiative“ is acceptable to me because it “breaks” the present opinion that “the state is the owner of the society”... It breaks the opinion that everything depends on the nation-state... The „Belt and Road“ just provides the opportunity for every individual, company, city, region, independently take initiatives within the „Belt and Road“... For this very reason, I consider that the importance of culture is fundamental to the „Belt and Road“...

In short, I emphasized the importance of understanding the closeness and interpenetration of the mysticism of the East and the science of the West, and that culture, interpenetration of cultures, is the foundation of the „Belt and Road“. The key tool for this is education, and the carrier of this initiative is a society, that is, individuals, companies, cities, regions. The smaller the impact of bureaucrats and bureaucratic procedures - the „Belt and Road“ will make more success ...

How to make young people from the West, especially from the 16+1 countries, free from many prejudices when it comes to understanding China: its history, culture, religion, science? Perhaps it is one of the most influential prejudices that China will follow the Western model of development, and according to Fukuyama's statement from 1989 after the fall of the Berlin Wall that “the end of history” came. Does China bring Western universalism - the Western model of democracy into question? My opinion and experience, which is the result of many visits, cooperation and research about China is that China is a civilization for itself. I would not explain that in more details. I will just point out that the heart of the Western civilization is the nation-state state and the Westphalian organized political system, while the foundation of China lies in the thousand-year civilization. All China's better-known experts say China is a “civilization state” and not a “national state”. I understand that China

was based on the development of culture, Confucian and moral principles, and the foundation of the West lie in economy and science. Without deeper knowledge of Chinese culture, any country from 16+1, as well as the whole world, will not reach the maximum benefit from cooperation with China. That's why I insist on getting to know Chinese culture. Of course, China needs to learn about the culture of the 16+1 countries, which means that China must dominantly adapt to the world and not have an imperialist attitude – to adjust the world to itself. Viewed through the “glasses of history,” China is the only great force that in its culture, its history, has this approach to adapting to the world, not the other way around. In this I see the significance and perspective of the „Belt and Road“ idea.

Starting from these views, one young University in Montenegro - the University of Donja Gorica has started intensive cooperation with China, Chinese universities and companies. Our goal is very simple: to awaken students to feel the future megatrends of development that already shape the world in which they live and in which they will live in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The initial step in this is to make young people free from any ideologies. Ideology is the same as religion: it captures the mind, frames the view of the world, creates prejudices ... We did not have any kind of deideologization program at UDG. Simply, the Almanac of our studies is based on two myths: “Planet Earth is our mother”; “All the people on the planet are from Africa - we are all brothers!” ... Most of our students and professors and students has experience from the Western Europe and especially United States. Almost all of them studied or worked and lived there. We have introduced English as the official language of the University. If the vision of the development of our University is to create a globally responsible citizen, then this vision must be linked to the vision of global development ...

As a private university, we reacted more quickly to China's “arrival in the global scene”. We started with a series of lectures on China, first of all, about the economy of China... Soon we realized that without the knowledge of Chinese history, culture and philosophy, we can not understand the Chinese economy... Several students started working for graduate and master thesis on topic related to China, some of them are working on their PhD thesis about China... Thanks to the understanding of the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in Montenegro, especially the Ambassadors, HE. Cui Zhiwei, we have established cooperation with the universities from Sichuan, from Beijing and about 40 students are staying a semester or two in China. On the other hand, about 40 students from China came to Montenegro ... Do not forget, UDG is a University with 2,500 students. Also, we have opened cooperation with companies and banks from China and since this year our students have internship in China, for example, in SBRC, at the Sichuan Tianfu Bank .... On the other hand, already 10 students from China had 1-2 months internship in Montenegrin companies, organized by. Also, professors from China are visiting and teaching at UDG, as well as our professors who go to and teach at Chinese universities. UDG organized a major international conference on the topic “Globalization and the Belt and Road Initiative” in Cetinje, in September 2017. Conference had over

200 participants from all over the region and Eastern Europe, and we had about 60 participants from China. The keynote address was given by the Ambassador of China to Montenegro, HE Cui Zhiwei. Professors and businessmen from China were speakers at several panels. The conference had a great promotion in the region and significantly contributed to popularizing the “Belt and Road Initiative” and its idea... The conference served to establish new contacts with Chinese friends. The Chinese language is being taught at UDG for several years. From this year, the study program of Chinese studies will be established at the University, with the goal to give young people the chance to become more familiar with China, its history, culture, religion ...

At our University there is a project “Ideas and Character” – students get the topic which they research and work on during one semester, and present their results at the end of semester in the form of public presentation. Students are divided into small groups - 3-5 students and the final presentation is made in front of their colleagues - several hundred students and teaching staff. The audience has the right to ask questions and discuss at the end of presentation. The general topic of the project in the last semester was “China - History, Culture, Religion, Philosophy” ... About 1300 students were divided into 280 groups. The presentations took place in 5 Amphitheatres (study rooms) the „jury“ voted and appointed the winners in each Amphitheater... In the end, the winners of the Amphitheater competed in the final, with the presence of the Ambassador of the People’s Republic of China and representatives of all Chinese companies active in Montenegro. The winners received a reward from the Chinese Embassy, while each Chinese company provided internships for 2-4 students. In this way, we popularized China and increased the knowledge of our students about China, awakened their interest in that “far Asia”...

I want to emphasize that all these activities and other activities from our vision are carried out without any state aid, without any intervention by the state, with minimal bureaucratic procedures and without any financial assistance.

Why we invest so much in cooperation with China, and the „Belt and Road Initiative“!

I have already emphasized many issues we consider important, however I would like to point out several more things:

- a) China is an upcoming economic or political great power - around 2050 China will be the world’s first economy, with a GDP that will be equal to today’s GDP of the world economy;
- b) China is not a classical national state but a more “civilization state”. This facts break the opinion which is imposed to young people today that the “nation state” was from God and it will be eternal;

- c) It is also important for a student to realize that it is possible to have one country with multiple systems, to have “one country - two systems”. I see this as necessary mental assumption of young people to understand the importance of the region, to understand the differences between „systems“ in the regions, and to understand the upcoming organization of Europe as a “Europe-region-state”. It will be something similar to the current provinces-based organization of China;
- d) It is becoming increasingly clear that the world of 21<sup>st</sup> will be shaped not by the most developed countries, as in the 20<sup>th</sup> century, but by the countries which are in the process of rapid development ... Of course, China is one of the most developed, but we must not forget Brazil, South Africa, India, Nigeria ...
- e) If the West is synonymous for the development and fast developing processes, do not forget that China is west of the West! At the end, I think that understanding China, its history, culture, religion and philosophy will be one of the greatest challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. If so, why not prepare young people for it?

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# Tourism-led economic development model – challenges and threats \*

Colleagues,

Dear guests and friends,

This is 23rd Miločer Development Forum. The Association of Economists and Managers of Montenegro, which stems from the Association of Economists of Montenegro, founded in 1954, proudly emphasizes this tradition since it is in the field of economic discussions, if we exclude the “Christmas Discussions on Economy” which have entered into their 25th year and which are organized by the UDG Graduate Studies “Entrepreneurial Economics”, as the longest tradition not only in Montenegro, but in the region. Economic Thought in Montenegro is mostly recognized outside Montenegro through these institutions. Just these institutions have led to talks about Montenegrin School of Economics.

Choice of topics was always facing issues actual in the long-run, issues seeking for theoretical and practical understanding.

The topic of this year’s conference is “Tourism-led economic development model – challenges and threats”. The aim of a conference is to connect a Montenegrin tourism offer with the new demand and new challenges in tourism. This means that the topic is not academic but practical and philosophical.

As you can see from the Agenda, we here have participants from many countries. We wanted that domestic tourism workers have the opportunity to hear and to learn about the people and experiences from other countries, to encourage their further business connections ... Our goal is to encourage networking! Business networking... In a global world in which we live, it is important to have a so-called right to access to certain networks, have communication. Business is communication. Business is, above all, the exchange of information. We endeavored to have the representatives and experts from countries which are possible future tourism markets of Montenegro. Certainly, the Baltic and Central Asia are the ones... However, we believe that in the next few decades, the Chinese market, Chinese tourists will boom. As you know, the Association of Economists of Montenegro and the UDG organized last year at this Forum a major debate “Globalization and the Belt and Road Initiative”... More than 50 participants from China! The Chinese Ambassador to Montenegro Cui Zhiwei spoke at conference. Also this Conference was in a way a continuation of that discussion, continuation of introduction to the Belt and Road Initiative ... I will only repeat that the Belt and Road Initiative is going to change the world in this century, as Kristofer Columbus did by his discovery in the 15th century. H.E. Also this year, the Ambassador of the People’s Republic of China in Montenegro Liu Jin will speak at

the Forum, as well as the representatives of the largest Chinese tour operators and representatives of a very engaged institution in Montenegro, the Confucius Institute. I think people involved in tourism industry have to pay a lot more attention to the tourist boom which is coming from China, with no doubt that China has marked the 21st century. Of course, the people from the region are also here. Why have we connected people from the region and representatives of the tourism industry of China? ... Simply because of the fact that for a Chinese tourist there is no Montenegro, Serbia nor Croatia or Albania - there is a region... A Chinese tourist want to see, visit and experience as many destinations as possible ... I personally think that, if we want to increase the number of tourists from China, and not only from China, we have to liberate the Balkan bigotry and we have to especially simplify border crossing. What we have now is a Balkan exaggeration. To wait in queue for 3 hours, not to enter, but to get out of a country, is a killing of tourism ... If we want to be a serious tourist destination - we have to be conscious that we can only do this as a complete area of the Balkans.

Today in Montenegro you are of the opinion that a model of development based on services, primarily on tourism is wrong. You can often hear that we need to make industrialization, re-industrialization ... We must produce something ... And it stops there ... What industry do need to develop? Which production? Who should develop it? Where is the market for that industry? Of course, the Montenegrin market is small for survival of any industrial product. The word industry means mass production. Seeks a mass market. With which industry we can come out directly outside Montenegro? In which industrial area are we traditionally competitive? Where to find labor for that and such an industry? And many other questions ... I'm closer to the concept of re-industrialization, which is in function of the development and attractiveness, not tourism, but tourism product of Montenegro... And perhaps in the near future the IT product of Montenegro, which means fostering creativity, innovation, design, research, as well as artistic and sporting product of Montenegro ... Broadly speaking, products that can be sold on the market outside of Montenegro must have priority.

Gentlemen, we live in another time!

We live in a global world and not in a world of divided states and nation-states!

We live in the information civilization!

And this means that countries are not separate boats! We are all in the same boat!

This eventually means - if you produce a product which is not accepted on a wider, global market, your business will fail. Your position at work will fail ... Whether you produce meat, tomato, offer accommodation, educate students, work in the state administration, bank ... Competition for the UDG, which is a co-organizer of this gathering today, in 2030 will not be universities in Montenegro, but foreign ones.

We must be aware that the model of tourism development cannot be based on a constant, static demand, local or regional, but it's necessary to stimulate more demand from Europe but also from Asia, that is, China!

So a motto in Montenegro should not be we need production, but we need the market, investing in the market. Produce, and not have the market is crazy. Today only the broader market provides long-term development. National market in Montenegro is too small to build a long-term sustainable business! I'm talking here about logic, about philosophy, about the way of thinking, not on measures of economic policy and building of the system. Maybe this is strange for someone. As it was strange when I advocated and worked on the realization of the idea of introducing DEM/ EURO instead of a dinar in Montenegro.

Tourism in Montenegro has, compared with other countries, two important, expressed additional functions relating to:

- Widening of the market;
- Currency printing.

Tourism is widening of the market ... Widening of a domestic market. What does the fact that about one million tourists a year visit Montenegro mean for any production, any company in Montenegro? Tourists are the market while they are in Montenegro, and potentially when they return home. An example is the wine of the "Plantaže" company whose income is 90% generated from foreigners, the export ... In order to use tourism for market widening, it is necessary to understand that in tourism, as a comprehensive business, everything is connected with everything ... And what we need is more understanding of interconnectedness. That's why tourism policy's decisions are a part of a comprehensive system... But it seems to me that we are the victim of "the time of specialization," and that we forgot to think systematically, integrally. Decisions are often made in different areas, without perceiving layered, multiplicative effects on other areas. Particular dominates over general, a part over the whole... This is most precisely seen in the example of how many times our streets are being dug up: water, electricity, sewage, telephone network ... But, as in understanding of the information economics a famous physicist Fritjof Capra said, the properties of the part will be determined by the properties of the whole, not vice versa. If this approach applied in Montenegro, in the region, then the number and names of the ministries in the Government would be smaller and different... Wouldn't it be logical to have the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, and not, as we have now, two ministries = maybe they should be added sports ... The new, modern way of thinking, must be separated from observation of solid, stable structures and turn more to flexible processes .... We need networked thinking, thinking focused on the processes, that is the management needs to be based on networked connection, organic connection. The most prominent representative of the French enlightenment, Montaigne said: "A man who does not have a picture of the whole in his head cannot possibly arrange the pieces!" That is, it is impossible to put pieces together for the one who does not have the picture of the whole in his head! And tourism development cries out for that picture. At least it seems like that to me!

We in Montenegro already got used to EURO that we have forgotten that the EURO is not the currency of Montenegro. A few people ask themselves: whence the EURO in



my hand? I am not alluding to decisions of 1998, when we crazy bravely introduced DEM, nor to 2003, when we still crazier defended EURO from the Europeans, and I, as the “main culprit” was on the verge of a heart attack, and mostly because of those who today sing ode to euro, but to ask ourselves: who physically prints EURO in Montenegro? We do not have a printing house! We were once a part of Topčider - today we are not ... If we physically don't print it, such as, for example. the dinar is printed in Serbia, the kuna is printed in Croatia, the lek in Albania, etc., where euro banknotes come from, in physical form? If we do not print it - then it must be coming from outside of Montenegro (now neglect remittances of our workers from abroad - who are also an important source of printing EURO) ... EURO is printed by the product which was bought by a foreigner! In addition, every product purchased from a foreigner on the market outside Montenegro or in Montenegro itself, is a product which has withstood the criteria of the global market, global customer ... Tourism is export! Everything bough, eaten, drunk by a million of tourists is export, it is the euro which came to Montenegro from outside. Therefore, tourism is a printing house for euro in Montenegro. I don't want to talk now about the monetary side of the economic development of Montenegro ... There may be opportunities and needs to talk about that at one of the following Forums ... But it is undeniable that this criterion in Montenegro is not only being lost, but it was lost. This is very dangerous! Currency is not a technical issue. Currency is the DNA of an economy...

In order to be declared as a country and develop as a tourist one, we would have to take information from the future into account more. Every individual, companies, institutions, government must manage themselves today on the basis of information from the future. On the basis of what information the Captain steers the ship (slide: LIGHTHOUSE)? On the basis of what information a pilot flies a plane? On the basis of what information Messi scores a free kick goal? ... On the basis of information from the future! There are so many serious analysis of the future in terms of tourism development - that I don't dare to study them... I was also surprised during preparation of this Forum by the fact of how much literature with respect to this area, as well as researches have been developed. I told to the younger ones: establish the Institute for Tourism!

Among our participants there are speakers who will talk more about these trends in the world. I just draw your attention to the following three megatrends:

- Population map;
- The economic order in 2050;
- Number of inhabitants in the world in 2050.

How to prepare for the consequences of this development megatrends?

Three areas are very important for the further development of tourism:

- Eco-tourism;
- Cultural tourism;
- Human capital:

Eco-tourism – that is, a growing love of tourists for nature. It's not disputable that the Montenegrin mountains, gorges, lakes and rivers attract tourists. Flora, fauna, fishing, hunting ... Pristine nature is, and will increasingly be demanded by tourists, meaning that it has been preserved. Pure nature is the source of current and future income. However, you should be careful. You need to develop environmental awareness and environmental policies. Research shows that ecological awareness is at a high level ("you should take care of nature"), while the environmental behavior ("daily behavior") is at a very low level. We all notice environmental issues, both as tourists and as local population and we all, on the other hand, contribute to growing of environmental issues every day. In this context, we should understand a danger that tourism can destroy itself in the long run.

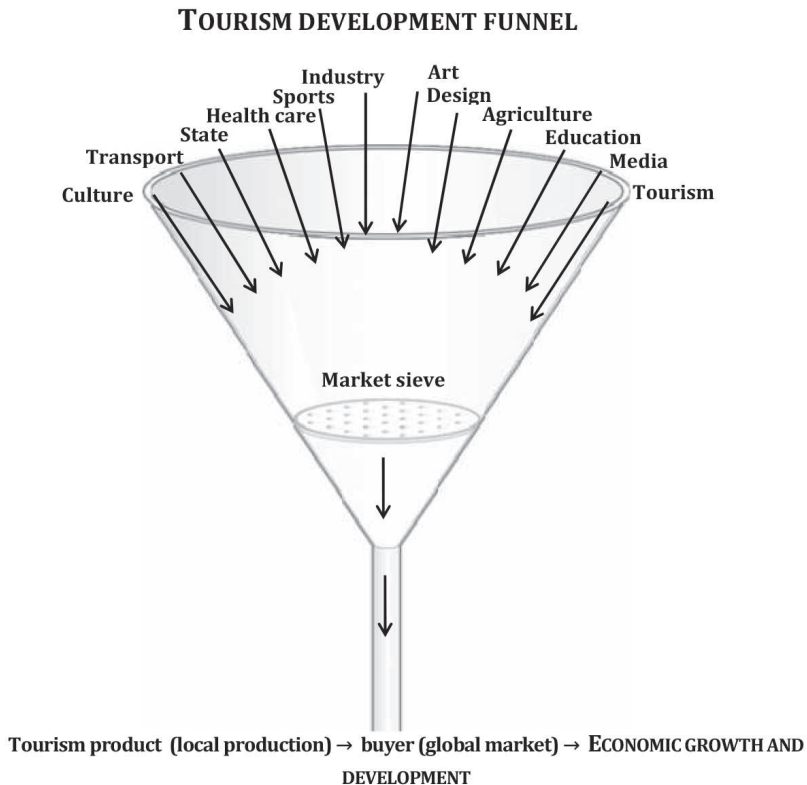
Tourism and culture is also an important determinant of understanding tourism as a part of economic development model. And not just economic. If Eco-tourism, conditionally, is the expression of attractive power of natural beauty and pristine nature, then cultural tourism is an expression of attractive power of our cultural heritage lasting for thousand years. With all respect we know a little, and even invest much less in cultural heritage and its attractiveness to tourists ... Investment in that side of tourism is not enough ... And it becomes a bigger motive for tourists to visit Montenegro ...

In order for this part of a tourism product to be even more important, we need people who know that. Not accustomed tourist guides, so-called cassette guides, but people who understand culture of time. Cultural heritage, ours, of Montenegro and the region, and certainly the cultural heritage of the countries from which the market comes... Do we in Montenegro, for example, have archaeology studies? Museum studies? Geology studies? Asian studies? European Cultural Studies? There is no money for this? Yes, there is! Do not fund study programs sought by many which you can provide a much cheaper in the market. The investment should be compared with income which returned by these professions later ... There are those who remember that, in the '80s of the last century, we had the Cultural Studies in Cetinje for a couple of years and then cancelled them... Now we have established cultural studies at the UDG. Great interest of young people ... These students in suits you see are a part of that UDG study program and the French University Vatel...

At the very end I would like to say that you should observe everything I said, not in the context of the old paradigm of understanding tourism - sun, beach, swimming, but in the context of a new tourism paradigm: tourism is the production ... Production of experience! Production of adventure! Production of fun and enjoyment for a tourist. Tourism is the production of new start-up companies and businesses... Tourism is a major production (printing house) of EURO! Tourism is the production of market for all Montenegrin products ... Why tourism is less production than tomato production? The question for us is: how to manage tourism as the production both of products and services? Because a produced tomato which tourists buy - is not a product of agriculture, but product of tourism!

We live not in the midst, as is often pointed out, of the fourth industrial revolution - we live in the midst of information revolution. Information technology is changing industry and industrial society, such as industry 5-6 centuries ago changed agriculture and agrarian society, and such as agriculture 10.000 years ago replaced hunting and gathering economy! We live at the beginning of the information society! The society that changes everything ... From changes in the family, changing role of the nation-states, to global governance ... These are not just phrases... Especially not for those who run their businesses on the basis of information from the future, and on the basis of information from the global scene. Thus, the old materialistic division to material production and non-productive services disappeared from the scene. Everything is production - provided that it has a market. First of all - a global market... Globalization today sucks or overlaps local markets... Also Montenegro should have and develop a model of development dictated by a global market: invest in those areas, develop production and services, required not only by the local market, but rather a global market. This applies to every individual, for each company, for each institution, for each state. Nothing is eternal in times of rapid changes, in time of great uncertainty and insecurity. The University I lead will have no future unless we are competitive in a global studies market.

At the end: all I've said can be displayed by this so-called "Tourism development funnel"!



The message of this funnel is: we are not talking about tourism as a special branch, but about a tourist product which integrates various branches, activities and operations:

Changes in tourism demand follows, especially the growth of the Chinese market;

We need to further invest in the tourism market because the market is the most important asset of an individual, a company, a state;

We need to rapidly reduce the expectations from the state, especially in business, since a nation-state today everywhere loses power (integration, internationalization, less money ...). The country is expected to do more than it could objectively give in the information society!

We in Montenegro should be aware of the fact that we are a small country, micro-states and that it is dangerous to imitate the great states!

Tourism is as especially important for Montenegro as the expansion of market for all products from Montenegro and for the production of Euro!

We need affirmation of network access and process thinking, domination of the whole, a complete picture of economic development!

Management of both tourism and life is made on the basis of information from the future and from a global market;

Production is everything which has a buyer in a wider global market;

Danger that tourism destroys tourism, environmental hazard;

Further computerization in the area of tourism, research and human resources especially in the fields of culture, history, anthropology.

Investing in learning foreign languages, especially Chinese (today's elementary school pupil should in his early age learn 4-6 foreign languages) and the perception that English is not a foreign language today!

That's all from me!

# China

## History, Culture, Religion, Science \*

### I. Why this topic?

China is upcoming economic and political superpower. In the near future (around 2050) China will be the first economy in the world, measured by GDP: around 60.000 billion dollars (approximately today's world GDP). The same year, the US GDP will be around 38.000 billion dollars. China is the oldest living continuous civilization in the world about 5,000 years old. Our civilization, the civilization of the West is counted from the year 1500 - that is, it is about 600 years old. It is wrong to think that our civilization is the direct successor of Greece and Rome!

Today, China is the most populous country in the world!

China achieves today's results in the political system which is totally different from Western democracy! Do the past, the present and the future of China impose an obligation to each student of the UDG to get better acquainted with its history, culture, religion, science, philosophy ... Is each of you students aware that China will directly or indirectly affect your lives during this century?

### II. Why this topic?

The UDG has established and establishes a very innovative and fruitful cooperation with Chinese universities in Chengdu, Beijing, Xidian ... As well as with Chinese companies! This cooperation began in November 2016, and three students from the UDG (for one semester) and one PhD student (12 months) are in China. From February to July 2018, 15 of our students will stay in China who were selected on the basis of public invitation. Therefore, students from all UDG faculties and from all years of studies are among them. Last year, the UDG hosted 8 Chinese students, and this year there will be 10 of them from Chengdu, and we expect confirmation of the number of Chinese students from Beijing ... Last summer, three Chinese students were on one-month practical training (internship) in Montenegro in three Montenegrin companies... This year, we also expect 5 to 7 Chinese students on internship in Montenegro, which is organized by the UDG ... Our negotiations with companies from Sichuan and Beijing are ongoing, as well as negotiations with investment funds and banks from Hong Kong for 1-2 months of internship for our students!... Reputation of the UDG rose sharply after our students won awards during their stay in China: Luka Laković won 18th place in the Business Ideas Competition (about

370,000 students' ideas from the whole of China and Asia participated) as well as Jovana Milović and Haris Bajramović who won first prize in the international design competition in Sichuan. Just through the project "Ideas and Character" every one of you has a possibility of staying in China or to apply for an internship in China. Naturally, a number of places is always limited and those who, through their work and dedication to studies at the UDG, are the best, that is, students responsible to themselves and their life will go!

### III. Why this topic?

Since last year we have introduced learning Chinese for all UDG students. The number is impressive, but I think still insufficient. Regardless of the fact that English is the official language of the UDG (the only university not only in Montenegro, but also in the region with this rule) and that about 1,200 UDG students attend a foreign language course either in our Center for foreign languages, either in other licensed language schools I am very dissatisfied with your attitude towards learning foreign languages. You need to be much more serious, more ambitious in learning foreign languages. Knowledge of English, no matter of how perfect it is, and for most of you it is not, **is not enough**, unless you want to be porters in the hotel, sellers of corn to tourists, street cleaners, etc... And really, **have you come to the UDG to be at the base or in a corner of life?** Aren't those of you ashamed of yourself? Such conditions, such an attitude towards students, such life studies (not "nerd ones"), such occasions, such a network ... And you are strutting like a peacock which waits for something to come, dream to do business like Bill Gates' in two or three months, ask your mother to give you two euros for going to the café, "scratch" from your aunt for the latest iPhone (and why do you need it) ... And when life narrows you down to the corner and you look at yourself when you are 30 or 30 or 35, then "Oh my God, mother what you did to me"! Or you will blame the UDG, some of professor at the UDG and the like. Basically, you won't admit your own mistake whose roots are deeper than today's! **Admit a mistake or not - you personally and your children will bear the consequences!** How will you respond tomorrow to your children when they ask you, "Why my friends live so comfortably and civilizationally, and we're so miserable?"? Be sure that your answer: "These are thieves, and we are honest people." will rather make them despise you not to respect you... **Today think how you will look your child in the eyes if you today, by your idleness and light-heartedness at the UDG destroy both your and his future.** You have to understand that you don't have primary responsibility and obligation for your parents. Your primary responsibility is for children you will have if the Almighty blesses you (and will bless you with at least three of them), and for their future... **By their willingness to pay for your studies (to most of you), your parents have fulfilled their obligation towards you.** You have to take your life into your own hands!

Without knowing at least 4-6 foreign languages, taking life into your own hands can be a problem! Don't think about languages from the perspective of a tourists! Think in the context of your professions and businesses, your income for life! Think of a

growing population on the planet - a global competition, especially for top-paying businesses!

Don't let "experts' talks", maybe your parents, neighbors, relatives' talks based on images of the past, drag you from your future. Images from the past are images of a closed society, society of fences, barrier from a foreign competition ... Globalization is inevitable, all boundaries are falling or are all more and more porous ... Only what is left are frontiers of knowledge!

I know that some of you is nodding your head! Thinks and gives provincial comments ... But believe me that my intention is sincere, and it comes from a great experience... Experience of "production" of successful students, people who have achieved and achieve a lot in life and whose children now mostly come to the UDG because of their experience on the studies I led... I started to learn from each student a long time ago! From each student, from the best and the worst one, the most responsible and the most irresponsible one, I also learned from a lazy and a hard-working one: learned their psychology, a way of thinking, and observed ambitions and talents... And the fact I love the most is that I, in dozens of cases, found the language and the agreement with the "failed students" and returned them to the path of success and pride ... You see, they are today thankful to me the most ... I commented on this because of comments of those ones who don't understand this seriously and comment on this provincially!

I repeat, in a global world, you will change your professions, your jobs, countries in which you will work and live! In order to have under control that contemporary culture born by globalization, 4-6 foreign languages is an obligation! "Listen, 4-6 foreign languages ... This man is ..." - I know you think so!... From such comments your indulgence insecurity, irresponsibility emanates ... You've been learning foreign languages since kindergarten, primary and secondary school - you've been learning foreign languages for 13 years, live in an atmosphere from bars to restaurants, the media, movies, songs ... where you listen foreign words! If I learned two languages in "that time", 4 - 6 languages are, how would you say, "easy" for you! I am telling you again, that a diploma of the UDG or of any university is in vain, unless you learn foreign languages. Look at yourself from, for example, your 50s, from 2050! Imagine that you could look at yourself from 2070. ... Around 2111 you'll be retired! ... At that time the world will more change than your body!

#### IV. Why this topic?

This topic itself is challenging! I think it gives ample opportunities for the creation, development of imagination, self-education, learning ... There are so many peculiarities in Chinese culture that I'm sure that you, who have been doing quite well in my classes in the last semester, will be even better this time! I hope you use this project to socialize, to learn **to work in a team!** **Team work!** **Team work!** **Team work!** In the survey conducted among 15,000 managers from all countries of the world, answer to the question which attribute is the most desired and valued on



students' resumes was: **"An ability to work in a team"**!... One of the secrets of Israel wonders is just teamwork! And this is achieved in a country where there are about 80 different nationalities, many religions ... I feel that socializing at the UDG improves - but it's not enough... Only when you **personally know about 500 students from the UDG** (different faculties), only then we can talk about having fun and friendship, and above all of **BUSINESS NETWORK OF UDG STUDENTS** between now and 2444! Business network works on the principle of integration! ... Believe me, one of the greatest benefits of studying at the UDG is our insistence on establishing the network! Of course, this network also includes students from foreign faculties you meet in various occasions... You who are now giggling and consider yourself to be above others because of a good car (someone else's!) you drive, will be the tiny ones when, in ten years' time, you see your colleagues that you now (maybe) disrespect driving cars better than yours, with the difference that you still drive someone else's (family) and old car, and he drives his own - bought by money he made... Never in life forget the lyrics of Ivan Gundulić (who is this?): "The Wheel of Fortune circling around, Does not stop in its revolutions: Who was up, is turned down, And who was down, is lifted up" ... That's life - when it's leading you, not you leading it! To be a team player, you have to be very professional, hard-working, entrepreneurial, honest, show solidarity, endeavor and inspiration! ... If you are not like that, the team will reject you ... Believe me, that time of "lonely riders" has long gone....

#### V. Why this topic?

The first teacher-less coding university was founded in France! This is a new wonder of the world!

"Ideas and Character" is just a germ of such University ... In other words, leaving the student more freedom to choose, to work in a team, to educate himself. Because, as Carnegie said (perhaps you've heard of Carnegie Foundation): **the best education is self-education!** Therefore, do not run away from obligations of your team. Take more initiative, be more curious, more solidary ... Otherwise, know that **you lose the golden time of your life!**

#### VI. Why this topic?

People from the Chinese Embassy headed by the Ambassador will be at the final presentation competition, as well as experts from Chinese companies from Montenegro and the region! We will invite some businessmen from Montenegro, as well as other foreign investors. The presence of professors and associates at the competition will be binding!

This is an opportunity to show up for yourself, an opportunity for every team and every member of the team to shine, to create a need for businessmen to ask for the UDG students more, although even now there is a high demand!

We all individually and we all together must invest in image, in the UDG brand. That brand already exists - but it must be constantly, every minute, increased and enriched, until at least 2444. ... After ...? Don't you feel happy and privileged to be able to create *a history of the future*?

### **VII. Why this topic?**

You've probably heard that China has launched the Initiative "16 + 1": The Belt and Road. This is the modern view of the travels of Marco Polo from Korcula, the Silk Road.

China is investing several hundred billion dollars in this initiative! We held a conference on that Initiative in Cetinje. There were a lot of students from the UDG! Of course, those who followed and were interested in what we are doing at the UDG! (They are also Christmas Discussions - and that's all because of you and the UDG image! But many of you were not there. If you really think that you can win the life marathon while sitting, if you have no ideas, no character - **leave the UDG!**).

UDG has been involved in the Initiative „16+1“, “Belt and Road Initiative“!

This Initiative also provides you with new opportunities in the near future! **Do you have ideas and character that to see them now and take advantage of them tomorrow?**

### **VIII. Why this topic?**

All we learned about Greek philosophers, from Thales through Socrates, to Plato and Aristotle! ... This Greek philosophy, with Rome (law) and Jerusalem (faith) struck the foundations of Western civilization.

Did you know that Confucius, Lao Tzu, Buddha were “peers” of the Greek philosophers, and that they were the founders of the strongest and the oldest living civilization in the world - Chinese civilization? Isn't this awakening imagination and further ideas for unusual presentation of your team?

### **IX. Why this topic?**

By the year 1500, China was much more developed civilization than Europe! Inventions of gunpowder, printing, various tools were Chinese inventions and Europe later thought through it. Suddenly, China falls into underdevelopment! Development stops! Why?

Believe it or not (find in the literature), for a one-page of the text of Chinese hieroglyphics which read: “Deforestation and the production of wood to make boats is forbidden! “.

Ocean - the Pacific, was the link of China with the world for centuries ... After this ban, there were less ships ... China closes ... In the meantime, Europe found Ameri-

ca ... Opens ... the Mediterranean ... The European colonization, Africa, Asia, South America ... is evolving ... Today? Europe closes ... Trump closes America ... China opens.... China is the holder of free global trade, rather than Europe and the US ... At first sight, how many paradoxes that can be “artistically” presented by your team!

If at that time deforestation in Montenegro was prohibited - we would understand today where the name “Montenegro” came from. And now - it’s just a nostalgic historical and imaginative turning to the distant past when the present mountains and hills overgrown by bushes, “that flow into the sea” were overgrown by high and thick black mountain (high pine forest) ... At least it was perceived like that from ships which were sailing in the Adriatic Sea!

#### **X. Why this topic?**

Because I feel that it will move all of you and I feel that all presentations will be at the level of imagination, ideas, work and knowledge suitable for a student of a *History of the future!*

*The Project which encompasses research, team work and team presentation in each semester. It means that each student, during his studies, participates six times in this project, presenting the idea for 6 times in the lecture hall before at least 300 attendees and before the jury the members of which make questions and evaluate his work, nothing that everyone in the hall may ask a question... The presentation and answering to questions last for about 30 minutes! On average, each cycle includes about 200-300 groups (each 5-7 members) ... Upon graduation students evaluate this project as the greatest innovation of the UDG and as very useful for business start of a student*



# Ideas and character: the exiting student's experience

## Introduction

Project „Ideas and character“ is surely one of **the biggest innovation** in study process of UDG. It is also evaluation of graduated UDG students. It is a unique project which does not exist on any other university, not just in Montenegro and the region, but wider. Every UDG student is obliged to participate in 6 cycles of this project – during every (6) semester of its Bachelor studies. Its importance for both, students and professors is immeasurable.

Primarily, **project awakens students!** It inspires them! It develops their imagination, encourages them to be brave and entrepreneurs... Moreover, it affects the **development of team work** among students, which is highly demanded in today's informatics society! All of the world polls with managers and employers state that the first thing which is expected from graduated students today is capability to work in team. Additionally, this project develops **friendship among students** and therefore sets the ground for business network of our graduated students. This project is very important for development of **erudition and communication capabilities** of students, to overcome **the fear of public speech** in front of the big auditorium.

This project promotes education, namely **studies through play**. Students **play with ideas, creations**, they are producers, designers, scenario makers, speakers, heroes and fighters, and have so many other rolls... Besides that, the project promotes **research component**, i.e. research orientation of students: student should gather a lot of information, to acquire knowledge, in order to prepare its presentation for competition.

People who have a vision of classical development of university find this project very strange! This especially relates to older people. We often forget that today's young generation – **generation "I"** is completely different. It is a normal occurrence, given that even the spirit of time has changed! UDG is known as the University which respects psycho-philosophical features of today's generation, their needs and wants, their perceptions, understanding of life... UDG invests a lot in personality, character, system of values of students, in their communication and creative skills. UDG is set on pillars that quality and usability of students' knowledge depends on the level of development of its personality, its character, its way of thinking... That is why we have one very positive and enthusiastic atmosphere at UDG, atmosphere full of energy, which is something which every visitor of UDG notices!

The project is continuously being developed because we are aware of its power and importance for development of **Being** of each of our students.



The project gathers all the students of Bachelor studies of UDG. As such, and based on principles of Almanac of studies UDG and premises of “Professor’s equation”, the goal of the project is to:

- Foster students’ innovation, creativity and imagination
- Enable students to work in group (fostering friendship, solidarity and cooperation)
- Release them of the fear of public speaking (“eliminating stage fright and insecurities”)
- Enhancing the vocabulary of students
- Education



# Project: Ideas and Character

## Conceptual framework

1. The core principals of the project “Ideas and character” are set by Rector of UDG, Prof Veselin Vukotic, Phd.
2. The project is being realized since 2007, when the first generation of Faculty of International Economics, Finance and Business enrolled at UDG. Shortly after that it was implemented in study program of other Faculty units. Graduated UDG students find this project as one of the best UDG innovations, since it was very useful for them both in life and in their professional careers.
3. During the studies, six (6) presentations are held within this project (one per semester).
4. Presentations are prepared in small groups of students (each group must have maximum seven members)!
5. The group must present its work as a team.
6. The aim of the project is given by its name:
  - Ideas – project develops individual creativity of participants and it motivates student to be innovative within the team.
  - Character – building the competences of each student<sup>1</sup> and preparing students for public speaking and presentations.
7. Project is the product of the conceptual framework of studying at UDG – studying is based on “Professor’s Equation” which does not only include memorizing formulas and theory, but is also seen as a way to
8. Presentations on certain subjects are held each semester. They concern different areas (Freedom, Entrepreneurship, Philosophy, Physics and Technology, Art and Religion) which are found to be very important for development of the character of the student.
9. The main assumption of the project is to build character of students, opening their minds and overcoming prejudices.

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<sup>1</sup> Competence of the student represents:

- The system of values, the way of thinking, motivation, attitude and all other components that aim at “using personal resources”;
- Student’s ability to get himself/herself better, its competences and talents;
- Competence regards the willingness and curiosity of student to learn and create.

10. The aforementioned six areas enable students to enhance his/her general knowledge and motivate him/her to think more and find interdependence between all scientific areas (which contributes to the concept of interdisciplinary studies) and enhance their curiosity.
11. It is found that remembering the facts without being curious about them has very bad consequences on the character and the competences of students. "So many educated people – not do many wise ones." (Russian proverb) "So many graduated students – not so many students with competences." (Montenegrin reality)
12. Erudition – intellectual curiosity driven by instinct. This term represents the open mind and this kind of curiosity inspires individuals to question other people's theories. The student with developed erudition takes nothing for granted. Erudition sets the groundwork for studying based on associative thinking and methodological understanding of reality. It sets the base for overcoming the prejudices built by dogmas and superficial understanding of reality.
13. How to overcome the fear of other people's judgments and open the mind in a small and closed country, such as Montenegro? Building a strong character, self-confidence, awakening the creation and ideas, motivating individuals to be entrepreneurial and innovative are the key components of each individual's development. Freedom is not an abstract term! It is a way of thinking and the state of our spirit!
14. How to avoid the overall hatred of abstract thinking? How to overcome prejudices? One must read a lot! One must read books, nice literature, fairytales! One must visit theaters, movies, forums and debates. One must not be shy to be spiritual!
15. Every student should ask himself/herself how to become attracted to professors, friends and mentors who motivate him/her to create new values, innovate and to be initiative?
16. Student must forget his/her ego! Bigger the ego, lesser the knowledge, and vice versa. Student must prepare himself for the global market and the global thinking and overcome the prejudice that he/she is the best!
17. It is of crucial value to understand the way of thinking, as well as the tradition of one country where they come from if they aim for the top! Therefore, UDG students must read some of the authors who explained properly Montenegrin tradition – Milovan Djilas, Jovan Cvijic, etc.
18. How to become really brave as students are in their dreams – in front of the world, and not just in front of the closest friends, family, country? How to become globally brave for any aspect of life?

19. How to achieve the level of development of the same generation of students in Australia, USA, and Western Europe? One must question his/her ability to be competitive at the global market and be distinguished among others.
20. How to present in public, ask questions in front of numerous group of people (300, 400) and not be afraid? These are all the situations which are realistic. The Idea and Character project prepares students for reality.
21. Students must develop the “sense for the future”! How to build a sense for the vision of himself in a future? That is the core of the project.
22. Students must understand that time goes by very fast! Already spent time cannot be repaired. One must carefully organize his/her time to spend it as effective as possible, if he/she wants to succeed in life.
23. Students must become aware that we do not live in ideal world! We all have faults, we have all made mistakes more than once in our lifetime. Students must accept differences between people, and that is what this project is based on. Building non-judgmental individuals able to accept differences.
24. Project must prepare students for diversity of persons in the world. It prepares students for the group work. Since the group consists of different individuals, students are prepared to work in international groups with no prejudices on color of the skin, religion and race!
25. It is crucial to overcome the fear of unknown and be open to hear other people’s opinions. That is what the project “Ideas and character” aims for. The project prepares individuals to accept critiques on their work and theories, as well as to be aware of the blind supporters of their ideas.
26. The project aims at preparing students for life experiences. The main philosophy expected to be inherited by the student is not to do anything to others, what he/she would not like to be done to him.
27. Human being is a selfish creature, by its nature. Actually, based on this premise project aims at developing the state of mind of students which finds selfishness a virtue. The virtue of selfishness must be based on the so called “rational selfishness” – the freedom to do what he/she wants is limited by the freedom of other people
28. The project aims at strengthening the relationship between students at UDG. Students must be aware that networking starts from their birth, but professional networking starts at their studies! Not at the end, but the beginning!
29. How to overcome the bad habit of not knowing anything about the people students spend the most time with? How to learn to listen to others, not just to hear them? This is the goal of “Ideas and character”. Become aware of your environment and surrounding.



## **Project: Ideas and Character Implementation framework**

“Ideas and character” is obligatory part of studies at each UDG faculty unit on all levels of study at Bachelor studies. Within 2 study programs (Faculty for culture and tourism and Entrepreneurship, management and business), this project is evaluated with 2 ECTS credits, acting as one of the elective courses for students of this programs. There are 6 cycles of this project (within 6 semesters) which every UDG student is obliged to go through. The research and preparations for the final contest within project “Ideas and Character” last three months. Students are divided into groups of no more than 7 people with different backgrounds and diverse areas of study. They are presented a topic of semester (topic is the same for all levels of Bachelor studies), after which they are obliged to choose a leader of a group and present it to general coordinator of the project. Students are not allowed to choose their group members. Rather, groups are being selected randomly by the coordinator of the project and are announced at the same time as the topic. Upon the topic presentation and election of group leaders, students work on the project alone-with no help of other, elder colleagues, nor the help of professors and mentors. The final products of each cycle are group presentations which consist of different parts and ideas: parodies and comics on a given topic, artwork of students, song compositions, theatre plays etc.

The solemn “Ideas and character” contest is organized in amphitheatres at UDG, at the end of semester and usually during the weekend (when there are no classes). The jury is composed of professors, teaching assistants and experts from business (UDG alumni), who went through this project and are experienced to evaluate the group work within it. Each group has 25 minutes to present and defend their research: 15 minutes for presentation and 10 minutes for Q&A related to the topic. Every group member should be prepared to answer the questions, given that by the rules of the contest there is an equal chance for every group member to get a question. Aside the presenters, even the audience should be involved full time in the contest, as the other, non-performing groups (at that moment) are obliged to ask questions and discuss a certain topic. At the end of presentations, jury gives overall comments and announces the winner based on the votes of all jury members. Winners of the contest are awarded books, presents, additional points within a specific course, scholarships, etc.

## **Project: Ideas and Character winter semester 2017/18 “China: History, Culture, Religion, Science“**

In the last semester (winter semester 2017/18), **all faculty units of UDG** took part in this innovative project in total sum of **231 groups, around 1278 young** individuals. Besides students, 12 young teaching assistants and professors took part in the project (jury and coordinators) and helped in implementation of rules of the project.

All of the groups have shown a high level of professionalism and responsibility in approaching to this project, evaluating it as one of the best and most valuable parts of UDG studies helping them to develop both- on personal and professional level.

For the Final competition and presentations qualified 6 teams:

1. Chinese story, *Faculty for Applied Science, Psychology*
2. Differences are not obstacles, *Faculty for Food Technology, Food Safety and Ecology*
3. Fang Shui, *Faculty for International Economics, Finance and Business, 3<sup>rd</sup> year*
4. China and development, *Faculty for International Economics, Finance and Business, 2<sup>nd</sup> year*
5. A bite of Chinese culture, *Faculty for Polytechnics*
6. Yin and Yang story, *Faculty for Design and Multimedia*

Final competition and presentations attended H.E Cui Zhi Wei, Ambassador of PR China to Montenegro with his associates and representatives from Chinese companies and institutions that operates in Montenegro.

They presented special prizes from Chinese embassy, as well as of Chinese companies and some of winning groups will get the chance to visit China, to study there during one or two semesters or to do an internship in Chinese company or banks in China or worldwide in their branches and daughter companies.





Also, UDG in cooperation with Chinese Embassy published the book “Idea and Character Project”.

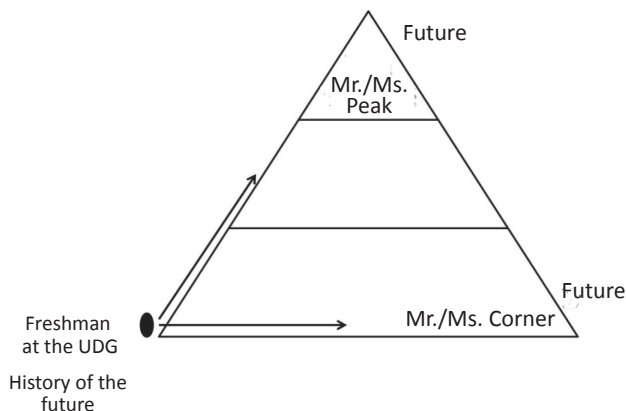

# Introductory words: Globalization and “The Belt and Road” Initiative

*Veselin Vukotić, PhD, Professor, the President of the Association of Economists and Managers of Montenegro*



Today’s Forum is a border stone! This Conference is dedicated to the future and information from the future.

It should encourage our thinking toward a New global civilization and to prepare us for what is coming globally. And what is coming is logic of one world, that is a large convergence has already begun. Likewise, today’s Forum should contribute to breaking

the prejudice against civilizations outside the West, where we belong, about which little we know and about which we have higher ideological prejudice than we know about their history, culture, economy.

The reason for today’s debate is the People’s Republic of China “The Belt and Road initiative”. I see this initiative as a new form of responsibility of China and countries included in this Initiative for a global development, as a path towards global growth in the aftermath of the financial crisis. Just to say that this Initiative includes 65 countries of Asia, Europe, and around 4.4 billion people (63%) and about 20,000 billion (30%) of GDP and that the Initiative is to be implemented by 2049. (data from 2013).

This initiative aims at more efficient use of the available space on the planet Earth! This Initiative spaciouly rebalances the Planet and insists on inclusive (comprehensive) development both within one country and internationally. This Initiative also creates a new model of regional cooperation: it is a coalescence model, that is a model of organic networking, clustering. It is important to understand that the Initiative is based on the inclusiveness and openness. Likewise, it is also a horizontal cooperation, which is more efficient than establishing supra-national bodies and constructivist mechanisms at the national level. The basis of this cooperation is top down bottom up cooperation... The Initiative does not lie in, or not only in the state and national authorities but in individual companies, institutions, cities... This makes this Initiative democratic - to anyone who has an idea and sincere intention it gives a chance!

For this initiative, “The Belt and Road” it can be said that this is the New Silk Road. Only that now, China does not sell silk, but today’s “Made in China” could be recognized through infrastructure, roads, railways, ports, aviation, telecommunications, communication networks, as well as gas and oil pipelines, and more for good universities.

As the old Silk Road played a positive role in economic and trade cooperation, cultural exchange and national stability, this Initiative aims to achieve three common effects, that is to encourage trade cooperation, cultural exchange and national stability.

How much do we in Montenegro know about Chinese culture? How much our friends from China know about our culture? Can we cooperate in the economic area and not to be familiar to some extent a culture of our economic partner? What is our experience in that, since we already have more Chinese colleagues in Montenegro? Perhaps we will hear more about it today! That is why I believe that we should strengthen cultural ties between Montenegro and the region with China, as the initiator of this idea. But also with other 64 countries, especially Central Asian, where life is boiling nowadays!...

Our University - the UDG has already had and has Chinese language courses, Chinese students at our summer schools, Chinese students practicing in our companies which is organized by the UDG, there is teacher exchange with a number of Chinese universities. On the other hand, our associates have also spent several months in China, our students getting their PhD in China, we expect a few more students go to China even this semester...

# Introductory words: Initiative “The Belt and Road” and Montenegro

*HE Cui Zhiwei, the Ambassador of the People’s Republic of China in Montenegro,*



It has been over 30 years since China started the process of reform and opening to the world, and the development and progress of the economy and society have achieved remarkable results. China has accounted for 14,9% of the global GDP in 2016 and achieved a contribution rate to a global economy of 34,7%, while those two parameters in 1978 amounted to

1,8% and 2,3%. Following the sustainable development of Chinese economy, these figures continue to grow constantly. As the second largest economy in the world, China and its development and destiny are indissolubly associated with the development and destiny of the whole world. China needs a peaceful and inclusive world, and the world needs a prosperous and stable China.

In recent years, due to the global economic crisis, the trend of anti-globalization has come to the fore. On this occasion, China, starting from its own development and experience, as well as the general trend of the development of mankind, proposed the Global Governance Programme. The Belt and Road Initiative wants to break the world economic route, in order to achieve rational allocation of resources and markets globally. It brings a new vitality and strength in the sustainable development of the global economy and society and represents an ambitious practice of joint development and realization of mutual and multiple benefits. It can be said that the Belt and Road initiative and the concept of globalization are corresponding, and it can in an even better manner demonstrate the positive effects of globalization.

Montenegro, together with other 16 countries of Central and Eastern Europe, is on the “Maritime Silk Road”. Since the beginning of the functioning of this mechanism, Montenegro has been the one of the most active participating countries, while with the larger interleaving mechanism “16 + 1” and the Belt and Road Initiative Montenegro, on the stage of international cooperation, will play an increasingly important role.

During the past four years, China has been guided by the principles of joint talks, joint construction and joint division, and actively implements the



“Raod and Belt Initiative with countries within it, building five “connectivities”, i.e. policy consultation, infrastructure connectivity, free trade, free circulation of local currencies and people-to-people connectivity.

40 years ago, miles apart Chinese citizens saw the magnificent bridge on Djurdjevic Tara for the first time in the movie and felt a great love of Montenegrin people for peace and a strong desire to preserve it. Today, the “Moračica” bridge on the highway Bar - Boljare rises over Montenegrin hills of and Montenegrin people can now feel a sincere desire of China for the common development. I believe that the bridge on Tara and the bridge “Moračica” are new bridges of friendship between China and Montenegro, the bridges of cooperation and that they will just as the ancient Silk Road connect and bring together the two countries and two nations, making them true friends and good partners!

## Panel 1: Education and Chinese Culture



Chinese companies are increasingly coming to Montenegro and invest in Montenegro. Bearing in mind our expectations that the number of companies and Chinese tourists will constantly grow, and bearing in mind that China is today the second and in 2030 it will be the leading economy in the world, we believed that we should organize a panel especially dedicated to education and Chinese culture.

Given the importance of this roundtable, the AEM Montenegro invited to the Forum those who can contribute to understanding of Chinese culture in Montenegro the most, and they are the most responsible people in Montenegrin primary and secondary education. We invited 110 principals of elementary and secondary schools in Montenegro. That means all secondary schools, all the city’s primary schools, and around fifteen schools from larger rural places. The costs are borne by the University of Donja Gorica.

Honorable panelists emphasized their views and prospective thinking in the filed addressed by this round table. Ms. Luo Chunxi presented Confucius Institute in Montenegro, its experience in so far work, their estimation of real interest of students and professors to learn Chinese language, and proposals for cooperation with UDG and AEM ME. Ms. Tamara Radinović expressed her, as well as UDG’s, attitude towards the Chinese language learning. She especially emphasized that a Chinese language teacher from

Xihua University was a guest teacher the whole semester at the UDG, and the obligation of all fellow workers at the UDG younger than 35 years to learn the Chinese language. **Ms. Fan Jia** presented her experience and view on Education and Chinese Culture, especially in the light of Chinese international cooperation. **Mr. Zhang Lian Cheng** presented his experience and view on Education and Chinese Culture, especially on international students studying in China, what are challenges and possibilities. Also, how Beijing Union University prepares and what are possibilities that BUU develops and offers for international students studying in China. **Ms. Milonjić and Mr. Bajramović** presented their experience of studying one semester at XIHUA University, Chengdu, while **Ms. Martić** pointed out that countries which made the most of benefits in cooperation with China were countries that had the biggest number of diplomats who fluently spoke Chinese language.

General message of the Panel 1 of the MDF confirms that precondition for greater and efficient economic cooperation would be acquainting to Chinese culture and Chinese language, which is the business language of future.

## Panel 2: Economic aspects of Belt and Road initiative



Belt and Road initiative is ambitious initiative and vision, which aims to stimulate and boost trade, build infrastructure, enhance the connectivity and cooperation among countries in Eurasian Area. But this initiative is not just about infrastructure and connectivity, but also about cultural exchange between people and organizations, based on people-to-people bonds, win-win results and mutual

trust. It is a great new cultural, economic and scientific platform, which will enable countries to exchange ideas and better learn about each other's culture and history.

**Ms. Xiaxi** presented view on Chinese economic policy, economic system in China. Also, she presented the roots of The Belt and Road Initiative, how it started, what are the aims of the B&R Initiative, and what are, in her view, the goals for Montenegro and the Western Balkan region. **Mr. Belan** stressed the importance of this Initiative for Montenegro, and how Montenegro institutionally and in terms of human resources prepares for this Initiative. **Mr. Igor Kilibarda** pointed out the Chinese investment overseas, especially putting the focus on the USA and certain sectors, the EU and cer-

tain sectors, our region (Serbia, Macedonia, Croatia, ...) and certain sectors. **Mr. Yan Gang** introduced the SRBG group and their interest in developing infrastructure in the region, and also their interest for projects and investment in tourism industry, while **Mr. Milutinović** introduces what his team of company Plantaže is doing in developing Chinese market in wine.

General message of the Panel 2 of the MDF was that many companies from both side, China and the region, are aware that The Belt and Road will initiate projects that will bring closer communication between companies and between people which will support mutually beneficial economic development more widely.

### Panel 3: “16+1 initiative” in Tourism



Philosophy of the Belt Road Initiative, realized through linking the vision of common interest, strengthening cooperation, promoting the development of economic integration of the Eurasian continent implies the construction of an infrastructure network linking Asia and Europe along the ancient trade routes. In addition, the 16 + 1 mechanism, under the auspices of

this initiative, as an international platform for cooperation between China and the countries of Central and Eastern Europe, focuses on co-ordination of development strategies and relates to cooperation in the areas of investment, infrastructure, transport, science, education, culture, tourism with a view to providing a platform for accelerated growth and development.

The trend shows that international tourism continues to grow. Tourism is one of the three pillars on which the Montenegrin economy rests, and this is confirmed by numerous tourism infrastructure projects that have taken place in the last two decades. By following these trends, UDG, with its mission and dedication to educating the best staff, is supporting this area through collaboration with the Azmont Investments group and Vatel International School for Hospitality and Tourism Management from France.

Honorable panelists emphasized their views and prospective thinking in the filed addressed by this round table.

**Ms. Yan Xuyang** presented his view on the idea of tourism cooperation within “16+1 Initiative”, and the cultural aspects of tourism, as the 16+1 initiative will not only prepare for business but before that for mutual in-

roduction to culture and cultural cooperation of Chinese and Montenegrin people. **Ms. Jakšić Stojanović** addressed the current activity of the Mediterranean University in the area of tourism as well as the expectations of the future cooperation of Montenegrin institutions and Chinese partners in the area of tourism. **Ms. Fan Jia** focused on importance of introducing Montenegrin culture to Chinese people, as well as introducing Chinese culture to Montenegrin people. She addressed the current touristic trends in China as well. **Mr. Mauro Dujmović** emphasized the possibilities of joint projects between the region and Chinese partners. He especially addressed the importance of launching the Vatel International Hospitality School at UDG.

General message of the Panel 3 of the MDF ("**16+1 initiative**" in Tourism) confirms the fact that dialogue has already been started and that the results of it provide a solid basis for the continuation of the successful cooperation and the beginning of realization of concrete activities.

## **Panel 4 – What do we expect from Chinese investors and what are possible ways of financing investments in the framework of “The Belt and Road Initiative”?**



The aim of this panel is to offer, to maximum extent possible, certain ideas for the projects which would be funded from China, that is, to practically look for the model aimed at solving the issue of funding possible future investments in Montenegro. Practical side is very important, since one of the objections that can be heard is that the focus of Chinese investment is that they provide a loan

under favorable conditions and that their companies carry out projects - for example, the highway.

Perhaps borrowing, not only of Montenegro, represents a possible obstacle to the implementation of the Belt and Road Initiative. Does this model should be moved towards some other models which transfer the risk also to the Chinese companies - direct investments, joint ventures, concessions, a public-private partnership, i.e. investments through the capital market.

The infrastructure is not an objective, but a mean for further investments. With developed infrastructure, we can expect investments of large scale which is a key resource for the country's future in the context of tourism.

There are three broad forms of economic links between China and target countries: direct lending to governments mostly for infrastructure (roads, railways, ports, power plants, etc.), trade links (export – import) and direct investments. By far the most important form of economic links are direct investments, but Chinese direct investments in this region are not as large as many people have expected and there is a plenty of room for improvement here.

Typically, infrastructure projects are funded via direct government expenditure or/and through private public partnerships The "private" side is usually financed via syndicated loans, infrastructure bonds issuance, infrastructure development funds, direct equity stakes and increasingly through securitization of syndicated infra-loans.

The *One Belt One Road Initiative* is a great opportunity not only for the infrastructural development of our region but also for the development of the regional investment universe as financial instruments used to finance such projects are not present at our regional capital markets. This is in our view mainly due to the fact that up until now infrastructure investing was exclusively funded through public investing or closed public private partnerships and due to the fact that local financial institutions have limited abilities in absorbing big risks arising from national infrastructure projects to their portfolios.

## Panel 5 – Chinese Projects and Business cooperation in Montenegro and region – Practical Aspects



Montenegro is not on the direct route of the Belt and Road Initiative, but through unsustainable globalization, it is already in partnerships with China: on some significant infrastructure projects; in academic cooperation; in increased Chinese tourists' visits to Montenegro; opening of Chinese companies in Montenegro. In this regard, the presentations of the panelists were tailored.

Mr. Hei Shigiang, from CRBC Montenegro Branch, emphasized, by promoting the business of the company it represents, the projects that CRBC has in Montenegro and beyond. Ms. Lin Bin, Deputy Director-General of the CCPIT Beijing Sub-council commented on the activities that the CCPIT

implements, viewing the challenges and obstacles, as well as the possible solutions. Mr. Atanas Kočov, from Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, Skopje, Macedonia, talked about the project TIGER (Technology Innovation for Greater Economic Revitalization) and the cooperation that Macedonia is trying to forge with China. Mr. Veselin Kovačević, from largest subcontractor of CRBC in Montenegro – BEMAX, presented very informative video recordings of the site works from two locations: Highway Boljare Bar and wind-farm on Možura. Presentation was very informative and emphasizing the exceptional support to the CRBC. Ms. Ana Marojević, from FLY Montenegro company, gave an informative presentation from a view of a foreign promoter of the company and an emphasis on visa-free regime for Chinese tourists in Montenegro.

Comments from the audience came first from the representative of the Intellectual Property Office in Montenegro and tackled a concerned with the violation of intellectual property rights - by Chinese citizens. Further, student Polytechnic UDG asked Veselin Kovačević from BEMAX whether it is possible to do an internship in BEMAX. Veselin Kovačević answered that BEMAX supports and encourages the students of Civil Engineering and Architecture professions to do internship not only from the State, but also from the private University, so students of the Polytechnic of UDG are welcome for internship in BEMAX company. On this note, closing on the seemingly internal cooperation, but bearing in mind the internationalization of each every structural and civil engineering project in Montenegro, panel was concluded.

The Belt and Road Initiative is enormous, ambitious - and full of challenges, seen in the presentations of our panelists. The challenges are economic, financial, political, social, moral, and above all - cultural. Therefore, for long-term achievements of this gigantic enterprise, cooperation is needed, which, according to Chinese diplomats and other eminent foreign experts for relations with China, must take into account cultural differences and encourage the essential partnership of all participants in the project.

## **Traditional meeting: Mr. Duško Marković, Prime Minister of Montenegro**

**Moderator: Ms. Milica Vukotić,  
PhD, Dean of FIST and professor at UDG**

### **Topic: Montenegro and “The Belt and Road” Initiative**



The Prime Minister Markovic emphasized that it is both a pleasure and a privilege to participate at the Milocer Development Forum, and although it is the first time he participates at the Forum, he must emphasize that the Forum represents a professional and expert platform which helps Montenegro to recognize its priorities in a proper way, and to define its policies, in a clear and responsible way, within the framework of those priorities.

The Prime Minister added that he is grateful for the achievements of the Forum and the opportunities it gives the Government to make its policies more professional.

The Prime Minister sent the following message to the business community: “This is a government which does not see the business community, successful entrepreneurs and big companies as being those which robbed our system, as our criticism sees it, but creating a new value and new opportunities for the people. Therefore, in Montenegro, one who creates a new value is welcomed for Montenegro and has my personal support and the support from the entire Government.

During the conversation a lot of themes were opened, and we would like to highlight the following:

- The creation of the Eurasian continent and the free flow of goods, people and capital from Vladivostok to Lisbon.
- How to change the education of Montenegrin pupils and students in order to be more prepared for a situation that will arise on the world market as a result of greater economic cooperation between Europe and Asia.
- 16 + 1 initiative as an opportunity for increased presence of Chinese companies in Montenegro.
- Impact of the project “Belt and Road” on the security situation in Europe and Asia.

## Panel 6 – Education in China



Panel 6 was dedicated to young people, primarily to Montenegrin youth and UDG students, who got to know better conditions, education system and opportunities which arise from China, leading economy of the world. UDG has done a lot to establish co-operation with many universities and business sector from China and has already had experience with exchange of students and professors.

Additionally, all UDG professors and teaching assistants had to take a Chinese language course in order to prepare themselves for the future opportunities. Chinese language course was mandatory for all the academic staff younger than 40..

Panelists of this round table were **Ms. Zhang Yali**, CEO of “Kina Medika” and “International School of Montenegro”, **Mr. Zhang Lian Cheng**, Vice-President, Beijing Union University and **Mr. Luka Lakovic**, teaching assistant and UDG and UDG exchange student at Xihua University, Chengu, China. The main idea of the panel was to better understand Chinese culture, education system and to exchange experience and information on opportunities for young academics and students. Mr. Zhang Lian Cheng introduced the audience to Beijing Union University’s organization, its history and to its mobility programs which are organized. Strong focus of this university is put on mechanical sciences and development of ideas from this field. Ms. Zhang Yali, as a representative of business sector, has spoken about all the investment possibilities in Montenegro and about the projects which she is governing. Given the aforementioned, she highlighted what has been done so far by Kina Medika and International School of Montenegro in our country. “Kina Medika” also plans to provide internship opportunities for UDG students (Chinese traditional medicine and herbal medicine), so that students can be better prepared for the upcoming global changes and that is the way of cultural exchange. At the same time, they are willing to continue to play the role of “cultural envoy” to introduce beautiful Montenegro and the great people to the Chinese people. Additionally, Montenegro China International School is also an important project for promoting educational cooperation between China and Montenegro. Montenegro China International School is specifically targeting these countries in China Students, through a year of language training; give them the chance to study in Montenegro. She expressed hope that through trainings, these excellent Chi-



nese students will be able to pursue undergraduate or postgraduate studies at schools like UDG so that they can also become a bridge between Montenegro and China. **Mr. Luka Lakovic** talked about his student experience in China, talking about the similarities and differences between China and Montenegro, telling that the most fascinating thing about living in China was that “the night is precious time used to rest”.

## Panel 7 – “The Belt and Road” Initiative and EXPO 2017/2020

EXPO exhibitions are global events aimed at presenting ideas from the future through facilitation of public education, exchanging opinions and innovations, promoting progress and fostering co-operation. University of Donja Gorica have greatly recognized the importance of participating in such initiatives and events. The University of Donja Gorica was present at the world EXPO exhibitions in Shanghai and Milan held in 2010 and 2015. The University of Donja Gorica actively participated in the organization and realization of the specialized exhibition EXPO 2017 with the topic “Future of Energy” held in Astana, Kazakhstan. Professor Veselin Vukotić, Rector of the University of Donja Gorica, participated in the EXPO 2017 as a speaker and as a member of the Steering committee. The University of Donja Gorica is developing and offering a very diverse and dynamic portfolio of study programs, and under the same roof of the university research teams are ready to respond to the ideas and challenges brought by the future ahead. We especially recognize the importance of informatics and biotechnology, and are working on the development of interdisciplinarity both in education and in research work.



Ms. Maha Al Gargawi, a representative of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the United Arab Emirates, presented the EXPO 2020, the next world exhibition that will be hosted by Dubai. She provided details about the new EXPO facilities, EXPO 2020 organization, and ways to participate and get involved.



The panel discussion was also honored by the presence of a special guest, Ms. Sanja Damjanovic, the Minister of Science in the Government of Montenegro. Dr. Damjanovic presented her idea about the establishment of a regional research center and described options for implementing the project.

The conclusion of the panel was that the “Belt and Road” initiative and participation in EXPO events definitely open up opportunities that must not be ignored and which should be utilized in the best possible way.



## “一带一路”与黑山

### ——在Miločer发展论坛上的致辞

尊敬的\*\*\*，

尊敬的\*\*\*，

出席论坛的嘉宾们和朋友们，

大家上午好！

首先，对论坛主办方将今年论坛主题定为“全球化与‘一带一路’”表示赞赏。在整整四年前的2013年9月7日，中国国家主席习近平在访问哈萨克斯坦期间，首次提出共建“丝绸之路经济带”。同年10月，他又在印度尼西亚国会演讲期间提议共同建设21世纪“海上丝绸之路”，二者共同构成了“一带一路”倡议。

4年来，全球100多个国家和国际组织积极支持和参与“一带一路”建设，联合国大会、联合国安理会等重要决议也纳入“一带一路”建设内容。“一带一路”建设逐渐从理念转化为行动，从愿景转变为现实，建设成果丰硕。

中国实行改革开放30多年来，经济和社会发展与进步取得了世界瞩目的成绩。2016年中国已占全球GDP的14.9%，对全球经济贡献率为34.7%，而1978年则分别只占1.8%和2.3%。随着中国经济持续发展，这一数字还在不断更新。作为全球第二大经济体，中国的发展和命运已与世界的发展和命运紧紧联系在一起，中国需要一个和平包容的世界，世界也需要一个繁荣、稳定的中国。

近些年来，世界经济低迷不振，反全球化思潮暗流涌动。在此之际，中国从自身发展经验和人类发展大势出发，提出全球治理的中国方案。“一带一路”倡议，正是要打通世界经济航路，为实现全球范围内资源和市场合理配置，为全球经济和社会可持续发展注入新的生机与活力，是共同发展和实现“双赢”和“多赢”的宏大实践。可以说，“一带一路”倡议与全球化理念相通，能更好地释放全球化的正面效应。

包括黑山在内的中东欧16国都是“一带一路”沿线国家。近年来，随着“中国-中东欧16+1”合作机制框架内的项目不断在这一地区落地，为当地民众带来实实在在的好处，“16+1”合作机制也逐渐成为“一带一路”倡议融入欧洲经济圈的承接带。自机制建立之初，黑山就是该机制中最活跃的国家之一。而随着“16+1”与“一带一路”的深层次对接，黑山将在区域和国际合作的舞台上扮演着越来越重要的角色。

位于亚德里亚海之滨的黑山虽然与中国相聚遥远，但作为海上丝绸之路的重要结点，不论是积极参与“16+1”这一“一带一路”中东欧版框架内的各项活动，正在进行的以“南北高速公路”为代表的一批务实合作项目，还是今年五月在北京的“一带一路”国际合作高级别会议上与中方签署的共建“一带一路”谅解备忘录，都无不证明着黑山正在积极融入这一全球化倡议之中。

4年来，中国秉持着共商、共建、共享的原则，积极在政策沟通、设施联通、贸易畅通、资金融通和民心相通五个方面与沿线各国践行“一带一路”倡议。

而黑山的身影不时闪耀在这一全球化的舞台上。

在壮观的莫拉契察大桥建设工地上，中国路桥的建设者与黑山的同仁们共同为建设黑山南北高速公路辛劳工作，此项目也是利用中国优惠贷款在中东欧地区实现的最大的交通基础设施项目之一；中国为黑山建造的4艘现代化万吨货轮已成为黑山海运的中坚力量；此外，铁路、能源及港口等一批合作项目也还蓄势待发。中国和黑山两个位于欧亚大陆两端的国家，在新的丝绸之路路上，继续传承并谱写着友谊与合作的新篇章。

在“五通”当中，民心的相通是“一带一路”国际合作的重要基石和落脚点。人员往来多了，心才能被拉近。

沿着这条新的丝绸之路，最先来到黑山人民身边的是中国的中医药文化。近年来，中黑两国在中医药领域的务实合作不断深入，有着丰富诊疗经验的中国医生在黑山首家中国中医院服务当地病患。2016年底，中黑两国政府签署了关于中草药种植及加工的合作备忘录，并已开始切实推进该项目的实施。今年六月，中国国家中医药管理局向黑山中国中医药中心授牌。我们期待，这些中草药的嫩苗在中黑友谊的呵护下定会茁壮成长。

沿着这条新的丝绸之路，越来越多的黑山朋友正前往遥远的东方去看一看中国这个古老且现代现代的国度。近几年来，在中国政府为黑山等国家举办的援外培训班上，来自黑山经济、基础设施、医疗卫生、旅游、教育等各个领域的政府官员和专业人士共计500余人有机会在中国接受免费而专业的培

训。过去3年，中方为黑山提供的奖学金名额连年增多。今年，又有29名黑山学生获得中国政府奖学金的资助，走进复旦、上海交大、中央美院等中国的世界知名学府，与来自中国和世界的同龄人，共同汲取知识的力量。与此同时，中国留学生也已现身黑山，黑山的三所大学也都在中国拥有合作伙伴，两国高校师生的交流正日益密切。越来越多的黑山朋友们在波德戈里察的孔子学院体验着中国语言和文化的魅力。我们期待，他们在未来成为中黑友谊的桥梁和务实合作的栋梁。

沿着这条新的丝绸之路，越来越多的中国游客因向往黑山壮美的景色接踵而至。我在这里高兴地告诉大家，3天后的9月15日，北京至贝尔格莱德直航的首航班机，将搭载85名中国游客转道贝尔格莱德前往黑山进行为期6天的深度游，据悉，这条航线的开通将为黑山带来越来越多的中国游客。中国已成为世界最大的旅游客源市场，中国公民已成为出境旅游人均消费全球第一的旅游者。中国游客的到来对延长黑山旅游季节，改善就业状况，促进整个黑山旅游产业的发展将起到积极作用。黑山几个月前宣布的针对中国公民的签证便利化政策，正逐渐显现出实际效果。

各位朋友：

40年前，南斯拉夫电影《桥》曾风靡中国，至今，电影主题曲《啊！朋友再见》在中国仍家喻户晓。今年5月，中黑政府签署合作备忘录，中方将出资270万欧元用于改造修复这座位于塔拉峡谷连接中黑友谊的大桥。

截至目前，中国已累计向黑山提供无偿援助1500万欧元，项目覆盖基础设施、文化、教育、卫生、体育等众多涉及民生的领域，我们相信这些援助有助于不断深化和传承两国人民之间的传统友谊。

40年前，万里之外的中国人民通过电影第一次目睹了塔拉河谷大桥的壮美，感受到了黑山人民热爱和平的强烈愿望和维护和平的坚强意志；今天，南北高速公路上的莫拉契察大桥已巍然矗立于崇山峻岭间，黑山人民也已感受到中国与黑山共同发展的真诚意愿。我相信，塔拉河谷大桥和莫拉契察大桥必将成为中国和黑山之间新的友谊之桥、合作之桥，像古老的丝绸之路一样，将两国和两国人民紧紧联结在一起，成为天涯若比邻的好朋友、好伙伴！

朋友们，两天后规模盛大的“16+1”首都市长论坛及系列活动将在波德戈里察举办，而今天的论坛和两天后的盛会主题一致，相互呼应。时值金秋，是收获的季节。我相信，中黑人民的传统友谊会得到进一步加深，并收获更多的务实合作成果。

# Introductory words: Model of Economic Development Based on Tourism - Challenges and Threats

*Veselin Vukotić, PhD, Professor, the President of the Association of Economists and Managers of Montenegro*



Mr. Vukotić in Introductory address questioned the opinion that the model of development which is based on services, primarily on tourism, is wrong. When someone claims “we have to do industrialization, reindustrialization, we have to produce something” the question should be asked: What industry should we develop? What production? Who should develop it? Where is the market for this industry?

We live in another time! We live in a global world, not a world of divided and national states! We live in informatics civilization! It means that if one do not produce a product that accepts a wider, global market, ones business is ruined. So the motto in Montenegro should not be: we need production, but we need a market. To produce, and not have markets, is crazy. Only the market provides long-term development. That is the logic, the philosophy, the way of thinking.

Mr. Vukotić thinks that people in tourism need to pay more attention to the tourist boom coming from China, not doubting that China is already marking the 21st century. Tourism is the expansion of the market. The expansion of the domestic market. In order to use tourism to expand the market, it is necessary to understand that in tourism, as a comprehensive activity, everything is connected with everything and what we need is more understanding for interconnection. In addition, any product purchased from an alien, on a market outside Montenegro, or in Montenegro itself, is a product that has met the criteria of the global market. Tourism is export! Everything that buys, eats, drank, these million tourists is export, that is, the euro that has entered Montenegro outside, outside of Montenegro. So, the tourism is EURA printing house in Montenegro.

Every individual, company, institution, state must manage today on the basis of information from the future. The new tourist paradigm should be that tourism is the production. Production of experience! Production experience!

Production of entertainment and pleasure for a tourist. Tourism is the production of new start-up companies and businesses.

And Montenegro should also have to develop a model of development dictated by the global market: to invest in those areas, to develop production and services, which are sought not by the local market, but global market. This applies to every individual, for each company, for each institution, for each country.

## Panel 1 Montenegrin Cultural Heritage and Education for Tourism – Interaction with students

Moderator: Ms. Ines Pajovic, Faculty for Culture and tourism, UDG



Interdisciplinary studies that combine Culture and Tourism are giving results to the previous noticed need of workers in a field of Culture and Creative industries in the aspect of tourism as well.

Panelists emphasized their perspective as well as the current situation in the field of the preservation of cultural heritage, valorisation of it, and

education on the other side that will connect culture and tourism by respecting sustainable path of development and valorisation of cultural goods. Mr. **Aleksandar Dajkovic** emphasized the importance of a good management and policies that will regulate and well coordinate use of cultural goods. He also had a word about the termination of Faculty for Culture on Cetinje in 1980, which was the only educational institution in Montenegro whose domain was culture until Faculty for Culture and Tourism at UDG that started in 2014. Mr. **Branko Banovic** and Mr. **Filip Ivanovic** had a brief summary on the current situation in tourism, specifying especially „cultural tourists“ and their relation with cultural goods with impact of domestic inhabitants.

Also, in the Q and A session, panelists had opportunity to share their opinion and give few advices.

## Presentation of Chinese Culture and Chinese Philosophy – Confucius Institute

Representatives and professors of Confucius Institute presented Chinese Culture and Chinese Philosophy through traditional music, dance, cuisine and national costumes.



## Panel 2: Challenges and Threats of Economic Development Based on Tourism

**Moderator:** Mr. Petar Ivanović, PhD, President of the Committee on Tourism, Agriculture, Ecology and Spatial Planning, The Parliament of Montenegro.



**Mr. Ivanović** opened the panel with questions: What kind of tourism is needed for Montenegro? What kind of guests Montenegro want to attract and what is the offer to the guests? Can high-end tourism be developed without substantial investment in higher education? Is elite tourism possible without understanding cultural differences and their good

knowledge? Can tourism really be a driver of development without an entrepreneurial relationship to every problem? Is there a clear vision?

**Mr. Vlastimir Golubović** presented statistical data which confirms positive trends in tourism in Montenegro, such as revenues from tourism, number of tourists, number of nights, etc. He noticed that grey economy, infrastructure, structure of accommodation, noise and education system represent main barriers for faster development of tourism. **Professor Savić** is opposing to

development model based on tourism. He presented parallel data for Croatia and Montenegro that confirm strong seasonality effect. He claims that structural shift can't be based predominantly on tourism, as this activity does not have sufficient content of innovations, knowledge and high added value. A powerful shift (in economic growth and development) can come from industry with high content of added value that engage sophisticated knowledge and includes manufacturing and process innovations. Mr. Žarko Radulović thinks that the state does not understand entrepreneurs for the simple reason that civil servants have never made money on the market. Also, tourists in Montenegro are not brought by a state tourist organization, but by private hotel operators and agencies.

**Mr. Mohamed AbouArab** emphasized the impact of progress of Montenegro tourism on development, but vice versa as well. He challenged the tourism model of Montenegro and needs of developer of touristic towns. **Dr. Amaal Rezk** presented experience of Egypt in linking cultural heritage with tourism. History and culture represent important touristic niches. Mr. **Vojin Golubović** presented role of tourism in Montenegrin economy based on macro-economic model. Model enables future projections and represent a sophisticated tool for prognoses of trends in tourism.

## Traditional meeting: Mr. Ahmet Erentok, President of the Board, Azmont Investments

**Moderator: Ms. Ines Pajovic, Faculty for Culture and tourism, UDG**

In the traditional meeting the main topic was NATION BRANDING that was followed by next questions:



- WHAT IS NATION BRANDING?
- WHY DO WE NEED IT? / Why is branding important for a country?
- HOW DO WE / SHOULD WE DO IT?
- WHERE? NATIONALLY & INTERNATIONALLY
- WHO SHOULD PARTICIPATE?

Mr. Erentok emphasized the need of putting our focus on marketing, reputation with a self-analysis as a start point. What is very important is to define central idea for nation branding and to make difference between a national and nation branding. He added also that this process should be under state patronage and government execution, but still we are all in it.

At the end he used the opportunity to invite stakeholders as Aman and Porto Montenegro to join the initiative and support studies International Hospitality and Management at UDG, because they are the future generations that will have a special place in the long and hard process of NATION BRANDING.

### Panel 3: Chinese Market as a Challenge for Tourism in Montenegro and the Region

**Moderator:** *Mr. Zoran Đikanović*, PhD, CMA, FIEFB UDG



The topic implies not the usual treatment of tourism but critical thinking about tourism as an economic development challenge. If we want tourism to truly be a long-term tourism development accelerator in Montenegro and the region we should follow development megatrends dictated by the information economy with much more knowledge and skills.

What should be done to make Chinese tourists, who are increasingly mobile and able to pay, come to Montenegro and the region? What is done I regard to prepare staff for tourism in Montenegro and the region in this regard? What is it that the potentially biggest tourist market turns towards Montenegro? **Ms. Lin Yan** presented trends in Chinese touristic market, which is fast growing and very demanding. **Mr. Belan** pointed out that the former China National Tourism Administration made a projection that it is expected to transport 150 million Chinese tourists, who will spend 200 billion USD in the Belt and Road countries during the “13th Five-Year Plan” (2016-2020) period. In return, China will attract 85 million tourists from the Belt and Road countries to travel to China, bringing in about \$110 billion in tourism revenue. Do we need more figures to prove how Belt and Road will influence on Chinese and global tourism?

**Ms. Pindžo** explained policies in developing tourism in Serbia, which does not require visas for Chinese citizens and tourists. **Ms. Ana Marojević**, representing very successful company FLY Montenegro, explained on it own experience how they prepared touristic offer for Chinese tourists. Chinese tourists are very specific and demanding tourists. The local offer was in no way adapted to the needs of the Chinese market, we need to change the menu in restaurants, portions and way of serving. In China there are 8 different kitchens, so that China cannot be viewed as one market. Chinese guests

like to combine local and Chinese food, cook in rooms, and prefer rooms in hotels with separate beds. A lot of individual tourists usually travel by car. There are not enough signs on the road in English, and it would be ideal if the labels of major cities, places that are indispensable to Chinese guests like the Bridge at Tara, Kotor are done in Chinese. Also, the lack of wi-fi is noted, Chinese tourists like to take photo on the spot and to share their impressions with their followers through their most popular networks, such as Wechat and this is the best type of commercials of a destination. **Mr. Enver Mehmeti**, from Albania presented his company's experience in attracting tourists from China. The company is becoming an outstanding travel provider that could offer a full spectrum of travel services (incoming /outbound tours, flight tickets, accommodation services etc.) becoming a "one stop shop" for all travel demands despite the reason of traveling.

**Ms. Luo Chun Xia**, pointed to importance of Chinese-speaking staff who lived in China, understand Chinese culture and Chinese customs

General message of the Panel 3 of the MDF confirms that precondition for further development of tourism is in regional integration, greater and efficient regional economic cooperation, focused on attracting Chinese demand in tourism.

## H.E. Liu Jin, Ambassador of PR China to Montenegro

Tema: **The Belt and Road Initiative – in the Field of Tourism and Education**

Moderator: *Mr. Ivan Jovetić*, President of the Council RTCG, FSM UDG



Milocer Development Forum has hosted newly appointed Chinese ambassador H.E. Jiu Lin as his first conference participation after appointment. Prior to that H.E. Jiu Lin has visited UDG as one of his first activities in Montenegro.

Introductory words described H.E. previous diplomatic and public management experience as well as his first impressions regarding Montenegro. During his first days H.E. Lin has seen quite of cultural sites but also has visited Chinese companies active in Montenegro.

H.E. ambassador Lin agreed that *Belt and Road Initiative* can be identified as contribution to the new global civilization and its development especially as it covers almost 60% of the world's population and 30% of the world's GDP. He stressed that Chinese initiative is based on principles of voluntarism, cooperation and mutual exchange. It has some similarities with previous forms of cooperation and exploration done by great Chinese historical persons such as Ming dynasty members as well as admiral Zheng He. In addition, he stated that he believes that respective initiative provides chances for all involved parties. Having in mind it is voluntary based exchange platform it has certain advantages over bureaucratic cooperation models. As the key initiative's contribution can be identified cultural exchange, trade as well as national security. Moreover, it enables better understanding of cultures between involved parties.

An important part of the panel has been dedicated to Chinese education and entrepreneurial context and situation emphasizing Chinese universities and companies success. Panelist and moderator have agreed that a lot can be learned and applied from Chinese universities in the educational context. However, H.E. stressed that UDG also has substantial potential to provide impactful lessons for Chinese counterparts as well as others within and beyond Belt & Road Initiative. In addition, UDG's cooperation with Chinese business institutions and companies has been emphasized and stated as crucial and highly welcomed especially as it has been achieved without government support. H.E. Lin has had excellent impressions regarding UDG and its study



model and proved that visit to UDG as one of the post-appointment first wasn't by chance at all.

During the panel has also been emphasized that aside current economic and infrastructure cooperation with China there are numerous other options to explore and create viable economic cooperation. New infrastructure projects in particular airports, education and scientific parks as well as tourism might represent opportunities for collaboration with current initiative.

Having in mind presented data from CTA and Ctrip regarding Chinese travelers and their spending as well as increase of both indicators year to year it has been noted that increase of Chinese tourists' arrival to Montenegro can be expected. That is especially valid in the context of visa regime liberalization but also improvement of economic conditions. Based on that it is important to highlight H.E. Lin's belief that an average Chinese tourist prefers tourism of experience comparing plain access to natural heritage. In overall regard Montenegro has to be cautious to prevent overtourism and keep tourism as industry of chances rather than industry of endangered outcomes. Nevertheless, it has been concluded that tourism might represent significant form of cultural exchange model and better insight and economic cooperation which is the point of B&R initiative.

## Panel 4 – Montenegrin Tourism: A Look from the Future - New Ideas in Tourism

**Moderator:** Ms. Željka Radak Kukavičić, Director of National Tourism Organization of Montenegro



Some of the crucial questions we tried to answer during this panel were: which path we should take in order to ensure long-term positive trends, primarily in terms of tourism revenues and increase in spending per guest/day, and whether tourism is foundation of our future economic development.

Culture is a precondition for tourism development, and tourism is an efficient way to put culture to the best use. Culture is an important feature of any destination, and owing to tourism it is becoming a momentum of its social and economic development. Mr. Stefano Dominioni presented cultural routes of Europe, possibilities of putting them to the best use in economic terms and

the way in which Montenegro can bring its cultural heritage closer, first and foremost, to Europe and then to the rest of the world.

Mr. Đurišić, sales and marketing director at *Plantaže* enterprise, presented his vision from enterprise' s perspective and talked about how joining offers of big and small wine producers or coming up with a cultural event could serve as a tourism product.

Contemporary architecture and art are another important factor in tourism development. Mr. Mladen Krekić and Ms. Lagator Pejović talked about how architecture could arouse emotions, how an event could be created for guests and what could be a must see in Montenegro.

Applications, social media, virtual reality, video clips brought an end to the traditional ways of travelling. Digital marketing has considerably increased its share in creating destination demand, but we must not forget that we also have to use traditional ways, emphasised Mr. Zolak.

Analysis of trends in tourism sector, estimates and forecasts reveal that tourism is indeed one of the development branches that will determine the overall economic growth that Mr. Mirković talked about.

Indian minister of tourism said that people do not travel only for the purpose of travel, people wish to gain individual experience.

By developing special forms of tourism and using state-of-the-art technologies, we aim to create demand for our destination which will be attractive 365 days. This is not an easy task, but it is up to us to come up with and tell a unique story which will arouse special emotion and create unique experience so that tourists, once they leave our country, say they have to come back here or that they would like to stay another day.

## Traditional meeting: Mr. Duško Marković, Prime Minister of Montenegro

Moderator: Ms. Milica Vukotić, PhD, Dean of FIST and professor at UDG

Topic: **Model of Economic Development Based on Tourism -Challenges and Threats**



This year, our Prime Minister Marković, participated for the second time at the Milocer Development Forum and again emphasized a pleasure to participate and his opinion that the Forum represents a professional and expert platform which helps Montenegro to recognize its priorities in a proper way, and to define its policies, in a clear and responsible way, within the framework of those priorities. During the traditional

conversation with Ms. Milica Vukotić, Prime Minister highlighted that Montenegro is developing successfully and that he expects our country to be one of the most developed and most promising country in our region. During the conversation a lot of themes were opened, and we would like to highlight the following:

- One of the main conclusions was that the most important event in past year was The Summit of European Union and the countries of Western Balkans in Sofia, where it is hinted that EU will have new approach to the countries of the Western Balkans regarding economy and total development.
- When he was questioned about negative comments about Government's work, he said that he does not look at the negative comments, but that he is working on the affirmation of Montenegro through projects such as Porto Montenegro and the construction of the highway. Regarding the topic of the highway, he also said that Montenegro already sees economic benefits through a continuous GDP growth of 5-6%, which was a direct contribution of the construction, since 2015<sup>th</sup> year.
- Another very interesting topic was a potential negotiation about the sale of the national airline, "Montenegro airlines". The Prime Minister confirmed that one very serious European airline is interested in buying a 10 year concession. He emphasized following: "This is not the sale of a state resources, actually this represents its' valorization in the best way, where the state, using private money receives capital infrastructure that brings serious economic benefits."

## Panel 5 – Education for Tourism

**Moderator:** *Mr. Milorad Katnić*, PhD, SOGE Montenegro



The key issue discussed at the panel *Human Resources in Tourism* is: whether current human resources in tourism, as well as the current preparation of such resources (through schools, universities, companies) corresponds to the vision of the development of high-quality tourism in Montenegro.

Panelists pointed out that there is a gap between the rapid tourism development of Montenegro and plans for the development of new investments on the one hand and the lack of adequate human resources, as well as the preparation of such resources for the future time on the other side. However, it was stated that there are also positive examples. In this context, the VATEL program was presented (a French licensed school which is one of the most prestigious in the world) - it is realizing by the University of Donja Gorica in cooperation with Azmont. Over the past two years, over 100 students have begun a program of education and training for professional work in tourism at the international level. This year, a new third generation is enrolled, and at the same time we will get the first graduate students from this unique program.

It was concluded that the VATEL program is one of the most practical scientific methods for preparing HR staff for the strategy of high-quality tourism. This is an example of the practical implementation of the strategy for the development of high tourism as well as an example of the human resources' preparation for the long-term sustainability of the strategy. Panelists, representatives of companies that invest in tourist resorts in Montenegro, agreed that the VATEL program should be supported through the scholarships for students and thus invest in education of the qualitative human resources.

First of all, thanks to the nice words that was greeted with the big applause on the very well visited Promotion of UDG cooperation with Chinese Universities and Institutions.

The UDG Rector's Collegium decided to intensify cooperation with your University in the next semester and suggest:

## **1. Acceptance of 5-7 students from XIHUA for 1-semester of study at UDG with the coverage of tuition, food, accommodation and transportation to and from the University by UDG.**

UDG can organize on English language the following programs:

- Culture and tourism,
- Economy,
- Design,
- Information systems and technology.

They can follow the classes with our students, apply the same rules and receive a certificate of ECTS according to our accredited program.

In addition, they would be obliged to follow the program "Montenegrin language and culture for foreign students", which is specially scored.

As you know, the experience of your students at UDG Summer Schools as well as the Internship that UDG provides are very positive, so we hope that your students will be interested in studying at UDG during the next semester.

## **2. Acceptance of 5-7 students from UDG for 1-semester of study at XHU with the coverage of tuition, food, accommodation by XHU.**

**3. Two faculty members from XHU for academic exchange at UDG, during which the expenses occurred in Montenegro covered by UDG**

**AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION  
BETWEEN  
UNIVERSITY OF DONJIA GORICA  
AND  
BEIJING UNION UNIVERSITY**

University of Donjia Gorica (hereinafter referred to as UDG) and Beijing Union University (hereinafter referred to as BUU) enter into the Agreement of Cooperation to establish programs or projects of exchange and collaboration in areas of mutual interest and benefit and abide by this agreement.

**Article 1 Purposes of the Cooperation**

1. To promote the mutual cooperation in the teaching and research of the respective institutions;
2. To deepen the understanding of the economy, the culture, and the social environment of the respective institutions and countries.

**Article 2 Properties of the Agreement**

This agreement of cooperation is an umbrella agreement, and any other agreements regarding specific cooperation projects or programs to be signed between UDG and BUU shall be governed by this Agreement of Cooperation.

**Article 3 Scope of the Cooperation**

1. Joint research projects of mutual interest;
2. Exchange of faculty members and students;
3. Joint academic conferences, seminars, and symposiums;
4. Exchange of information on the research achievements, journals, and research papers of mutual interest;
5. Establishment of a Sino-Montenegro Tourism and Cultural Center;
6. Other cooperation projects or programs of mutual interest.

**Article 4 Coordination of Cooperative Projects**

UDG and BUU shall appoint a respective coordinator to supervise and facilitate



the implementation of this agreement.

**Article 5 Signing Other Agreements regarding Specific Cooperation Projects**

1. Any other agreement under this Agreement of Cooperation shall be reduced to writing and manually signed;
2. Any other agreement under this Agreement of Cooperation shall clarify the detailed responsibilities and duties both parties must undertake;
3. Any other agreement under this Agreement of Cooperation shall not become effective until it is signed by the legal representatives or the authorized representatives of both parties;
4. The signing and implementation of any other agreements under this Agreement of Cooperation are subject to the availability of funds at both institutions and/or to the amount of financial assistance obtained by either institution from its external sources.

**Article 6 Period of Validity of the Agreement**

1. The Agreement of Cooperation remains valid for five years starting from the date of signing by both parties;
2. The period of validity will be prolonged for three years automatically after it expires if both sides agree with each other to an extension.

**Article 7 Termination of the Agreement**

1. This agreement will be automatically terminated should both parties not agree to extend after the date of expiry;
2. This agreement will be terminated if it is cancelled. During the period of validity of the agreement, if one party wants to cancel the Agreement, it must inform the other party ninety days in advance of its cancellation and its reasons for the cancellation. Otherwise, the cancellation will not be acceptable or effective. The agreement will be terminated 90 days after the informed party has received the notification for canceling the agreement by the other party;
3. If there are students studying courses in the host university under this Agreement, an appropriate arrangement will be made to help these students complete their academic program of study in a seamless fashion.

**Article 8 Solutions to the Problems after the Termination of this Agreement**

1. No penalty shall be imposed on the party terminating this Agreement of Cooperation. After the termination of this agreement, either UDG or BUU will not be held responsible for the economic or other loss to each other caused by the termination.
2. Any disputes arising from any other specific agreements under this Agreement of Cooperation shall be settled according to the terms and conditions specified in the agreements concerned.

**Article 9 Languages of the Agreement**

The Agreement of Cooperation is made in an English version.

**Article 10 Holding of the Agreement**

This agreement shall be written in English in duplicate, and each party holds one copy.

**Article 11 Taking Effect of the Agreement**

The agreement will take effect once it is signed by the authorized representatives below from UDG and BUU.

By signing „16+1“ initiative both BUU and UDG has accepted responsibility towards Governments of PR China and Montenegro to contribute in realizing activities within The Belt and Road Initiative.

The UDG Rector’s Collegium decided to intensify cooperation with your University in the next semester and suggest:

**1. Acceptance of 5-7 students from BUU for 1-semester of study at UDG with the coverage of tuition, accommodation and transportation to and from the University by UDG.**

They can follow the classes with our students, apply the same rules and receive a certificate of ECTS according to our accredited program.

In addition, they would be obliged to follow the program “Montenegrin language and culture for foreign students”, which is specially scored.

As you know, the experience of your students at UDG is very positive, so we hope that your students will be interested in studying at UDG during the next semester.

  - b) Professor Zoran Đikanović, PhD, subject Money – history and ascent.
- 6. We invite your delegation headed by Mr. Han Xianzhou, Party Secretary, and you. All costs in Montenegro (several days) are borne by UDG.**
- 7. Is there a possibility for our professors to publish papers in one of your magazines that are on the ranking lists? The article will be sent to you in English and Chinese.**
- 8. We have the program, if you accept, to jointly issue the thematic number on “Tourism and Culture” of our magazine “Entrepreneurial Economy” which is accredited in the international database EBSCO and is published in English.**

At the same time, I am informing you that we are in the phase of realization of the study program "Chinese study" on UDG (languages, philosophy, culture, economy, ...) and we count on your help, but we would discuss this when the project is in the final phase and colleague Đikanović and I would come to Beijing to talk about it.

As you can see, we have a lot of space for cooperation that is already binding on us for the successful cooperation and friendship of the Chinese and Montenegrin people.

**Article 5**





### **V. Term and Termination**





Communication University of China, located in Beijing, China, and University of Donja Gorica, located in Podgorica, Montenegro

**Recognizing** their common interests in many academic and educational fields,

**Valuing** institutional cooperation, and

**Wanting** to promote such cooperation in a more structured fashion, and to develop and carry out collaborative activities

Agree as follows:

**I. Academic Exchange Program**

**1. Exchange of Faculty and Teaching Staff**

Communication University of China (CUC) may send teacher(s) to University of Donja Gorica (UDG) to attend advanced studies program. UDG may send staff members to CUC to study or conduct research. Both parties agree to mutually send professors to the other party for giving lectures. On the equal basis, some concrete operation details, such as the number of exchange teachers, the period of staying with the other party and treatment and so on will be discussed by the two parties before the exchange is conducted in the future.

**2. Exchange of Students**

In principle, CUC and UDG agree to mutually send students to study to the other party. On the equal basis, some concrete operation details, such as the number of exchange students, the period of staying with the other party and treatment and so on, will be discussed by the two parties before the exchange is conducted in the future.

**3. Academic Publication and Material Exchange**

The two institutions will exchange books and relevant academic materials (including textbooks) written by their professors, for teaching and translating, as resources permit. Each institution will respect the other's policies on copyright and intellectual property rights.

**4. Joint Academic Conferences**

Communication University of China and University of Donja Gorica will collaborate in

organization of conferences on issues of mutual concern and interest. Conferences will be held in either China or Montenegro, as agreed to by both institutions, and subject to securing the necessary financing or sponsorship, including via the collection of conference fees.

#### **5. Reciprocal Visits**

The leaders of two institutions, or other representatives, may visit the other institution at appropriate and agreed times for reviewing the exchange results and for promoting exchanges in new fields. The cost of such visits will be covered in a manner that is agreed to by both parties, in advance.

#### **II. Scheduling and Regulations Governing Visits**

In all cases of exchanges under this Agreement, the lectures, research workers and students concerned will be subject to the regulations and timetable of the University that they will visit.

#### **III. Modification and Termination of the Agreement**

This agreement may be modified at any time, subject to the approval of both parties. With respect to any proposal to modify the agreement, six months written notice shall be given to the other party.



#### **IV. Duration and Renewal of the Agreement**





The Southwestern University of Finance and Economics (SWUFE) located at 555, Liutai Avenue, Wenjiang, Chengdu, Sichuan, P.R.C., and University of Donja Gorica (UDG), located at Oktoih 1, 81000, Podgorica, Montenegro, based on the shared understanding that cooperation between both institutions will further research and other academic and cultural activities, do hereby resolve to execute this Memorandum Of Understanding (hereinafter: "MOU"), which shall be governed by the following terms and conditions:

### **SECTION 1- PURPOSE**

The SWUFE and University of Donja Gorica agree to promote collaborations between both institutions, in areas of common interests, by means of :

1. Exchange of researchers, faculty and staff members;
2. Exchange of students;
3. Joint development of research projects;



4. Joint organization of seminars and cultural events;
5. Exchange of information and resources;
6. Other agreed academic exchanges and cooperation programs.

#### **SECTION 2- STATUS AND IMPLEMENTATION**

Other than Section 5, this MOU is not intended to be and is not legally binding. If, as a result of further discussion, the parties agree to implement each or any of the specific cooperation activity set out at Section 5, both institutions shall prepare a work program describing the forms, the means and the perspective responsibilities, which shall thereupon be the object of a Specific Agreement, to be executed by the concerned parties.

#### **SECTION 3- FUNDING**

Each institution shall exert its best efforts to procure funding from internal or external sources, so as to ensure the feasibility of the cooperation programs.

#### **SECTION 4- REQUIREMENTS**

The scholars taking part in the cooperation programs under any Specific Agreement shall comply with the immigration requirements of the country of the host university, and shall contract an international medical and hospital insurance covering the stay abroad.

#### **SECTION 5- INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

Unless agreed otherwise in writing, any Intellectual Property Rights belonging to the parties, whether in existence at the date of this MOU or created during the course of it, shall belong to the respective parties. Intellectual Property Rights



with regard to the Specific Agreements shall be covered in writing through those agreements.

#### **SECTION 6- EFFECTIVE TERM**

This MOU shall become effective on the date of signatory by both sides and shall remain effective for a period of 5 years. Upon the completion of this term, the MOU may be reedited, upon the assent of both institutions.

#### **SECTION 7- AMENDMENTS**

Any changes to the terms and conditions of this MOU shall become effective by means of an Amendment mutually accepted by the signatory parties.

#### **SECTION 8- COORDINATION**

As coordinators for the MOU, the following are appointed:

on behalf of SWUFE: YANG Haiyang

on behalf of UDG: Zoran Djikanovic

#### **SECTION 9- CONFIDENTIALITY**

Neither party shall release any such confidential materials to third parties or use the mark or logo of the other party without the prior express written consent of the other, except as may be required by law.

#### **SECTION 10- TERMINATION**

This MOU may be terminated at any time, by either party, by means of a 6 months prior written termination notice. Where a Specific Agreement has been entered into by the parties, the termination of this MOU shall not affect that Specific Agreement.



## **SECTION 11- SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES**

In order to settle any disputes that may arise under the performance or in the construction of this MOU, the parties shall exert their best efforts to reach a solution by mutual consent. In the event such consent is found to be impossible, the parties shall jointly appoint a third party natural person, to act as mediator.

In the event of any dispute regarding the performance of University of Donja Gorica's obligations under this Agreement the governing law shall be Montenegro and the jurisdiction shall be the Montenegro courts. In the event of any dispute regarding the performance of SWUFE's obligations under this Agreement the governing law shall be the People's Republic of China and the jurisdiction shall be the Chinese Courts.

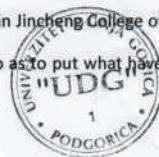
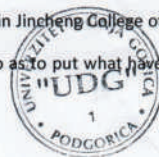

# Academic exchange with XIHUA

UDG and XIHUA University have developed extensive collaboration during last three years.

Most important part of that collaboration was academic exchange.

In 2017 and 2018 UDG and XIHUA realized four academic exchanges:

- A) UDG associates at XIHUA 2017
- B) XIHUA professors at UDG 2017
- C) UDG students at XIHUA 2018
- D) UDG associates at XIHUA 2018



## A) Academic exchange: UDG associates at XIHUA 2017, Chengdu, PR China

### Report on Academic exchange

In the summer semester in 2017, three associates from University of DonjaGorica had a chance to visit Xihua University in Chengdu, China through international student exchange program between Xihua University and University DonjaGorica:

- Ms. JovanaMilovic,
- Mr. Luka Lakovic, and
- Mr. HarisBajramovic.

Xihua University, located in Chengdu in the Sichuan province, is located on the property as large as average settlement of Podgorica (Masline, Tolosu, StariAerodrom...). There are more than 40 thousands students and about 10 thousand professors, parents and entire families living in the campus. It contains 7 teaching building, 22 faculties with 83 study programs and a library with more than 1.5 million of titles, 4 enormous canteens, 2 soccer fields (third is currently being built), around 40 basketball courts, hundreds of table tennis tables, closed stadium, two opened Olympic pools, elementary school and a lot more of administrative and helping objects.

JovanaMilovic, Luka Lakovic and HarisBajramovic stayed for four months in student campus and experienced the life of the Chinese students. All three of them came back with new knowledge and positive experiences. They learned that, similar to UDG, Xihua university works with the students in a similar way – it tries to equip students with practical knowledge and train them for work without overwhelming them with large portion of unnecessary data. Professors there are also encouraging students to work beside learning.

They had a chance to visit industrial product department and to meet students there. One of the main goals in this department is staying in touch with as many students possible after finishing the studies and helping them with starting the work. The best of them are offered to stay and work at University as lecturers.

One of the most interesting professors there was professor Meng, lecturer and a product designer. He has large success with his students – he built seven studios where he is hiring his students. Professor Meng teaches students the entire design process - from the scratch to the final product. This detailed process allows students to completely learn every segment of their future work.

It was especially interesting to meet students from the international club of Xihua University.





This is an organization counting around 200-250 students. They are constantly scheduling meetings, organizing movie nights, hangouts etc. all with the purpose of learning more about English language, international books, making friends etc. Almost all students in this organization speak English fluently which cannot be said about majority of Xihua University students. Jovana, Luka and Haris had a chance to present University of Donja Gorica and Montenegro to the members of this club. Hosts were thrilled and excited and had a lot of questions so in the end the presentation was two hours long instead of 30 minutes.

Student life in Xihua University was fascinating – there are just a couple of coffee-shops and similar content. Sport is also very popular – basketball courts are full at night and table tennis tables are full on a sunny days. Every day is very organized for every student. They have so many classes that sometimes they entire day in the classrooms (with shorter breaks). Free time is mainly used for sports and learning.



Almost every student is part of some student club. There are a lot of student clubs and they are all supported by the University but maintained only buy students. Students are organizing everything by themselves. Everyone can join the club they choose. As students explained – clubs are academically supported, they are not private properties which allows them with raising needed funds and materials.

On the other side, University is not organizing any of the activities, it just supports the work of the clubs and eventually helps them if needed, Student/club member is the one who run and organize the club. It is also noticeable that this kind of access moves the students, learns them to act and take responsibility and suppresses the thought that someone else will do something for them.

Organization of the University itself helps in creating the schedule. Electric energy in all dormitories is being turned off at 23h except Friday and Saturday when it's being turned off at midnight. Dormitory doors are electric (opened by card) so one cannot enter the dormitory after this time. This helps students to organize the time for sleeping but also helps in organizing the teaching classes – since there's no electricity, students can't charge their phones during night. They charge them at day time while they are in school which means they do not have a phone during lectures. And even if they do, every classroom has extremely strong signal plaster which are always turned on so phone losses the signal immediately. Also, almost all of the students live in the dormitories. Students gains a room where he lives with colleagues from the same Faculty. Students does not choose nor the dormitory nor his roommates. This way students are coming closer with their colleagues from their generation.

In the campus, there is a square meant for the promotion of students and students activities. It is a place where student organizations organize activities, promotions and gather new members. At this place, students can express their opinions and ideas and attract other same-thinking students. Student square is full every day – it is a place where meeting new people is very easy. There are so many organizations in the University that everyday there is another club promotion.



Besides extracurricular activities, they found out a lot about teaching itself.

For example, in the department called School of Arts, there are five different majors: Industrial and product design, Graphic Design, Fine Arts, Interior Design and Audio-Visual production. Here, students are being encouraged to participate on different public contests. Students must, besides regular tasks, prepare entries for different contests depending on their major. This participation is being treated as homework.

Also, when participating on these contests, student have to team up in order to prepare entry. Product design students make a product itself, graphic design students create a packaging and a promotional campaign, animation students create promotional video and fine art students create needed illustrations. They also cooperate with other departments – design is often teamed up with Computers and Software Engineering Division, where students do code and apps. This kind of system gives excellent results and creates teams. These teams usually continue to work together after the studies are finished. Also, the system of mandatory participation on public contests is very helpful and gives good experiences to the students. It develops working habits, habits on participating in the contests, develops entrepreneurship and helps students being informed about trends in their major. Also, after finishing the studies, students have rich portfolio and can start working without waiting for job.

Another mandatory segment in each semester in these Faculties is learning about Chinese culture. In every semester students spend two weeks in the local villages where they learn about tradition and way of living. The goal of this excursion is bonding students for improving team work and expanding the perspective. History and tradition are the basic for everything. This is why it is insisted that students meet their tradition and culture as many as they can so they can grow and improve themselves. After these two weeks, students must have large number of creations inspired by what they saw and felt there.

Another interesting major was part of the Faculty of Economics – E-Commerce. This major is all about the most trending segment of doing business in China – Internet trading. Everything is being paid with smartphone in China. Not only big shops, restaurants and markets. You can use a smartphone even on the streets to pay for street food. Almost no one uses cash anymore, everything you need is a smartphone, internet connection and a QR code. This kind of payments is so popular that an average Chinese citizen has no need for cash and a wallet. Some of the subjects at this Faculty are International trading, Management of Information, Databases, Internet Marketing etc. Internet advertising in China is very different from the Western Internet advertising because no Google, Facebook, YouTube and similar services cannot be used in China so one has to adapt to Chinese advertising culture otherwise they just throw away the money.

Outside the classroom, except for the age, teacher's lifestyle is not so different from the student's lifestyle. They use the same canteens, same sports objects, libraries, shops. Outside the classroom, teacher is a student. Of course, that does not mean

students lack the respect for them. It was very interesting that almost every lunch with some of the younger teachers ended in the same place – the canteen.

Time organization of the lecturers is similar to ours. They are not connected to much one to another, probably due to the size of the University. Some of the teachers explained their teaching system to us – if a student misses a lot of classes, he is not being punished. Teacher speaks with the Coordinator of the studies that student is attending. Later, Coordinator speaks with the student and trying to get him on a right path. If this is the case with the large number of students, teacher then first speaks with the Coordinator about his program to see if there is maybe a problem why students are not attending to his classes. If everything is okay here, then Coordinator speaks with the students. But every teacher said one thing repeatedly: I don't see why student would miss classes.

### **C) Academic exchange: UDG students at XIHUA 2018, Chengdu, PR China**

As a result of cooperation established in October 2016 with XIHUA University from China, students from University of Donja Gorica-UDG spent summer semester 2017/2018 on study visit at Xihua University in People's Republic of China. Following the multidisciplinary approach, which fosters at UDG, students had a chance to apply from different faculties and different fields of study. According to that, during this visit Xihua hosted 6 students: 3 students from Faculty of Polytechnics (one postgraduate student and two graduate students), 1 student from Faculty of Design and Multimedia (direction: Graphic Design), 1 student from Faculty of Systems and Technologies and 1 student from Faculty of Natural Science (direction: Mathematics). The duration of their visit was 4 months, from 1<sup>st</sup> March to 1<sup>st</sup> July.



The study program for students was concentrated on learning about Chinese culture and customs. Students had lessons on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9am until 5pm, with short breaks. During these classes students learned how to write, speak and read more than 300 Chinese characters. That was more than enough to motivate students to apply for official Chinese test and gain certificate HSK 1 (150 characters, similar to official language level A1) and HSK 2 (300 characters, similar to official language level A2). All of the students passed The Final Exam that was organized after the summer semester on Xihua University and got certificates.

The accommodation for students was organized in campus of Xihua University in order to help them to adapt and prepare for students' life in Chengdu. Campus of Xihua University, the place where 40 thousand students and about 10 thousand professors live with their families, is the quiet, spacious, green and above all alive environment with special energy. Students lived in the same buildings where professors live and had the great opportunity to have the whole apartments for them-



selves, with a room for everyone that was equipped for studying, relaxation and sleeping. The hosts were more than friendly in helping them to accommodate, giving them what they need in any situation possible.

Since the program what also focused on Chinese culture there was an opportunity for students to make friends among Chinese colleagues and become part of their International Clubs. Chinese International Clubs are made of students from different study programs that are willing to cooperate and work together in order to help foreigners in their study life in China. The most popular activities organized by International Club are mostly concentrated on sharing the experience between youth and helping them learn from differences, such as Color Run, Chinese clothings and customs, school visits, mountain road trips, musical nights, cheerleading classes etc.

With its concept of functioning, Xihua University has something that makes University of Donja Gorica different, that is, awakening, encouraging and animating students to engage in various extracurricular activities in order to expand their aspects and cooperate with each other. Therefore, apart from classrooms and libraries, students can often be seen on sport's fields, workshops, in laboratories, volunteer, design, entrepreneurial and other clubs. All activities are supported by the University, but only students are responsible for their functioning.



Students with a focus on industrial and product design are able to get to know the overall designing process (sketch- 3d model- model), until the final product is manufactured in the production plants. Branding is also part of a process designed by students to familiarize themselves with all segments of product development and its placement on the market. This was especially useful for postgraduate student since its Master thesis was related to the topic “Conceptual problems in modern architecture and industrial design”.

Its field of study was concentrated on modern technologies, product design, product development and branding. These topics are currently in the spotlight of ProDe research and development program. The purpose of this visit was, as well, to im-

prove ProDe laboratory so that it can attract companies and new ideas into its sustainability and development, but also entrepreneurial learning among staff and students were enhanced participating in exchange.

During this visit, postgraduate student, which is also a ProDe team member and teaching assistant at UDG, did a research for MA thesis on Xihua University, and successfully defend it at UDG. Interdisciplinary topic can bridge the gap between modern and industrial focusing on Chinese architecture and design and its comparison to Montenegrin in order to improve architectural scene. Since it is concentrate to product design as well it will affect ProDe's direction of future movement and sustainability.

Studying at XHU students were able to acquire theoretical and practical knowledge from their Chinese colleagues and throughout a direct cooperation with professors and assistants, to get a chance to work on different projects. With this exchange students got a multi-cultural experience and benefits with a chance to attend classes on all faculties that include application of 3D technology in all stages of creative design.





## D) Report on student's exchange program between University of Donja Gorica and XIHUA University

For the period from 3<sup>rd</sup> May to 7<sup>th</sup> July 2018, three PhD students from the University of Donja Gorica (UDG) participated in the Exchange program at Xihua University in Chengdu, PR China They are:

Purpose of the visit was conducting research and writing PhD theses and attending lecturers. Students had full access to library and its facilities and had opportunity to communicate with professors, teaching assistants and students. Exchange of experience between UDG students and professors and students from China had been improved through different events that were organized by University.

### CONTENT OF THE EXCHANGE PROGRAM

PhD students from UDG had been selected by Xihua University to participate at “International Student Sichuan Perception Walk into Liangshan” which was held at Xichang University. The event was hosted by the Sichuan Provincial Department of Education, Xichang College and Liangshan Prefecture Education Bureau. This event brought together over the 200 international students from 27 different universities from China. Students had opportunity to attend different cultural and sport activities, such as Chinese keynote speech contest, Story photography exhibition, literary performance, Sports culture exchange, off-campus practice and others. All these activities were a great opportunity for UDG students to cooperate and communicate with students from all continents from over 40 countries, as well as meet culture of Yi minority.

c. **Meeting with President of Montenegrin Parliament (June 3<sup>rd</sup> 2018)**

On June 3rd, UDG students had meeting with representatives of Xihua University: Dean and professors for the international cooperation and delegation from Parliament of Montenegro: President of Parliament and advisors for media and international relations.

After the presentation of the University of Xihua, their representatives provided detailed information on the cooperation with the UDG University, which was followed up with the pictures during their visit to the UDG, as well as representatives of UDG to their university. Data on the participation of their representatives on Globalization: Belt and Road Initiative were presented. They also provided information about the residence of UDG students to them, as well as about the practice provided by UDG for their students .

After their presentation, the President of the Parliament of Montenegro had a speech, where he pointed out the significance of the future friendship, and also addressed the education. Staying in China has made it possible for us to feel at least a little bit of Chinese culture. This culture was “new” and pleasant to us. We are positively surprised by Chinese people’s kindness, attachment, immediacy, professionalism, diligence, dedication to the goal, networking, and willingness to help. Several of them came to us in the library, on the street, in the canteen, presented themselves and offered help if they needed anything. Also, they asked if we could be friends. We got numerous friends, and we believe that it is of mutual importance and mutual satisfaction that we stay in contact maintain the good relationships and friendships we have built in China.

# Academic exchange with Beijing Union University

UDG and Tourism College of Beijing Union University have developed extensive collaboration during last two years.

Most part of that collaboration was academic exchange.

## **A) Student exchange – UDG students at BUU**

Students spent period from March 2018 to July 2018 attending classes at Tourism College of Beijing Union University and had opportunity not only to expand their knowledge about Chinese culture but also to study Chinese language and explore new cultural heritage of China, meet new people and experience a different life-style.

Throughout this program students had a chance to get closer to Chinese culture attending these six classes: Geography of Chinese tourism, The World cultural heritage of Beijing, A survey of Chinese Culture and Architecture, Chinese dining culture and Chinese Language. Each class was though in English and prepared especially for this group, because of that students had full attention of professor and could have better communication with professors. Their main goal was not only to learn about China and its culture but also to present Montenegrin culture to professors and find similarities and differences between these two cultures.

Each class had theoretical and practical part, so curriculum consisted not only essays, presentations and tests but also a practical part where students can explore the subject themselves. The most impressive classes for students were Chinese dining culture and the World cultural heritage of Beijing. During class of dining culture students would learn about certain meal and its significance and then a chef would prepare it in front of them and teach them how to do it step by step. Class of The World cultural heritage of Beijing brought attention to students because after learning about specified cultural heritage students would visit it and get to know it even better.

During the stay students had a chance of participating in International Exhibition where they presented Montenegro.

At this exhibition international students from all over the World presented more than thirty different cultures: Russia, Turkey, Thailand, Korea, Spain, Angola, Congo, and Mongolia were just some of them. Team work and organization were not easy, but thankfully to experiences at UDG students managed to organize and share responsibilities. Stand of Montenegro was the most visited one since on-one had a chance to hear about it or taste its food.

Two students, Monika Jovicic and Masa Velimirovic, throughout program explored subject of Chinese culture for their final thesis. Monika Jovicic choose “Similarities and differences between People’s Republic of China and Montenegro” and Masa Velimirovic choose “Taste of Chinese Culture” as their topics, working with their mentor prof. dr. Zoran Djikanovic students defended their thesis in October 2018.

Exchange program thought students the importance of ability to accept cultural differences, how to blend in a different culture and learn from experience. # **STUDY TRIP REPORT**

## **The 2nd “Belt and Road Initiative” Advanced Training Program Sustainable Agriculture and Food Safety in China**

### **1. Introduction**

UDG professor Aleksandra Martinovic, PhD, attended Advanced Training Program: Sustainable Agriculture and Food Safety in China which was organized in the period from 14<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> of October at the Shanghai Jiao Tong University, Shanghai, China.

Shanghai Jiao Tong University was founded 120 years ago (in 1826), and it has 64 undergraduate programs with 9 basic disciplines: economics, legal science, literature, engineering, agriculture, medicine, management and art. There are in addition, 38 disciplines within doctoral studies within eight different 8 fields: economics, law, literature, fundamental science, engineering science, agriculture, medicine and management.

Shanghai Jiao Tong University also has 21 research institutes, 13 hospitals, 2 medical research institutes, 6 business companies, etc.

At the University, the current number of students is 30,200, including 2,400 international students with 2,835 permanent lecturers, 891 of whom are full professors, and 22 are members of the Academy of Sciences of the People’s Republic of China.

University has its own Museum, Botanical Garden, 5 university libraries with over 10 million titles along with 3 million electronic ones.

### **2. Implementation of the training**

The organization of the seminar is diligently planned, conducted professionally, with natural immediacy, which gives the impression of ease and sincere commitment especially among young volunteers.

Recruiting targets for the seminar were the individuals who are the talents in agricultural research and management areas such as university employees, professors, assoc. professors, and lecturers, government officials and enterprise elites.

There was in total 22 participants, mostly from the countries of Eastern and Central Europe, along with Turkey, Pakistan and Malaysia. Everyone was actively participating and aware of the importance of cooperation with Chinese institutions.

Training topics encompassed several components such are:

- World Agriculture Development Strategy
- Technology and Management of Agricultural Industry
- Food Safety and Human Health
- Chinese History and Culture

These components were structured into the following set of lectures:

- Chinese History and Culture
- The Agrarian Question in the 21st Century
- Opportunities and Challenges in Agricultural Modernization
- Urban Ecological Agriculture and Sustainable Development
- Rural Ecological and Cultural Tourism Development in China
- Modern Agriculture and Plant Biotechnology
- The Progress of Plant Biotechnology Research
- Digital Technology and Mechanization in Horticultural Crop Production
- Research and Development of Biomass Energy Conversion Technologies
- Modern Detection Technologies on Food Safety
- Animal Biotech for Human Health
- Chinese Food Safety Supervision and Management

In addition, field trips to Pujiang Green Valley Agriculture Training Base and Shanghai Chenshan Botanical Garden were organized.

Apart from supporting the lectures with the relevant field trips, the organizers arranged the tours to museums and companies. These tours strengthened the knowledge on Chinese and Shanghai history and opened possibilities for future trilateral cooperation between foreign and Chinese institutions with Chinese food industry. The participants had the opportunity to visit Shanghai Museum, Shanghai City Planning Exhibition Hall, Shanghai Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Bureau (Food Testing Laboratory) and Bright Food (Group) co., Ltd.

### **The benefits for the hosts and participants**

Advanced Training Program: Sustainable Agriculture and Food Safety gathered professionals in the field of food production, safety and security. It can be considered as a unique opportunity for global initiative. As an outcome it was more than just training. It was the opportunity for exchange of ideas, networking and opening new horizons for cooperation. Numerous research and cooperation ideas were discussed and some of these will be realized in the near future.

University of Donja Gorica, particularly its Faculty of Food Technology Food Safety and Ecology can endeavor different modalities of collaboration with Jiao Tong University. Especially in the fields of the exchange of master students, guest professors and through the joint research platforms/projects.

Special topics of interest could be:

- Research and Development of Biomass Energy Conversion;
- Modern Detection Technologies on Food Safety (collaboration with the platform MOST-USDA Research Center for Food Safety);
- Application of biosensor technology in food pathogen detection and
- Urban agriculture

In addition the foundation of the collaborative research platform with the Shanghai Dairy Research Institute, food industry and Bright Food (Group) co., Ltd would be of a special interest for the newly founded spin- laboratory for innovations in the food industry at the Faculty for Food Technology Food Safety and Ecology of UDG.

Participants had the opportunity to obtain information on advantages and challenges of education sector of China, while experiencing their host's interest for the state of education in Montenegro.

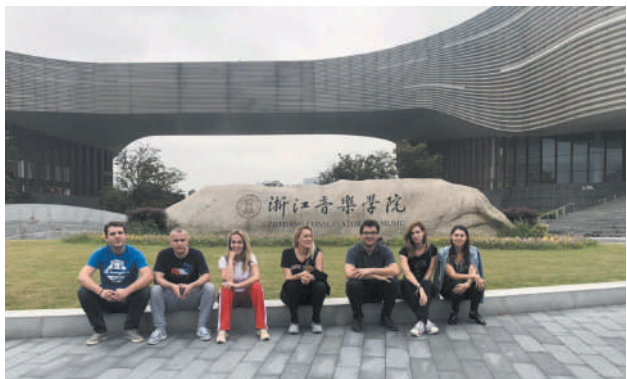
Some of the most significant visits are related to:

That is why UDG invest a lot, much more than the others, in each of our students individually. Not only in the course of their studies but also after graduation.

But we also invest in our future students, co-workers, teachers.

Participants of the UDG Talent Camp are students of the ninth grade of the primary or the first grade of the secondary schools in Montenegro.

Criteria for selection of participants was an essay on the topic: "How do we learn from our mistakes?". Out of the pool of students that applied for the UDG Camp for Talents, 25 are selected on the basis of their essay quality assessment by a multi-member panel composed of professors from the UDG.

Last two years UDG Camp for Talents was of the international character, Camp participants were also students from the Xihua University, Chengdu, China which contributed to the diversity of socializing, meeting other cultures and experiences, forming new friendships. In 2017 there was 8 students from the Xihua University and 13 in the following year.

UDG Camp for Talents is organized in the first week of July at the UDG and in the hotel "Grand" in the Old Montenegrin Royal Capital Cetinje.

## Competition – Invitation to Applicants

The UDG organizes a Camp for talents. The Camp is organized from July 1 to 6, 2017 at the UDG and in the hotel “Grand” in Cetinje.

Possible candidates are pupils of the ninth grade of primary, i.e. the first grade of secondary schools in 2016/17 from Montenegro.

**Criteria for selection of attendees:**

**Essay on the topic: “HOW TO LEARN FROM MY MISTAKES?”**

Are you at the very beginning wondering: Why this topic? Why it? What message does the UDG send us through this topic? Is this perhaps in order to challenge our mentality?

No one is righteous in life. Sinlessness would mean perfection of a man and there are no perfect men in real life. Therefore, you, although young, have made some mistakes, from the smallest to the larger ones (nonreading of books, insufficient investment in languages, being spoiled, etc.).

Do you notice mistakes at all and are you able to learn from them in order not to repeat them in the future? Is the recognition of the same mistake, in fact, a high level of knowledge and understanding of the world around us, but also ourselves? Have you noticed that in Montenegro there is a fear of failure? The fear that arises from our large ego, i.e. self-love? The fear of what others will say if we try something new and make a mistake! Is this fear the limit of the development of each person and the society as a whole? We again ask ourselves, isn't the highest level of knowledge the knowledge we gain from recognition of the mistakes committed in the past in order not to repeat them in the future? Do we really need to live our life with the aim to be liked by others or to be ourselves through continuous learning, acting, striving for the achievement, through the method of attempts and mistakes to be different from others and to live our authentic life?

Can you accept the claim that as much we differ as human beings in our faces we just as many, maybe more, differ by talents and authentic abilities? Each man hides that God's secret of creation in himself, i.e. his talent.

How to reach it? How to detect it? That is, how to get to know yourself?

The UDG Camp for talents, the only one in Montenegro, is a part of the mosaic for gaining experience in order to get closer to your creative capabilities. Never forget that the narcissistic ego is a common disease among us, an expression of our conviction in our own perfection, own sinlessness. How to get rid of constraints imposed by our ego, i.e. how to release a narcissistic, conceited ego? Knowledge and education are the most effective ways to overcome the ego.

Einstein expressed this by the formula:, which means: More the knowledge lesser the ego, lesser the knowledge more the  $\frac{1}{\text{ego}}$  !

Therefore, do not be surprised to meet with this Einstein's formula at the UDG in multiple locations!

This is the reason that the UDG invests a lot in knowledge, skills and experience of its students, according to the famous UDG study  $A = k * e^2$  (A - the ability, k - knowledge, e - life experience while studying).

We are aware of the fact that, in the long-term, this model depends on the quality of professors! We see in you, talents, exactly those future professors and experts, bearers of a different way of thinking. thinking and understanding of the world in this era of globalization, the world of different cultures and religions, the world with rapid population growth.

Are the mistakes you made and you make, even you are young, the product of ambition and mistakes of your parents or possibly teachers? Perhaps of the environment you live in?

And we, who write to you, are parents and know that parents want the best for their children! But should my desires, as a parent, be a framework for the future of my child? Is the role of us, parents, to develop in our children a system of values related to truthfulness, justice, morality, respect for commitments, for love to others, to develop work habits, responsibility, the character of the child or to draw the path to them for their future? Do we really, as parents, think that our past is a model for the future of our children? Do not we sometimes, as parents, understand the spirit of the times?

Probably you will be angry because of this approach but be assured that it is based on genuine faith in the ability of a human to choose his path in life and take responsibility for his decisions. That is why we need to believe in our children! Therefore, you should believe in the young generation! One of the big differences of the UDG compared to other universities is that we believe in the ability of each of our students. We believe that every student has his own talent and ability to create something in life.

That is why we invest a lot, much more than others in each of our students individually. Not only during their studies but also after graduation. But we also invest in our future students, associates, professors.

Whether we see in Cetinje or not, realize that you live in a world full of challenges, a world of great possibilities that you can use only if you believe in yourself and if you work hard and responsible on yourself and if you are capable to learn from mistakes and defeats in life more than from own victory and success!

Success in life means the ability to win the defeats!

## CAMP FOR TALENTS

### Rules at the UDG Camp for talents:

- 1) The first rule is that you have to stick to the rules!
- 2) All the activities during the Camp are held according to certain schedule and program, which must be fully respected.
- 3) Program and the UDG Camp for talents Agenda are mandatory for all participants - without exception.
- 4) Each participant of the Camp, according to his/her talent and abilities, is obliged to give his/her maximum contribution to a positive atmosphere and the implementation of activities within the UDG Camp for talents.
- 5) Camp participants are provided accommodation in double rooms, hotel "Grand" - Cetinje, three meals a day.
- 6) Rooms will accommodate students of the same sex, in principle, from different cities and schools from Montenegro. The accommodation schedule is to be decided by the organizer of the Camp, on which the participants will be informed upon arrival at the hotel.
- 7) During the Camp consuming alcohol, narcotic substances, staying in other people's rooms, skipping over terraces and everything that violates house rules of "Grand" hotel is prohibited.
- 8) The organizer is not responsible for any behavior that is contrary to house rules and the rules of the Camp.
- 9) Any non-compliance with the rules will be considered a breach of discipline and entails disciplinary responsibility. The decision on disciplinary action will be brought by the Executive Director of the UDG Camp for talents.
- 10) From the moment of the arrival at the campsite until leaving the same, the possession and use of mobile phones are prohibited. Likewise, the use of other people's mobile phone will be sanctioned as violation of the UDG Camp for talents rules.
- 11) In case of need, each Camp participant will be able to, through the official representatives of the UDG Camp for talents organizer, to send SMS to his/her parents.
- 12) Parents will, once daily, receive information about their child and the situation in the Camp from the official representative of the organizer of the Camp via SMS/phone call. Message sent to a participant's parent will be considered to be received within 7 hours after sending.



- 13) Parents may, every day (at most once), through the official representatives of the Camp for talents, request additional information about their child.
- 14) In the period of the duration of UDG Camp for Talents visits and any communication with the participants, whether in the UDG Camp for talents or outside the Camp, are not allowed.
- 15) It is strictly forbidden to send any messages, food, clothes, etc. to participants by means of others.
- 16) Each attendee of the Camp should bring a valid health card with him/her.
- 17) It is desirable that each attendee brings in sports gear, warm clothes (the night temperature in Cetinje drops below 20 degrees centigrade) and to take sufficient personal hygiene items.
- 18) It is necessary that a Camp participant also brings with him/her personal props that can contribute to more fun in a group and expressing his/her talent (sport props, musical instrument, etc.).
- 19) The UDG Camp for talents implies decent and appropriate clothing. When attending of workshops and during visits provided by the program of the Camp, participants must follow the rules for decent dressing (prohibited are: sleeveless t-shirts - necklines, tops, shorts, indecently short skirts, high heels, etc.). In the afternoon (during the open and recreational activities) the casual outfit but in compliance with the dress code is allowed.
- 20) It is forbidden to give children pocket money greater than the amount required for the trip!
- 21) Parents can bring their children to the UDG, participants' parents and friends will be addressed by organizers of the Camp who will, once again, clarify the mission and the rules of the Camp. Afterwards, participants will be given UDG Camp for talents T-shirts.
- 22) Camp ends by a solemn awarding of diplomas to attendees of the UDG Camp for talents. This ceremony will be attended by parents and friends.
- 23) After awarding diplomas, the final cocktail hour for students and parents will be held.
- 24) Parents should, by their arrival or otherwise, of which they are obliged to inform the organizers of the Camp, provide a safe and timely return of their children to the home.
- 25) After completion of the UDG Camp for talents and the departure of the child, the responsibility of the organizers for the participants of the same terminates.
- 26) During the entire time of the Camp, at least 5 representatives of the organizers of the UDG Camp for talents will permanently reside in the Camp, be involved in all Camp activities and take care of the respect of the Agenda and rules of the UDG Camp for talents.

- 27) Parents and students will be provided names and contacts of the organizers at the beginning of the UDG Camp for talents.
- 28) The Camp Agenda – compulsory getting up at 07:00, going to bed (sleep) - 23:00.
- 29) Violation of any rules bears disciplinary liability. In the case of disciplinary action implies exclusion from the UDG Camp for talents, a parent is required to cover the cost of stay of his/her child in the Camp (about 400 €).

#### **Some important information:**

- We inform potential attendees of the UDG Camp for talents that, in their group, there will be several students from China and that they will be, for 3 days, together with the participants of last-year UDG Camp for talents. Likewise, on 4 July, they will be with the newly enrolled generation of UDG students at Lovćen race and their first class at the top of Lovćen - in front of Njegoš!
- The only selection criterion is our assessment of the quality of the way of thinking and a level of sincerity of a student who submits the essay.
- Write the essay independently, without your parents', teachers' or anyone else's help since it is very easy to recognize the originality, i.e. peculiarity!
- Last year we had a lot of problems from parents and also some teachers who could not understand that despite their help the student was not selected for the UDG Camp. the UDG is a private university and invests its (not national) money in the organization of the Camp and it is meaningless to expect that we invest money in someone by "pulling strings".
- Those who participated in the last-year Camp do not have the right to participate in the Camp the following year!

- The student must have a written parental permission to attend the Camp (send an email to [kampzatalente@udg.edu.me](mailto:kampzatalente@udg.edu.me) or by mail to the University of Donja Gorica - UDG, Oktoih br. 1, Donja Gorica, 81000 Podgorica);
- A student who wants to participate in the Camp should see in it the opportunity to express his/her own talents, i.e. creativity, imagination, willpower, initiative, innovation, opportunity to check own skills in teamwork, relationships, decision-making, as well as to check the strength of own personal responsibility and commitment...;
- All the costs from arriving at the UDG to the departure from Cetinje are fully covered by UDG;
- Food according to the menu of the hotel "Grand" (3 meals per day);
- The Camp takes place in strict compliance with the rules (for example, time of getting up, mealtimes, mandatory participation in all activities, dress code, limited use of mobile phones, bedtime, etc.). In the case of non-compliance with the rules, participants will be sent back home before the end of the Camp.
- During the Camp, students will attend classes, go on excursions, be involved in sports activities, contests, competitions in various video games, creative Lego competition, group projects, mentor's work. The final activities schedule will be made on the basis of the profile and interests of candidates selected.
- At the end of the Camp, the participants will be awarded diplomas, and the most creative ones also the acknowledgments!



Ms. Jian Ting introduces her associates Ms. Zhou Yi Jia and Ms. Yhan Ling. She also pointed out that cooperation of TFB and UDG has been based on mutual sound and sincere understanding. UDG students at the Internship in TFB has showed a high level of knowledge and professionalism. She emphasized that cooperation between TFB and UDG should continue and widen to mutual satisfaction and benefit.

Rector Vukotic expressed his gratitude o TFB for admission and hospitality to UDG students during the Internship. After the Internship, UDG students feel TFB as their own bank and they are big promoters of TFB in Montenegro. The preliminary design study has been given to Ms. Jian Ting, with the expectation that she will deliver it to potential investors. It was agreed that Plantaze will draft a business plan within next 40 days, which would allow the presentation of the Wine Village project among the bank's clients. The wine village has a special significance having in mind that the number of Chinese tourists in Montenegro is growing rapidly
4. It was agreed that Plantaze will establish contact to Tianfu's Imperial Wine Corp. for the possible sale of Plantaze wine in China.
5. UDG will inform the TFB about all major investment projects in Montenegro and be TFB promoter in Montenegro and the region.

# Why Internships?

The UDG University prepares students for global market so they could be part of global business teams.

One of activities UDG organize in preparing students for global market is Internships in companies for both Chinese and Montenegrin students.

Practice already shows that student exchange is one of the conditions for sustainability of the Chinese “The Belt and Road” initiative, which UDG promotes from the very beginning. We consider that any company providing Internship to students contribute to the development of “The Belt and Road” Initiative and further strengthening the friendship of the people of China and Montenegro.

The Internship is conducted on the principle of reciprocity - Montenegrin students in Chinese companies in China and Chinese students in Montenegrin companies in Montenegro, lasting at least 30 and at most 60 days. The company’s obligation is to provide at least the average salary in that company, from which the student can provide housing and food. Chinese students in Montenegro receive between 600 and 800 Euros, depending on the company.

Chinese students had mentors in Montenegrin companies, during the first days of their Internships, Chinese students presented Chinese culture to employees in their host companies in the best possible way. We also prepare our students to do the same when they come to Chinese company.

Furthermore, all Chinese students visited one or more households of friends from companies or from the University. They even prepared Chinese food during those visits!

It is no wonder that among Montenegrin students who was in China and Chinese students who was in Montenegro is the regular communication and friendship. Furthermore, they are planning some summertime meetings and trips abroad together.

We emphasize all of the above in order to understand that this is not just an Internship but understanding of the Chinese culture in Montenegro and Montenegrin culture in China. Without understanding culture there is no successful business cooperation.

UDG provided:

- 3 Internships in 2017 for Chinese students in Montenegrin companies in Montenegro,
- 4 Internships in 2018 for Chinese students in Montenegrin companies in Montenegro,
- 5 Internships in 2018 for UDG students in Chinese companies in China.

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### **III Information regarding Ting Yan's internship at the Securities and Exchange Commission**

#### **In the period from 17 July to 11 August 2017**

Within the framework of cooperation between the University of Donja Gorica and Xi Hua the University of Sichuan, one of the three students of the above University, Ting Yan, began her traineeship in the Securities and Exchange Commission of Montenegro (hereinafter referred to as: the Commission) in the period from 17 July to 11 August 2017.

Under the Practical Experience Agreement, which was signed on 14 July 2017, a trainee committed to keep the same hours of work in the Commission as Commission's employees, meaning every working day from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and after completing her traineeship to make a presentation to the Commission's employees as regards knowledge she acquired during a traineeship, which relates to the comparative analysis of People's Republic of China and Montenegro capital markets..

During the first traineeship week (18 to 21 July) the trainee was presented the structure of the Montenegrin capital market. On that occasion, she got familiar with the definition and role of securities, issuance of securities, brokers, dealers, stock exchange and the Central Depository Agency.

During the second traineeship week (24 to 28 July) the trainee was presented the role and importance of investment funds' investment managers, pension funds' investment managers, investment and pension funds in Montenegro, as well as the possibility of the development of these areas in accordance with global trends and examples from developed countries' practice.

The third traineeship week (31 July to 4 August) was intended to meet the trainee with Montenegrin companies' financial reports, a way of reporting, as well as with the basic principles of anti-money laundering and the basic principles of the prevention of anti-money laundering and terrorist financing. During this week guidelines for creating a presentation on a comparative analysis of the People's Republic of China and Montenegro capital markets were made.

During the fourth traineeship week (7 to 11 August) the trainee prepared and made two presentations. One related to getting employees of the Commission familiar with the Chinese culture and the other, based on all documentation presented to her during her four-week traineeship, related to the analysis of capital markets of China and Montenegro and the experience gained during their stay in the Commission and Montenegro as well.

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## V The Report about Ms. Luo Yueyin's internship at the Monstat

**Traineeship period: 19.07.2017 – 11.08.2017**

**Institution: The Statistical Office of Montenegro**

**Mentors:**

- **Majda Savićević, the Department for international cooperation and European integration**
- **Jelena Marković, the Department for implementation of international projects**

Trainee, Luo Yueyin was on a internship in the period from 18.07.2017 to 11.08.2017 in Statistical Office of Montenegro. During her 4 week internship, she worked for the first two weeks in the Department for Business Statistics and Short-Term Indicators, on transport statistics, after which she started working in the Department of Foreign Trade.

On the beginning of her intership in Statistical Office, we have presented basic organisational informations and rules about MONSTAT, in order that Luo is familiar with principles of work. We have detaily presented Law on official statistics and official statistical system , which is the legal basis for production of official statistics in Montenegro, and in that manner Luo was introduced with basic document on which the work of MONSTAT is based.

During the first two weeks of internships, we have presented methodological guidelines of all surveys in transport statistics. Considering the large number of surveys in transport statistics during the internship, we put focus on 2 surveys: Survey on freight road transport, Pilot survey on air transport. We selected these two surveys because first one is based on the sample, and the other one has an administrative data source.

For the first survey, we have presented to Luo the way of choosing a sample in this survey, starting from general explanation of the sample. We have explained in the excel database for vehicle how we prepared the sample for the current year. Luo showed great interest for the field of the sample. As we had regular activity during first two weeks, preparation of a quarterly relasse of transport statistics, we have practically showed how we enter the data from the questionnaire into the data processing application and presented all the functions with an application for data entry. For the second survey of air traffic, we have explained whole proces of conducting the survey. Using the flight data base at airports for the second quarter, Luo independently prepared tables for air transport as well as analysis which is annex of press release. In all given tasks, Luo showed great commitment and responsibility, and quickly and easily understood the basic principles of statistics.



At the end of the second week working in traffic statistics, Luo presented the results of her work, analyzing this field, as well as presenting comparison with China. During her work, Luo showed that she understands the principles of official statistics and the importance of the legal basis for the production of official data. She showed an enviable knowledge of the use of various programs and techniques for displaying data, and independently made a schematic presentation of the statistical process, which indicates that she is systematic and dedicated commitment to working tasks.

During the preparation of the presentation, Luo also showed that she understands the importance of time series and data presentation i time series by crossing different variables in order to be able to analyze data and follow the trend. During her presentation, the focus was given also to new methods and types of transport in China, which showed that Luo understands the importance of following new trends.

During the other two weeks of the internship Luo learned about the way of producing statistics of foreign trade. Special attention was devoted to getting acquainted with the entire system of production of foreign trade data, focusing on exchanging goods with China.

The system of foreign trade data production is considered very demanding and quite complicated. Considering this fact special attention was devoted to getting acquainted with the EU Regulations on which member states, candidates and potential candidates' counties exchange goods between themselves or the rest of the world. After studying the methodology, the Luo became acquainted with the methodology of data production but also with the classifications (SITC, CPA and CN) used to produce this statistic. On the already existing databases, after studying the production process, a trainee had the task of preparing a statistical analysis of foreign trade data of Montenegro with China.

At the end of the second two weeks of internship within foreign trade statistics, Luo presented the results of her work, analysing this area as well as comparing Montenegrin data with China. We particularly emphasize the ability of Luo to quickly and successfully view the entire flow and the process of foreign trade production as well as the excellent ability to connect the interrelations in this process. All of the above mentioned indicate an excellent intellectual abilities to understand the system at the whole, to perceive networks and relationships within it, to link individual details to the whole system and to recognize their roles in the whole process. Using schematic graphics in the presentation, a systematic way of presenting and emphasis on key outputs, indicate that the trainee fully mastered and understood the process of producing foreign trade statistics in a very short time, but also points on her ability to further transfer knowledge in a very understandable and user-friendly way.

As the most interesting activity during the first two weeks, Luo pointed out usage of Microsfof Office package (Word, Excell, Power Point...) which are broadly used in the Statistical Office on a daily basis, and which helped her to improve her knowledge and techniques through practical work.



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The most challenging thing for her was understanding of the Law on Official Statistics and official statistical system, but thanks to her dedication she successfully responded to this task. We particularly emphasize her fluent English language skills and the excellent communication skills.

With her responsible approach to work tasks, team spirit and persistence, Ms. Luo Yueyin showed that she has the necessary professional and personal qualities.



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## **VI The Report about Ms. Xiang Rui's internship at the Plantaže**

Within the internship program "13 Jul Plantaze" JSC provided the opportunity to a student Ms. Rui Xiang to get familiar with the basics of bureaucratic procedures, quality control systems, as well as with a production process in the food industry. A three-week period was divided into three segments, as follows:

- During the first week, a student was involved in the search and description of the standards related to the certification, as well as the legal procedure in force in the PRC.
- The second week was dedicated to the Laboratory, and
- The third week was dedicated to primary processing, that is the processing of grapes and production of wine from the 2017 harvest in our Company.

Since Ms. Rui studies Food Science and Engineering, we tried to provide her with access to work procedures, as well as examples of good practice in the production process of an agri-food product. As the range of business activities of the Company is wide, we believed that this method of learning was the most appropriate, as well as that she got a valuable experience in our Company that will help her in further research for the duration of her studies.

As the Company has a stable growth in exports of products in the Chinese market, the student's task during the first week was searching for the basic regulations, standardization as well as legal regulations and procedures, in order to have in mind the deviations from our bureaucratic procedures in relation to the Chinese ones. Therefore, the student's activities included:

- a description of the standards applied in the food processing and production, with particular reference to the production of wine,
- Ms. Rui made a presentation regarding the standards and procedures of the Law on Food Safety in China. She gave an overview of the risk assessment, the main risk factors as well as the standards for labeling and importation of goods into China. Given the fact that the standards we apply are harmonized with EU standards, we wanted to check how much they deviate from the standards that are binding for Chinese food producers. The student made a very good presentation which was delivered to our colleagues from the Quality Control Department.
- Since China is a big producer of fish, and the Company Plantaže has the biggest pond for controlled breeding of trout in Montenegro, the student made a presentation on the security regulations, basic and necessary inputs for fish production in China.



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During the second week, the student was carrying out quality control activities, i.e. quality control of fresh fruit, wine and auxiliary goods. The Laboratory, as a quality of work filter, was the first practical challenge where the student:

- familiarized herself with the basic products of our Company, as well as chemical parameters to be tested before the wine is placed in the market. The work on chemical analysis is essential before the product is packaged in the form of finished product and reaches the final consumer.
- controlled the quality of fresh fruit (peaches and nectarines and table grapes).
- controlled the raw materials used for the packaging of raw materials and production of a finished product.
- got familiar with the control of the key and critical parameters necessary for the production of an agricultural product of a superior quality, as well as actively participated and gave her contribution to all the above-mentioned stages of work, and through the practical work she became aware of the importance of achieving the set quality standards.

During the last traineeship week, the student was engaged in the WU "Processing" where the primary processing of wine grapes was carrying out, as well as the production of wine from the 2017 harvest. Within these activities, the student had a an opportunity to:

- take part in the grape processing, as well as see the production procedure of white wines, red wines and rosé wines.
- get familiar with a process of wine production, natural reactions occurring by fermentation of Syrah, as well as with the necessity for a dosage of oenological means.

In this way, the student was given an insight into all important segments of production, quality control, receiving the input parameters as well as the importance of obtaining timely and accurate information. Importance is also placed on cross-sectoral communication.

The student Rui showed a very systematic approach to work, carrying out work tasks and commitments undertaken. Professionalism of her work was in the first place, and therefore she met our expectations. During the last week of her traineeship, she was engaged by the Sales Department to work on the analysis of the Chinese market. Since the student adequately contributed to the work, there is a possibility that the Company engages her in the future on temporary tasks of examination of the Chinese market in order to open up new opportunities for expansion of export of our export on the PRC market.

Likewise, during the first days of their Internships, Chinese students presented Chinese culture to employees in their host companies in the best possible way. All Chinese students visited one or more households of friends from companies or from the University. They even prepared Chinese food during those visits!

I am emphasizing all of the above so we can understand that this is not just an Internship but understanding of the Chinese culture in Montenegro and Montenegrin culture in China. Without understanding culture there is no successful business cooperation.

### About the TFB internship

In July and August 2018, 4 UDG students attended the internship in Sichuan Tianfu Bank (TFB), ranked 453<sup>rd</sup> on Financial Times' 1000 Top World Banks Ranking Table for 2018, with total assets of around 27 billion EURO.

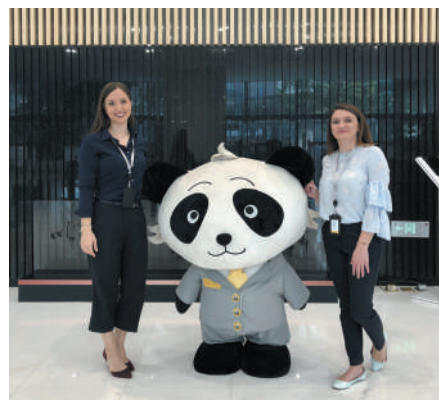
Students who were working in Bank's headquarters in Chengdu, Sichuan province, PR China are:

1. **Ms. MarijaRadunovic**, PhD student, Faculty for international economics, finance and business;
2. **Ms. Samira Resuljovic**, Master student, Faculty of law;
3. **Ms. AndjelaLucic**, Bachelor student, Faculty for international economics, finance and business;
4. **Ms. VladanaDragojevic**, Bachelor student, Faculty for international economics, finance and business;

They were working as interns in different departments of bank:

1. Asset management division (MarijaRadunovic);
2. Business development division (Samira Resuljovic);
3. Financial markets division (AndjelaLucic and VladanaDragojevic).

Students were working in a bank for **1 month (from 17<sup>th</sup> July to 17<sup>th</sup> August 2019)** and, with additional, extra-curricular activities, they spent month and a half living in Chengdu, China.



## TFB Internship Program schedule

**Working hours: 8.30 to 17.30**, with a 2-hours brake from 12.00 to 14.00, during the workdays and students had spare time during the weekends.

Students were working in TFB Bank for a month and were treated as its full employees. They were amazed by Chinese hospitality and openness of Bank's employees, who were open for all their questions and open to share knowledge and huge international experience with them.

In a Bank, students were provided with **3 meals during the workdays** (except Friday, when dinner was not served) in the Bank's canteen for all its employees. Besides that, the Bank was providing **yoga classes** during the workdays – for those who like to prefer to do the workout during the lunch break.

Within the departments, students were given the tasks to do the research on different topics, which may concern departments in which they were working. All of them had their mentors during the whole period of their stay, and the Directors' Board Office team (David, Ivan and Ying) was in charge for administrative stuff regarding the internship of UDG students. At the beginning of their internship period, Ms. Jian Ting, vice-president of TFB Bank invited them for meeting dedicated to presenting the rules and TFB Bank, as well as getting to know better UDG and its students.

Besides doing research on different topics, students were given to complete daily tasks, helping in writing the reports and were involved in daily activities of department in which they were working. In addition to that, all of them got to learn how to use the **Bloomberg software program** for trading in financial markets. It is an expensive and rarely used program, given that Bloomberg is now charging \$24,000 a year for a single terminal subscription.

At the end of their internship, students got to present their papers in front of the Vice-president of the bank, Ms. Jian Ting.

Topics which 4 students covered during their stay in TFB Bank were:

1. Ms. MarijaRadunovic, *Tariff war: U.S. VS. China*;
2. Ms. Samira Resuljovic, *Legislative and regulation system in banking sector in Montenegro*;
3. Ms. AndjelaLucic, *Analysis of emerging markets and M&A*;
4. Ms. VladanaDragojevic, *DAGONG HONG KONG Rating agency*.



After their presentation, which was evaluated by the committee made of TFB employees, Ms. Jian Ting expressed her satisfaction with work and dedication of UDG students in TFB bank, as well as her and Bank's openness for further cooperation with UDG.

Besides gaining new skills and knowledge, the program helped them to get to know better Chinese business culture, hardworking discipline and commitment to work, given that majority of the students' Chinese colleagues were doing the overtimes and work during the weekends. Besides that, they got to know the best professionals in the field of finance in China, given the high competition in China and the fact that all of their colleagues completed the best Master and PhD programs all over the world. Thus, students were working in a **global atmosphere in a skyscraper** – in a building where around **1.500 people work** together every day.



## Conclusion or: What have we learned from China?

Living in China, in a city with 20 million people, in a country with completely different culture and living standard was a challenging and changing experience for all of the four interns, both professionally and personally.

Working with highly professional and educated individuals, in an international and highly competitive atmosphere changed our perception of success. Although official working hours in China are from 8.30 to 17.30, no Chinese employee thinks of the working hours – they work until the work is done. It wasn't so rare to have a walk around the Bank in the late-night hours and see open windows and office lights. To succeed in China, you have to be very professional, hard-working and one of the best. You have to “follow the rules of the game” and especially respect the business hierarchy. During the work, Chinese are focused completely, and it is rare that you can hear them chat or talk. The thing we will value the most is the lesson on how to be fully dedicated to your work in order to succeed.

Chinese people are very kind and hospital. Our new friends were very polite and made us feel very nice. Even the streets are safe and life in Chengdu is lovely and peaceful. Although we were living in a huge city, Chinese people are calm, very patient and family oriented. Chengdu is a safe city providing the metropolitan feel to all of its visitors and inhabitants. On the other side, it is open to its international visitors and will make you feel like you are home.

How did China change us personally? When you live in a city with a different culture, with people of different skin colour, different nutrition habits (mix of spicy, sweet & sour), different lifestyle, way of dressing, yet all of them live, work, have respect for each other and strive to create something new, you realize that “differences are not obstacles” and even though they exist, everything comes to the point of humanity and kindness of human heart. That is the most important thing China educated us.

- The Capital Market Authority, a capital market regulator.

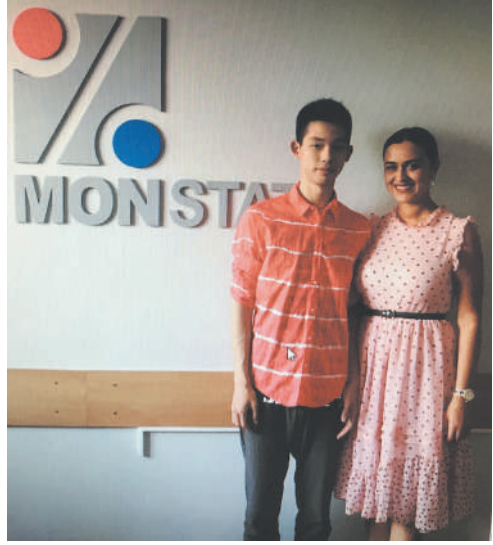

I would like to inform you that cooperation of University of Donja Gorica with China is very intensive on various levels: with Universities, with companies, and on political level.

We bring to your attention that:

- UDG has established cooperation with XIHUA University, Sichuan; Beijing Union University; XIDIAN University, Xi'an; Municipality of Beijing, CCPIT Beijing Sub-council; and several Chinese companies, banks and institutions,
- Several of UDG students have been on research study and practice (master and PhD students) at Universities in China,

Dear Honorable Ambassador Cui Zhi Wei,

尊敬的崔志伟大使，

您好！

I was in China at the Symposium on China studies held from 23 - 28 July 2018.

十分荣幸能受邀参加2018年7月23日至7月28日在中国北京举办的“汉学与当代中国”座谈会。

First, I want to thank you and the Government of the People's Republic of China for the invitation. It was a great honor and privilege to participate at this Symposium, which was attended by the experts from 30 countries and from China, with the participation of about 80 international students of Master's and PhD studies studying in China.

首先，非常感谢中国政府及主办方的此次邀请。这次研讨会规模之大，与会人员有来自中国和其他30个国家的专家以及80位在中国攻读硕士和博士学位的国际学生，能参加这样大规模的研讨会我们荣幸之至。

Second, I would like to tell you that the Symposium was outstanding both meaningfully and organizationally. Once again I convinced myself as regards sincerity and kindness, as well as hospitality of the Chinese motherland.

其次，我不得不说这次研讨会组织完善而且意义重大，让我再一次感受到了中国人民的真诚善良和热情好客。

Third, as you know, I have been many times in China, I repeatedly had long conversations with you about China, during my studies in Moscow and Britain I socialized Chinese students, I read many books about China, Chinese culture and history, the "One belt One Road" initiative,... I especially studied Lao Tzu! However, this stay allowed me to holistically experience and deepen all my previous knowledge about China. But now the idea of "One Belt One Road" is even clearer to me now and I have now realized that it truly originates from thousands of years long history of China ... as a tree and tree branches grow out of their roots. Staying in Hangzhou really helped me in that and especially a tour of the Museum of silk and The Grand Jinghang Canal

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Museum ... Only the Chinese could build a canal 1.800 km long whose construction started in 300 BC. The canal that integrated and developed the Eastern part of China and the canal which connected three major rivers. (I remember when you told me that in China rivers flow from West to East - and now I understand ...) That Canal and its idea, I, metaphorically, see as the source of the idea of "One Belt One Road"!

诚然，正如您所知道的，我已经多次来过中国。在我于莫斯科和英国就读期间我也曾多次和您就中国的话题进行探讨，同时，我也和中国学生进行交流，阅读有关中国历史文化的书籍，了解“一带一路”战略计划等，而且我还专门研究了老子文化！然而，这次研讨会的特殊经历让我对中国有了更加全面的了解并加深了我对中国的印象。我更加清楚地了解了“一带一路”战略计划并认识到它起源于中国几千年的悠久历史。这次的杭州之行，特别是丝绸博物馆和京杭大运河博物馆的参观让我受益匪浅。只有中国能够在公元前 300 年就建造出 1800 千米长的运河。这条运河整合和发展了中国东部地区并使其他三条主要的河流都汇集于此(我清楚地记得您曾经告诉过我，中国的河流都是从西流向东的，现在我彻底明白了)。我认为，这条运河就是“一带一路”战略计划的灵感来源。

Fourth, despite numerous risks, I am now fully convinced of the success of the "One Belt One Road" initiative. It is about a civilization initiative, not a bureaucratic initiative ... about the initiative, which will, I am sure, change today's world as Columbus changed the world by discovering America 500 years ago. This faith comes to me from the fact that it is about an inclusiveness-based initiative, an inclusive rather than hegemonic development, as well as the fact that it is culture-based, i.e. mutual understanding of different peoples' cultures ... Spiritual development that we the have neglected on the West and subordinated it to a crass materialism, is the way towards building a social community with the depth - "The Community of Common Destiny".

尽管前方有不计其数的艰难险阻，但是我对于“一带一路”战略计划走向最后成功满怀信心。因其是一项关于文明的计划而不仅仅是政府行动。我坚信，“一带一路”战略计划会像哥伦布 500 年前发现美洲大陆一样改变世界。而我之所以有这个信念。不仅因为它有包容性基础，即强调包容性发展而非霸权性发展，还因为它有不同民族文化要相互理解的文化根基。我们西方人在一定程度上忽视了精神发展的重要性并把它赤裸裸地置于唯物主义之下，而精神发展恰恰正是构建具有深度的社会共同体-人类命运共同体的重要途径。

Fifth, I had the honor to listen to the speech, to meet in person and be photographed with the Minister of Culture of China, Mr. Luo Shugang. In his speech, the Minister very well explained today's Chinese development model, China's view on the future of civilization, the role of the Communist Party of China, talked very openly about the development issues of China, as well as about the importance of cultural cooperation and the internationalization of students' education. I was impressed by the ease, clarity



and content of the Minister's thoughts and messages ... I am sorry that I cannot get this speech, even in Chinese, and we would translate it at the UDG ... Indeed, so deep and holistic thinking shatters many prejudices in understanding the Chinese development model ... Please give my thanks and respect to Minister for the speech.

这次，十分荣幸能亲自聆听中国文化部部长雒树刚先生的演讲并与其合影留念。在雒部长的演讲中，他不仅形象地解释了中国目前的发展模式，未来的文明视角以及中国共产党所扮演的角色，同时也开诚布公地指出了中国目前发展所遇到的问题，强调了文化合作和学生国际化教育的重要性。演讲全程我对雒部长优雅的谈吐，清晰的思维和带来的充实内容印象深刻，很遗憾我不能直接听懂中文的演讲，但是我们会将此次演讲内容进行翻译并在下格里查大学（UDG）进行宣传。如此深刻和全面的见解打破了人们对中国发展模式的偏见，请代我向雒部长致以感谢和崇高的敬意。

Sixth, I was in Guangzhou for the first time! Great place, great people, a lot of history ... I promised my wife to visit Hangzhou privately ... And my visit to Alibaba - it was a special experience.

感谢此次研讨会提供的机会-让我第一次来到了广州。这真是一个人杰地灵，有着历史文化背景的好地方，我还答应了我的妻子下次会带她来广州旅行。而这次到访阿里巴巴公司算得上是一次十分重要而特别的经历了。

Seventh, as you have characterized me, I am a practical philosopher. This means that, in addition to study China and its history and philosophy for the time of the visit, I also established the bases for future cooperation between the UDG and Montenegro with partners from China ... I talked about the possibility of cooperation between the UDG and a business group "Alibaba" and about staying of UDG professors and students in "Alibaba" as well as the possibility that their experts come and give lectures at the UDG. I wish that young, talented IT specialists from the UDG get internship in "Alibaba" and perhaps become their partners in Europe ... I am optimistic that also this could happen ... I have a promise regarding the above from their Public Relations Manager and Education Manager in "Alibaba" ... This would be, for the UDG and myself, a historic success! Likewise, the hosts arranged the meeting with the President and the a number of Deans from Zhejiang Gongshang University. I think that I am on my way, especially with the College of Computer Science and Information Engineering, to soon sign an agreement whose elements we have been arguing ... I am impressed with the size and openness of this University. I also established communication with several Chinese professors about the possible arrival in Montenegro and lectures at the UDG, as well as with several professors from all over the world who attended the Symposium.

Eighth, just to inform you that we have already started the preparation of Chinese Studies Program at the UDG. My plan for this Program is to be accredited by the Ministry of Education of the Government of Montenegro by April 2019. As you know, we also now have lectures in the area of Chinese culture and Chinese economy. In September 2018, we are organizing a conference dedicated to "One Belt One Road" initiative - cooperation between Montenegro and China in the field of tourism.

Likewise, Chinese students from Sichuan, who were at the UDG camp for talents, as well as internship students in five Montenegrin companies are also satisfied and like Montenegro ... and also they want to come back to Montenegro.

# The 6<sup>th</sup> China-CEECs Education Policy Dialogue

## 6th China-CEECs Education Policy Dialogue held in Shenzhen

The 6th China-Central and Eastern European Countries (CEECs) Education Policy Dialogue and its side event, the 5th Meeting of China-CEECs Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) Consortium, were held in Shenzhen in May.

Taking into account the globalization of higher education and the emergence of a new technological revolution, the Dialogue centered on four key issues: innovation and entrepreneurship, mutual recognition of higher education degree certificates and student exchanges, new areas for educational cooperation, and new initiatives for results-based cooperation. Representatives from different countries delivered speeches, conducted insightful discussions and reached a consensus on new pathways for educational development and cooperation possibilities. They also agreed that the 7th China-CEECs Education Policy Dialogue and the 6th China-CEECs HEIs Consortium Meeting would be held in a CEEC in 2019.

During the meeting, Vice Minister Tian Xuejun announced the MOE's launch of two projects: "China-CEECs Educational Capacity Building" and "China-CEECs Joint Training in Higher Education Institutions" in 2019. Under the first project, China will invite officials working in education and heads of universities and research institutions from the 16 CEECs to visit Chinese educational authorities and HEIs to exchange views with Chinese experts in relevant areas. The second project will set up a special fund to support academic exchanges, teacher and student exchanges and joint scientific research between China and CEECs.

In order to promote the exchanges and cooperation on tourism culture between China and central and eastern European countries, provide service to the development strategy of "The Belt and Road Initiative", boost the systematic, comprehensive as well as bilateral and multilateral long-term cooperation mechanism between tourism and education, and explore the new models, new means and new ways to the international cooperation in tourism and education, the "16+1 Tourism Colleges Union" between China and central and eastern European countries is to be established. Therefore, the *Declaration for the Establishment of "16+1 Tourism Colleges Union"* is jointly issued (hereinafter referred to as the "Declaration")

#### 一、指导原则

# Declaration for the Establishment of the Mechanism of the 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders' Roundtable Meeting

(Podgorica, Montenegro, September 15, 2017)

## General Principles

The mechanism of the 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders' Roundtable is an important part of the framework of the 16+1 Capital Mayors Forum, and is a non-profit mechanism chambers of commerce and trade and investment promotion organizations in China and 16 CEE countries can join voluntarily. The mechanism follows the general principles of negotiation, collaboration and sharing, and its mission is to implement the 16+1 cooperation mechanism and the Belt and Road Initiative, and boost mutually beneficial trade cooperation between Beijing of China and capitals of 16 CEE countries.

## Specific Provisions

1. The 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders' Roundtable and the 16+1 Capital Mayors Forum shall be held at the same time and place.
2. The 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders' Roundtable shall be planned, convened and organized by China Council for the



Promotion of International Trade Beijing Sub-council (CCPIT Beijing)/Beijing Chamber of International Commerce (BCIC) together with the chamber of commerce of the host Capital.

3. Pre-determined topics shall be covered at each edition of the 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders' Roundtable, where the participants will bring forward suggestions, reach consensus on cooperation, and exchange views on the problems in trade and investment promotion and the corresponding solutions.

4. Chiefs of the member organizations shall attend the Roundtable Meeting as scheduled and submit the registration forms as well as proposals.

5. All member organizations of the mechanism are obliged to implement the resolutions of the Roundtable Meeting, and therefore, shall strengthen communication and cooperation with each other, including but not limited to such aspects as matchmaking, member training, trade and investment promotion, conventions and exhibitions, and legal services.

6. As the mechanism's initiator, CCPIT Beijing/BCIC shall perform the functions of the Secretariat, and be responsible for coordinating the implementation of the resolutions adopted at the Roundtable Meeting, communicating with other member organizations, and taking charge of other daily work to ensure smooth operation of the mechanism. Other member organizations shall coordinate with the Secretariat and designate



**Mechanism of China-CEEC “16+1” Capital Chamber Leaders Roundtable**

The China-CEEC “16+1” Capital Chamber Leaders Roundtable is intended to cement the ties between chambers, offer a platform for cooperation, address problems and challenges, and promote the investment, trade, and cultural exchanges between China and CEE countries. The mechanism of the Roundtable is as follows:

1. The Roundtable is to be held at the same time and in the same venue as China-CEEC “16+1” Capital Mayors Forum is.
2. The Roundtable is to be jointly planned, convened and organized by CCPIT Beijing/Beijing Chamber of International Commerce (BCIC) and the counterpart organization in the host city.
3. A theme is to be defined for each Roundtable. Participants will have discussions about the theme and offer suggestions on cooperation between chambers. There will also be exchange of views on how to solve problems encountered in the efforts to promote investment and trade.
4. Roundtable participants should strengthen day-to-day collaborations and exchange of information, translate the Roundtable outcomes into action, and introduce cooperation on participant networking, education and training, investment and trade promotion, exhibitions, legal services, international activities, etc.
5. As the initiator of the conference, CCPIT Beijing/BCIC is responsible for managing the contact information about all chambers of commerce and maintaining day-to-day liaison with them.
6. Roundtable participants should sent delegates for the conference as scheduled.

In accordance with the Declaration on the establishment of 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders Mechanism signed in 2017, and in accordance with the objectives of the Roundtable Mechanism of the Chamber Leaders from China and CEEC (Initiative 16+1), Chambers' leaders have concluded during the Roundtable:

- They have showed their commitment in establishing the Mechanism for the networking of capital cities' Chambers of Commerce, through the organisation of regular, annual meetings, which should be held in same period each year; daily contacts and information exchange on business environment, business missions, exhibitions, economic forums; initiation of various projects aimed at the establishment of direct cooperation of member companies.
- In order to reduce the expenses, Chambers of Commerce of capital cities will develop support and innovation services, according to their capacities and resources, and offer them to the representatives of the business communities from 16+1 countries.
- In order to support the balancing of the trade exchange between China and CEEC, CCPIT Beijing is preparing, within the strategy „One Belt One Road“, the measures for the development of partner relations in the context of capital investments and incentives of economic cooperation, such as organisation of specialized exhibitions of imported products, investments and operations in free zones possibilities, joint activities on third markets.
- Cases of good practice show that the cooperation could be extended to the other areas such as tourism, education and the cooperation of young entrepreneurs.
- The participants have accepted to consider, by the end of the year, the draft Incentive of CCI Serbia-Belgrade Chamber of Commerce, for the Development of the digital platform of the Chambers of Commerce from China-CEEC capital cities, as an instrument for the support to the development of the trade and investments of the Chambers' members. The draft is enclosed.
- During the Roundtable, the Declaration on the establishment of 16+1 Capital Chamber Leaders Mechanism was signed by three new members: Latvia Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Budapest Chamber of Commerce and Montenegro Association of Economists and Managers. The Declaration is expected to be signed by the rest of the CEEC Chambers during the next edition of the Roundtable that will be held in Tirana in 2019.
